BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:

Tori A. Andreetta, as the landowner, is petitioning the members of Improvement District No. 2 (ID 2) to detach 3.00 acres described as a portion of APN: 006-086-022 (Parcel) from ID 2. The landowner's reasons to petition for detachment from ID 2 are as follows:

- 1. This Parcel has not received water or benefit from the ID 2 pipeline for 6 years. It has been receiving water from the OID River Road Lateral;
- 2. Despite not receiving water from the ID 2 pipeline for 6 years, all monthly ID 2 fees and assessments have been paid in full over this period and the parcel is in good standing with OID.

A Membership Notice dated May 16, 2018 included a copy of the voting ballot and notified the ID 2 members of the petition for detachment and the opportunity to provide their input at the July 3, 2018 Public Hearing. In addition, a Notice of Public Hearing was published in the Oakdale Leader May 23 and May 30, 2018. The notice of hearing and the posting, publication, and mailing of the notice was completed in accordance with the California Water Code Sections 23645 and 23646. See the attached documentation for clarification.

This Public Hearing is required under Oakdale Irrigation District Improvement District Policy (Resolution No. 90-26). Upon conclusion of the Public Hearing, a tally of the votes to determine approval or rejection of the detachment of 3.00 acres described as a portion of APN: 006-086-022 will be certified by the Board. If less than 1/3 of the members oppose the detachment, the process to effectively detach the said portion of the Parcel will proceed and the ID 2 boundary will be adjusted to no longer include APN: 006-086-022.

FISCAL IMPACT:

A \$500 deposit was submitted by the petitioner to initiate the process. Actual District

costs will be paid by the petitioner.







The purpose of this correspondence is to notify you of the Oakdale Irrigation District's (OID) conditional intent to issue a "Will Serve Letter" for the proposed residential domestic water system connection to OID's Rural Water System (RWS). This new connection would provide service to Parcel 1 of Parcel Map 057PM024 for 10330 Rio Sombra Court, hereafter referred to as Subject Water System. Please refer to the enclosed Parcel Map 057PM024 for clarification.

The conditions of the "Will Serve Letter" are as follows:

- 1) Developer must submit a hydraulic analysis performed by a registered engineer to OID, State of California Department of Health Services (DHR) and Stanislaus County Department of Environmental Resources (DER) on the subject water system for review and approval. The hydraulic analysis shall include such items as, but not limited to, proposed water line pipe sizes, flow and pressure calculations, and topography survey;
- 2) Developer to submit improvement plans for review and approval by OID, State of California DHS and/or Stanislaus County DER prior to construction of subject water system;
- Developer must obtain an OID Developer Agreement and all necessary construction permits, bonds, easements and rights-of-way, etc. required for the construction and future maintenance of the subject domestic water system;

- 4) Developer shall construct, complete and dedicate the Subject Water System in accordance with OID's, the Stanislaus County DER's and the State of California DHS' conditions, requirements, standards and specifications;
- 5) OID shall supply domestic water for one (1), 1"-inch metered domestic water service and fire flow capability for the Subject Water System. The Developer shall pay OID, upon dedication of the completed system, a buy in fee of \$15,391.00 per lot, for a total buy in fee of \$15,391.00. - 6) A Resolution of Acceptance is required by the Board of Directors for ownership, maintenance and operation of the Subject Water System to become part of OID's Rural Water System;
- 7) This "Will Serve Letter" will be valid for two (2) years from date of issuance. The Developer may petition the District's Board of Directors for an extension 30 days prior to the expiration date if the subject water system will not be completed as agreed in these conditions. Failure to complete the installation of the proposed improvement will result in OID rescinding this letter of intent.



ENCROACHMENT PERMIT ON THE HIRSCHFELD PIPELINE

THIS ENCROACHMENT PERMIT executed this THIRD day of JULY, 2018, by and between OAKDALE IRRIGATION DISTRICT, an irrigation district organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and RONALD W. BENEDIX AND JANET A. WILLETT, as Successor Trustees of the BENEDIX EXEMPTION TRUST dated October 19, 1990, and JANET A. WILLETT, an unmarried woman as her sole and separate property, as Tenants in Common, hereinafter referred to as "OWNER" sets forth Permits as follows:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the DISTRICT adopted the request for an Encroachment Permit on July 3, 2018, as shown in the Resolution attached hereto as **Exhibit** "A."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT occupies easements and fee-owned lands for its irrigation and drainage facilities, and

WHEREAS, OWNER'S property described in the attached **Exhibit "B"** (the "Subject Property") is subject to all or a portion of said easements, and

WHEREAS, OWNER has title to the Subject Property and wishes to encroach upon the HIRSCHFELD PIPELINE right-of-way with encroachments as follows:

1. One (1) 4" sch. 40 PVC private filter station backflush pipeline discharge into the Hirschfeld Pipeline.

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is willing to permit said encroachments provided the OWNER agrees to the following provisions:

- 1. <u>Nature of Right Conferred.</u> This Permit is valid only for the purposes specified herein, and neither the Permit, nor use there under shall create an easement, right-of-way, or other interest in real property owned by DISTRICT.
 - DISTRICT intends hereby to assent only to (a) an encroachment upon an easement or easements held by DISTRICT or (b) to confer a license to OWNER to encroach upon DISTRICT fee-owned lands, all subject to the terms hereof. Nothing in this Permit constitutes a grant or other disposition of any land or interest in land, which is owned or otherwise occupied by DISTRICT. OWNER acknowledges that the lands upon which the facilities of DISTRICT are located may not be owned by DISTRICT, and further acknowledges that the consent contained in this Permit relates only to the rights of DISTRICT by virtue of an easement or easements upon Subject Property or upon land owned in fee by DISTRICT. It is understood that nothing in this Permit shall be considered as a representation by DISTRICT of the authority to grant any interest in land over, across, or under any property owned or controlled by any person other than DISTRICT and OWNER shall obtain any further grants or consents from all others owning interests in the underlying easement land.
- 2. Assignments, Sublicenses and Termination. The right to use or maintain the encroachments listed above on the subject DISTRICT facility as authorized herein shall be transferrable to OWNER'S successors or assigns, however, OWNER may not, without the prior written consent of DISTRICT, authorize or permit others to utilize any facilities, structures, easements or right-of-way area which are in any way not expressly authorized by this Permit. Should OWNER wish to terminate this permit, written notice shall first be provided to DISTRICT. Upon approval, DISTRICT may request with 30 days written notice, the removal or relocation of all or portions of OWNER'S encroachments and OWNER shall perform the required work at no cost to DISTRICT. Should OWNER'S encroachments not be removed within the specified time, DISTRICT shall remove the encroachments and bill OWNER for all costs incurred.
- 3. Operational Access. DISTRICT shall have the right of necessary ingress to and egress from said strip of land at any and all times for people with tools and/or equipment required for the repair, replacement, maintenance and/or operation of that irrigation canal or pipeline system and appurtenant facilities located within DISTRICT right-of-way. OWNER's encroachment shall not interfere with DISTRICT's operational use of its irrigation and drainage facilities.
- 4. Indemnity and Release. OWNER shall (i) indemnify and hold harmless and (ii) release DISTRICT, its officers, agents and employees, against and from any and all loss, damage, claims, costs and expenses of whatsoever nature, including court costs and attorney's fees resulting from the exercise of this permit including but not limited to, overflow of water from DISTRICT facilities, property damage, personal injury or, wrongful death from the installation, construction, maintenance, repair, renewal, modification, reconstruction, relocation or removal of the permitted OWNER facilities or any part thereof. OWNER shall promptly repair, at his own cost and under DISTRICT

supervision, any damage caused to DISTRICT'S facilities due to work under this permit, to the satisfaction of DISTRICT. Should OWNER neglect to promptly make repairs, DISTRICT may make repairs or have repairs made and OWNER shall pay all costs.

5. Plans and Specifications: Construction. All encroachments and structures constructed under this Permit shall be erected by DISTRICT. Should DISTRICT allow OWNER to construct the encroachments and structures, the work shall be done in accordance with plans and specifications and upon locations approved in advance by DISTRICT as herein provided and shall be erected in such a manner as not to obstruct in any manner the flow of water in the canals. laterals or drain ditches of DISTRICT or to make more expensive or to interfere in any manner whatsoever with the construction, operation and maintenance of any part of the impacted irrigation and/or drainage works by DISTRICT. Any alterations or changes to the approved plans shall be approved by DISTRICT. Exhibits "C" and "D" (IF ATTACHED) indicate approved locations and/or plans of herein described encroachments. Exhibit "E" (IF ATTACHED) provides the Insurance and Bonding requirements of DISTRICT, which shall be met by OWNER prior to the start of construction.

Should DISTRICT allow OWNER to construct the encroachments and structures, OWNER shall call DISTRICT'S Engineer at 847-0341 a minimum 48 hours prior to planned construction and shall coordinate all construction activities with DISTRICT'S Water Operations Department. Further, routine inspections by DISTRICT of construction activities such as trenching, backfilling, compaction, concreting, etc., are required. OWNER and/or his contractors shall comply with all applicable laws, regulations and guidelines including OSHA, CAL-OSHA, State of California Department of Industrial Safety and Health Orders, Cal-Trans, and California Health and Welfare.

6. Ordinary Maintenance, Repair or Replacement. OWNER shall maintain and repair said encroachments at his sole cost and expense. Should OWNER neglect to promptly make repairs which impair the integrity and/or serviceability of DISTRICT facilities, DISTRICT may make repairs or have repairs made and OWNER shall pay all costs and expenses. Where necessary, and to the extent required to perform ordinary operation, maintenance, and reconstruction functions, DISTRICT may request, upon 30 days notice, the removal or relocation of portions of OWNER'S encroachments and OWNER shall perform the required work at no cost to DISTRICT.

For emergency purposes OWNER will be required to remove encroachments immediately upon request by DISTRICT. If it should be necessary to repair or replace DISTRICT facilities, DISTRICT is not liable for damages or resultant damages to the permitted encroachments within the DISTRICT'S easement. Further, the repair and replacement of OWNER encroachments following DISTRICT maintenance and reconstruction efforts shall be performed by OWNER and at the expense of OWNER.

THIS PERMIT shall be a covenant binding upon both DISTRICT and OWNER.



AGRICULTURAL DISCHARGE PERMIT ON THE HIRSCHFELD PIPELINE

THIS AGRICULTURAL DISCHARGE PERMIT executed this THIRD day of JULY, 2018 by and between OAKDALE IRRIGATION DISTRICT, an irrigation district organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and RONALD W. BENEDIX AND JANET A. WILLET, as Successor Trustees of the BENEDIX EXEMPTION TRUST dated October 19, 1990, and JANET A. WILLET, an unmarried woman as her sole and separate property, as Tenants in Common, hereinafter referred to as "OWNER" sets forth permits as follows:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the DISTRICT adopted the request for an Agricultural Discharge Permit on July 3, 2018, as shown in the Resolution attached hereto as **Exhibit "A."**

WHEREAS, DISTRICT occupies easements, rights of way and fee-owned lands for its irrigation and drainage facilities, hereinafter referred to as "CONDUITS".

WHEREAS, OWNER'S property described in the attached **Exhibit "B"** (the "Subject Property") is subject to all or a portion of said easements, rights of way and fee-owned lands, and

WHEREAS, OWNER has title to the Subject Property and requests that DISTRICT grant permission to release said Agricultural Discharge as needed, subject to the terms and conditions of this AGRICULTURAL DISCHARGE PERMIT, from one (1) 4" sch. 40 PVC private agricultural filter station backflush pipeline.

WHEREAS, OWNER has been granted an Encroachment Permit for their private Agricultural Discharge Facilities crossing DISTRICT'S easements, rights of way and feeowned lands and said Encroachment Permit has been recorded.

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is willing to permit said Agricultural Discharge provided the OWNER agrees to the following provisions:

I. Definitions

- A. "CONDUITS" shall mean the water collection system consisting of canals, laterals, ditches, flumes, pipelines and appurtenant facilities for the transportation, control and collection of irrigation water that DISTRICT owns, maintains and operates.
- B. "Discharge" shall be defined as agricultural and storm drainage from OWNER'S property.
- C. "Emergency Circumstances" shall mean a situation when it is necessary to act to prevent imminent and substantial harm to persons or damage to property.
- D. "Hazardous Materials" shall mean any flammable, explosive or radioactive material; any toxic substance, hazardous waste or substance, as those terms may now, or may in the future, be defined by any applicable federal, state or local agency.

II. Flow

Subject to full compliance with the following conditions and limitations, OWNER may pump and/or allow the Discharge to flow into the HIRSCHFELD PIPELINE at a point located in the northwestern quarter of Section 21, Township 1 South, Range 9 East, M.D.B.&M.

- 1. Except as provided in this Permit, OWNER may not release Discharge into any CONDUITS other than the above described District facility.
- 2. OWNER shall reduce or cease said rate of flow upon request of DISTRICT at any time that DISTRICT encounters Emergency Circumstances and perceives a risk that said flow may exceed the capacity of said District Facility.
- 3. The right of DISTRICT to control OWNER Discharge in Emergency Circumstances does not impose a duty of DISTRICT to regulate such flow.
- 4. Construction, installation, reconstruction, modification, and repair of the Discharge lines and appurtenances shall be performed under the

supervision of DISTRICT and in accordance with applicable DISTRICT Standards and Specifications, at OWNER's sole expense.

III. Water Quality

- OWNER shall not release any Discharge into any CONDUITS that would cause DISTRICT to fail to meet water quality standards that are now or may be imposed upon DISTRICT'S CONDUITS by any federal, state, regional, or local regulatory agency; or would cause DISTRICT to fail to meet water quality standards hereafter established by DISTRICT'S Board of Directors and applied on a DISTRICT-wide level, and adopted by DISTRICT Resolution after a public notice and meeting.
- 2. If the Discharge released by OWNER into the CONDUITS causes or threatens to cause significant degradation of the quality of water in the CONDUITS or downstream, the DISTRICT may require that OWNER immediately suspend making any such discharge, and such discharge shall be resumed only after such condition has been resolved to the satisfaction of DISTRICT or interested regulatory agency. Should any court or regulatory agency order, by way of a final nonappealable order, that the release of OWNER Discharge be restricted or be treated before being released into the CONDUITS, DISTRICT shall have the right to unilaterally amend this Permit to require OWNER to conform to such order at OWNER's sole expense.
- OWNER shall not discharge any Hazardous Material into the CONDUITS. OWNER shall immediately notify DISTRICT and immediately remediate any release or spill of a Hazardous Material into the CONDUITS at OWNER's sole expense, to the satisfaction of DISTRICT and any interested regulatory agency.
- 4. OWNER shall be responsible for the quality of the Discharge released into the CONDUITS and shall insure that all Discharge so released complies with all applicable federal, state, regional, and local laws, rules and regulations. Any damage to persons, the environment, surface water, or groundwater that results solely from the discharge by OWNER that does not comply with the requirements of this Permit shall be solely the responsibility of OWNER.
- 5. OWNER warrants that said chemical injection shall occur downstream of filtration device and that appropriate backflow prevention has been installed as shown in **Exhibits "C" and "D"** (IF ATTACHED).
- 6. Execution of this DISCHARGE PERMIT shall not release OWNER from being in full compliance with all applicable laws, regulations and guidelines

including OSHA, CAL-OSHA, State of California Department of Industrial Safety and Health Orders, Cal-Trans, and California Health and Welfare Codes.

7. OWNER shall be a member in good standing of an applicable Water Quality Coalition in accordance with requirements set forth in the Long Term Irrigated Lands Regulatory Program and shall submit to DISTRICT written verification demonstrating such upon request.

IV. Monitoring

- 1. OWNER shall furnish DISTRICT, without cost, copies of any and all analyses or recorded water quality testing of the Discharge to be discharged pursuant to this Permit upon request.
- 2. DISTRICT shall have the right, but not the obligation, after reasonable prior notice to OWNER, to enter upon the property of OWNER for the purpose of obtaining samples of the Discharge being released to the CONDUITS.

V. Warranties

- 1. DISTRICT does not warrant that DISTRICT owns all the lands upon which the CONDUITS are located in fee title. DISTRICT does not warrant that DISTRICT has the authority to grant access to OWNER across any property not owned in fee title by DISTRICT. DISTRICT shall promptly notify OWNER of any issues regarding property use or access relating to this Permit.
- 2. DISTRICT does not warrant that the alignment and condition of any CONDUITS will not change. DISTRICT, in its sole discretion, may decide to move, pipe, underground, realign or reconstruct any CONDUITS. OWNER shall bear all direct and indirect costs or expenses of relocating OWNER'S outfall and outlet works in such event.

VI. Maintenance and Operations

- DISTRICT may require that OWNER cease any and all discharge into said facility when DISTRICT deems it necessary to perform ordinary maintenance and reconstruction work until such time as DISTRICT informs OWNER that such work is completed.
- 2. Except in Emergency Circumstances, DISTRICT shall provide OWNER advance notice of any ordinary maintenance and reconstruction work that will require OWNER to cease any and all discharge into said facility.

3. The maintenance, operation and repair of any facility constructed or owned by OWNER for the purpose of releasing Discharge into the CONDUITS pursuant to this Permit shall be the responsibility of OWNER. OWNER shall provide DISTRICT five (5) days advance notice of any construction or maintenance of such facilities. DISTRICT may require OWNER to repair or replace such facilities if they constitute an unreasonable danger to any person or property or unreasonably interfere with DISTRICT use of the CONDUITS. Failure to maintain such facilities in a safe and useable condition shall be grounds for immediate termination of this Permit and removal of such facilities at OWNER's sole expense. DISTRICT shall in no way be obligated to move, repair, and/or replace such works of OWNER in the event of a realignment, reconstruction, or piping of the CONDUITS.

VII. Use of CONDUITS

- OWNER'S rights granted by this Permit are subject and subordinate to all uses and purposes DISTRICT may make of the CONDUITS or of any other facilities or property of DISTRICT. Any use made by OWNER of the CONDUITS pursuant to this Permit shall not limit, impair, hinder, or obstruct any authorized use by DISTRICT of said CONDUITS. OWNER use of the CONDUITS is subject to all leases, easements, licenses, restrictions and conditions, covenants, encumbrances, liens, and claims of title that may affect the CONDUITS.
- 2. DISTRICT, in Emergency Circumstances, may require OWNER to reduce or terminate said Discharge to a rate established by DISTRICT, if the release of Discharge by OWNER pursuant to this Permit is determined by DISTRICT to substantially interfere with DISTRICT use of the CONDUITS.
- 3. This Permit only creates the ability of OWNER to use the CONDUITS for a limited purpose and under limited conditions. It does not create any equitable interest in the CONDUITS, or an easement, nor does it convey to OWNER any right, title or interest in or to any property or facility of DISTRICT. OWNER shall make no other use of the CONDUITS other than as expressly provided in this Permit.
- 4. Except as already exists, or as herein expressly permitted, OWNER shall not place or permit to be placed on, in, across or through the CONDUITS easements or rights of way, any object or structures, nor do or permit to be done anything which may interfere with the full and exclusive enjoyment by DISTRICT of its CONDUITS, easements and rights of way.
- 5. Upon termination of this Permit, for any cause, DISTRICT may prevent further Discharge from flowing into the CONDUITS either by requiring that OWNER close any positive points of shutoff of OWNER'S or by requiring

OWNER to physically remove or seal off OWNER facilities where they enter the CONDUITS and/or the DISTRICT'S easements and rights of way. OWNER shall restore the property of DISTRICT to a condition reasonably acceptable to DISTRICT upon removal of OWNER facilities.

VIII. Defense, Indemnification, Liability and Damages

- OWNER shall defend and indemnify DISTRICT, its Directors, officers, employees and agents, for all costs, damages, penalties and fees of any kind from claims, complaints or causes of action for illness, death, personal injury, property or environmental claims, including attorneys fees incurred in a judicial or administrative proceeding, where such claim, complaint or cause of action arises solely out of the release of OWNER Discharge into the CONDUITS by OWNER. This obligation shall survive the termination of this Permit.
- 2. Should the DISTRICT'S CONDUITS or the natural drainage streams, channels or rivers, or the drains and channels of others, into which the CONDUITS flows, be, for any reason beyond their reasonable control, incapable of handling the agricultural discharge flows produced and generated by OWNER through no fault of DISTRICT, then DISTRICT shall incur no liability to OWNER.
- 3. Should the DISTRICT require cessation of OWNER Discharge due to Emergency Circumstances beyond the control of DISTRICT, then DISTRICT shall incur no liability to OWNER.
- 4. Should it become necessary to reduce or terminate OWNER's discharge into the CONDUITS due to any regulatory, administrative or court action, then DISTRICT shall incur no liability to OWNER.

IX. <u>Termination</u>

1. Subject to DISTRICT'S right to suspend release of agricultural discharge under Paragraph 4 of Article III, above, if after thirty (30) days written notice by DISTRICT to OWNER of a release of Discharge into the CONDUITS which is contrary to the terms and conditions identified or referred to in Section III, and if such condition which caused such release has not been substantially corrected by OWNER, then DISTRICT, after a public hearing noticed by agenda with specific prior notice being given to OWNER, shall be free to terminate this Permit. Should DISTRICT terminate this Permit pursuant to this paragraph, OWNER shall continue to defend and indemnify DISTRICT in accordance with Section VIII herein with regard to liability or causes of action resulting from the performance of this Permit.

- 2. For any other breach of this Permit not covered in Sections II and III, DISTRICT and OWNER shall give thirty (30) days written notice to the other of any breach and provide the other with the ability to cure the breach. If such breach is not cured within such thirty (30) day period, the non-breaching party may terminate this Permit.
- 3. Upon termination of this Permit by either party, OWNER shall be responsible for removing all of its facilities that are within the property, easements or rights of way of DISTRICT and used to release Discharge into the CONDUITS. If OWNER does not remove these facilities promptly, then DISTRICT shall remove the facilities and OWNER shall reimburse DISTRICT for all costs incurred.

X. Assignment

1. The right to discharge as authorized herein shall be transferrable to OWNER'S successors or assigns, however, OWNER may not, without the prior written consent of DISTRICT, authorize or permit others to utilize any facilities, structures, easements or right-of-way areas which are in any way not expressly authorized by this Permit. Should OWNER wish to terminate this permit, written notice shall first be provided to DISTRICT. Upon approval, DISTRICT may request with 30 days written notice, the removal or relocation of all or portions of OWNER'S discharge encroachments and OWNER shall perform the required work at no cost to DISTRICT. Should OWNER'S discharge encroachments not be removed within the specified time, DISTRICT shall remove said encroachments and bill OWNER for all costs incurred.

XI. <u>Miscellaneous Provisions</u>

- 1. This Permit fully incorporates the permits and understandings of OWNER with DISTRICT with respect to the subject matter hereof and all prior negotiations, drafts, permits (including the Interim Permit) and other communications between OWNER and DISTRICT are superseded by this Permit. The parties have read and fully understand the terms of this Permit and have had the opportunity to be advised by an attorney with respect to this Permit. No alteration or amendment to this Permit shall be effective unless given in writing and signed by the parties sought to be charged or bound by the alteration or amendment.
- 2. This Permit has been negotiated and executed in the State of California. If there is a lawsuit, OWNER agrees to submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of the County in which this Permit is recorded. This Permit shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

- 3. The words "OWNER" and "DISTRICT" include the successors, assigns, and transferees of each of them. Caption headings in this Permit are for convenience purposes only and are not to be used to interpret or define the provisions of this Permit. This Permit is the product of negotiation of the parties and the rule of Civil Code, Section 1654 regarding uncertainties caused by a party shall not apply. If a court of competent jurisdiction finds any provision of this Permit to be invalid or unenforceable as to any person or circumstance, such finding shall not render that provision invalid or unenforceable as to any other persons or circumstances and all provisions of the Permit in all other respects shall remain valid and enforceable. It is not necessary for either party to inquire into the powers of the other or of the officers, directors, partners, or agents acting or purporting to act on its behalf.
- 4. The parties shall not be deemed to have waived any rights under this Permit unless such waiver is given in writing and signed by the party being charged with waiver. No delay or omission on the part of the parties in exercising any rights shall operate as a waiver of such right or any other right. A waiver by a party of a provision of the Permit shall not prejudice or constitute a waiver of the party's right otherwise to demand strict compliance with that provision or any other provision of this Permit. No prior waiver by party, nor any course of dealing between the parties, shall constitute a waiver of any of a party's rights or of any of a party's obligations as to any future transactions. Whenever the consent of a party is required under this Permit, the granting of such consent by that party in any instance shall not constitute continuing consent.

THIS PERMIT shall be a covenant binding upon both DISTRICT and OWNER.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: OID Policy is to have all private facilities located outside OID rights-of-way/easements. However, due to the reasons stated below, the Board may consider granting a waiver in this instance, which is Staff's recommendation.


BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:

The parcel noted above is currently utilizing a turnout that, when checked up to a level that provides adequate pressure, frequently floods the adjacent parcel (APN: 014-005-008). The historic point of delivery for the parcel noted above was from a turnout located upstream within the adjacent parcel, APN: 014-005-008, via an existing private pipeline lying within and running parallel to OID's sixty (60) foot Brichetto Lateral right of way. The attached as-built construction plan from OID's PL984 project shows the turnout at the historic point of delivery tying into the existing pipeline in question, pre-dating the existing facilities. This existing pipeline is no longer in use as it has degraded to the point of disrepair. The landowners of the parcel noted above (Owners) would like to once again utilize this historical point of delivery and have requested the Board of Director's (Board) consideration for approval of the replacement of the existing pipeline in its current alignment.


The landowners of the adjacent parcel, APN: 014-005-008, have agreed to allow the pipeline to be replaced within their property and are receptive to executing an Encroachment Permit with OID as their parcel would no longer flood each time their neighbor irrigated. Should the Board approve the request, the Owners have proposed to remove and replace the existing concrete pipeline with a new PVC pipeline in its current alignment. In accordance with OID's Rules and Regulations, all pipelines and other permanent facilities are required to remain outside the OID right of way with the only exception being perpendicular crossings with an approved encroachment permit. Pipelines installed within and parallel to the ditch bank impede OID's ability to split the bank to address seepage issues.


Seepage issues have yet to occur in this section of open ditch and are less likely to occur in this situation than most areas in the District given the adjacent field grade is only slightly below the top of ditch bank and the operating water level in that section of open ditch is low. The existing pipeline alignment has historically been utilized as the conveyance mechanism for the parcel noted above so there may be some prescriptive rights that have been established between landowners within OID's Brichetto Lateral right of way. All things considered the Board may, at their discretion, choose to make an exception in this case to approve the private pipeline encroachment.



This property has already undergone extensive development for the purpose of the school farm. To date, Phase I of the school farm has been completed, which included: easement acquisition, entry road construction, PG&E electrical service, boundary fencing, 13 acre production almond orchard with a complete irrigation system, construction of a 10,000 square foot show barn, domestic well installation, permanent bathroom facility, laser leveling of the entire property, manicured grounds area, and construction pad development for additional livestock barns. While the OJUSD purchased the land and allotted funds for the development of the farm, we would be remiss in not acknowledging that the bulk of the developmental costs for the farm and associated programs have come from our generous community, including the Oakdale Irrigation District.

The time has come for the OJUSD to begin Phase II of the School Farm which will include the construction of separate pig and livestock barns and a water delivery system for designated crop areas. The crop areas will consist of grape vines, varietal trees, assorted row produce, and pasture grass. For educational purposes, each crop area or zone will utilize a different water delivery system to educate students on the various modern irrigation practices. This experience will prove vital in demonstrating the most productive and efficient ways to utilize our water resources. In the design of the water system we will also integrate the use of current agriculture technology, such as moisture content meters, in an effort to make this system as relevant as possible. It is the strong desire of the OJUSD to maximize the potential of this facility by making it state of the art. The construction of this water delivery system will help ensure that we maximize our students' exposure to a wide variety of hands —on learning activities that will result in skills valued by industry and create more informed water consumers.

The specific request of the OJUSD to OID is to consider approving a grant request in the amount of \$200,000.00 for the design, purchase, and installation of a water delivery system at the OJUSD School Farm.

The components of the Water Delivery System will include but are not limited to:

Oakdale Joint Unified School District

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- 1. Drilling of a County approved agriculture well
- 2. Ag well pump and seal
- 3. Electrical infrastructure
- 4. Irrigation pipe infrastructure including OID service
- 5. Design, purchase, and installation of various sprinkler and drip water delivery systems for the designated crop areas
- 6. Design, purchase, and installation of a flood system for the pasture
- 7. Design, purchase, and installation of technology based irrigation system to include computer monitoring

This requested amount has been developed after detailed conversations with Canepa and Sons Well Drilling and Waterford Irrigation Supply Company. It should be noted that both of these companies were utilized in the completion of Phase I of the farm.

The OJUSD has proven its commitment to making our students College and Career Ready! We want to provide our students the ability to learn skills that will IMMEDIATELY relate to industry and the current technical job market, while also addressing their potential UC/CSU requirements. One area that I have not mentioned is the impact that this project will have on students that do not have the opportunity or finances to normally be exposed to Agriculture Education. The development of the farm and associated programs will allow a student that lives in town, or comes from a low socio-economic background, the opportunity to develop skills they would not otherwise be taught. A student that lives in town can now work directly with plants and animals and experience activities that previously may have never been afforded them. In pursuing this education effort, even if a student does not follow a career in agriculture, we have gone a long way in building a more educated water consumer. EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT July 3, 2018

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this 3rd day of July, 2018, by and between the BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE OAKDALE IRRIGATION DISTRICT, a California public agency, hereinafter referred to as "District", and STEVE KNELL, hereinafter referred to as "Employee".

Recitals

WHEREAS, The Board of Directors, as appointing power, and STEVE KNELL desire to agree in writing to the terms and conditions of STEVE KNELL's continued employment as General Manager.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. DUTIES

- (a) District agrees to renew its employment contract with STEVE KNELL as General Manager of the Oakdale Irrigation District effective July 3, 2018, to perform the functions and duties specific in Exhibit "A" hereto, and to perform other legally permissible and proper duties and functions as the Board of Directors may from time to time assign.
- (b) Employee shall perform his duties to the best of his abilities in accordance with the highest professional and ethical standards of the profession and shall comply with all applicable rules and regulations established by the District. Employee's performance shall at all times be subject to review by the Board of Directors.
- (c) Employee shall not engage in any activity, which is or may become a conflict of interest, prohibited contract, or which may create an incompatibility of office as defined under California law. Prior to performing any services under this Agreement and annually thereafter; Employee must complete all disclosure forms required by law.

2. TERMS

- (a) Except as otherwise provided in Section 4(a) below, the District agrees to continue to employ the Employee and the Employee agrees to continue to be employed and remain in the exclusive employment of the District from July 3, 2018 through July 9, 2021 (the "Term"), and, thereafter, for such additional employment terms as may be agreed to as provided for under the renewal provisions of this Agreement set forth in Section 3.
- (b) Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent, limit, or otherwise interfere with the rights of the Employee to occasionally teach, write or engage in similar activities which do not

interfere with, but rather enhance, the Employee's performance of the duties required under this Agreement.

- (c) Nothing in the Agreement shall prevent, limit, or otherwise interfere with the rights of the Board to terminate the services of the Employee at any time during such employment Term or any renewal thereof subject to the provisions set forth in Section 3 hereof.
- (d) Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent, limit, or otherwise interfere with the right of the Employee to resign at any time from this provision with the District, subject to the provisions set forth in Section 4 herein.

3. AUTOMATIC RENEWAL

In the event written notice is not given by either party to this Agreement ninety (90) calendar days prior to the termination date as set forth in Section 4 herein, this Agreement shall be automatically renewed and extended upon the same terms and conditions as provided herein, or as may be amended from time to time, for additional, successive employment periods of one (1) year each. Said Agreement, and amendments thereto, shall continue thereafter for one (1) year successive periods unless either party hereto gives ninety days prior written notice to the other party that the party does not wish to renew or extend this Agreement and amendments thereto, for additional one (1) year period.

4. RESIGNATION / TERMINATION AND SEVERANCE

- (a) The District may terminate or remove the Employee's employment services under this Agreement prior to the normal expiration date of the employment Term, or any renewals thereof.
- (b) If the District terminates the Employee's employment for no reason, or for any lawful reason other than as provided for in Paragraph (c) of this Section, during the Term of this Agreement or any renewal thereof, the District shall pay the Employee a cash severance payment ("Severance") equal to the number of months (including partial months, which shall be prorated) remaining on the unexpired Term of the Agreement, multiplied by the monthly salary of Employee at the time of termination. In no event, however, shall the Severance exceed an amount equal to the then-monthly salary of the Employee multiplied by 6. Such Severance shall be in addition to any other accumulated vacation or other accrued benefits or leave to which he is entitled as of the date of such termination. Employee acknowledges and agrees that any Severance provided upon termination is in lieu of all damages, payments and liabilities on account of the early termination of this Agreement and is the sole and exclusive remedy for Employee, and shall only be paid upon Employee's execution and delivery to Employer of a complete release of all claims Employee may have against the Employer, and its past, present and future directors, agents, and employees, and their heirs and assigns (collectively with Employer, the "Released Parties").

- (c) If the Employee's employment services are terminated by the Board because of the Employee's illegal conduct related to his employment hereof, the District shall have no obligation to pay any Severance designated in Paragraph (b) of this Section. However, the Employee shall be entitled to earned salary and any in lieu payments for accumulated vacation or other accrued benefits or leave to which he is entitled as of the date of such termination.
- (d) A decision to terminate shall be made in accordance with laws including Brown Act provisions regarding personnel actions. In recognition of employee's professional status and integrity, Employee and the Board of Directors shall endeavor, in good faith, to prepare a joint public statement to be made by the Board of Directors at the first public disclosure of termination by the Board.
- (e) Employee may choose to resign his office instead of being terminated if an action by the Board of Directors to terminate has been made in closed session. In such event, the public announcement, as provided for in paragraph 4 (d) above, will note Employee has resigned, and paragraph 4 (d) remains applicable.
- (f) If the Employee dies while employed by the District under this Agreement or any renewals thereof, the Employee's beneficiaries, or those entitled to his estate, shall be entitled to his earned salary and any in lieu payments for accumulated vacation or other accrued benefits or leave, or proportions thereof, to which he would be entitled as of the date of his death.

5. COMPENSATION

- (a) The District shall compensate Employee for all services rendered or hours worked pursuant to this Agreement.
 - (b) The Employee's salary effective January 1, 2018 shall be \$240,980.
 - (c) The Employee's salary effective July 1, 2018 shall be \$253,029.
 - (d) The Employee's salary effective July 1, 2019 shall be \$265,680.
 - (e) The Employee's salary effective July 1, 2020 shall be \$278,964.
 - (f) The Employee's salary effective July 1, 2021 shall be \$278,964.
- (h) The Board may also consider such other merit increases or bonuses from time to time as the Board deems warranted by performance and achievement of results by the Employee.

6. AUTOMOBILE

Employee's duties require that he shall have the use of an automobile at all times during his employment with District. District shall provide an automobile for Employee's District use during the term of this agreement. District will provide for the maintenance and insurance of that vehicle during the term of this agreement. District will provide fuel for the automobile for the use of District business.

7. SUPPLEMENTAL BENEFITS

- a. The District shall provide Employee the same benefits as provided to the District Management Bargaining Group employees except as otherwise set forth in Exhibit "B".
 - b. In addition to those benefits listed in Exhibit "B", District agrees to the following:
 - 1. District will pay for renewal of Professional licenses during the term of this Agreement and any classes that may be required to keep those professional licenses current.
 - 2. District to pay membership dues to two (2) professional associations during the term of this Agreement. They shall include membership in the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) and the United States Committee on Irrigation and Drainage (USCID). All other professional memberships will be the responsibility of the employee.
 - 3. District to provide a cell phone to employee. Reasonable personal use will be acceptable.

8. PERFORMANCE EVALUATION

The Board of Directors shall evaluate Employee's performance at least annually. In addition, every year the Board of Directors and Employee will set goals and objectives for the ensuing year. Employee shall be responsible for scheduling the reviews contemplated by the paragraph.

Any evaluation or review of the Employee's performance shall be considered and discussed with the Employee in closed session of the Board pursuant to Government Code Section 54957. The Employee shall be provided a copy of any written statement or findings of the Board or any of its members and provided an adequate opportunity for the Employee to discuss and respond to the Board in closed session. Any written evaluation or statement concerning the Employee's performance shall be confidential and placed in the Employee's personnel file along with any written response by the Employee. In effecting the provisions of this Section, the Board and Employee mutually agree to abide by the provisions of applicable State Law concerning personnel matters, due process, and rights of the Employee and of the Employer.

The Board of Directors, by resolution, shall fix any other terms and conditions of employment, as it may determine from time to time, relating to the performance of Employee, provided such terms and conditions are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Agreement or law.

9. BONDING

The District shall bear the full cost of any fidelity or other bonds required of the Employee.

10. INDEMNIFICATION

The District shall defend, save harmless and indemnify the Employee against any tort, professional liability claim or demand or other legal action, whether groundless or otherwise, arising out of an alleged act or omission occurring in the performance of the District's duties or when representing the District. The District may compromise and settle any such claim or suit and shall pay the amount of any settlement or judgment rendered thereon or have its insurance overage do the same.

11. NOTICES

Any notices required by this Agreement shall be in writing and either given in person or by first class mail with the postage prepaid and addressed as follows:

12. ARBITRATION

Any controversy or claim arising out of or pertaining to this Agreement, or the breach thereof, shall be settled by arbitration in accordance with the rules of the American Arbitration Association, and judgment upon the award rendered by the arbitrator(s) may be enforced as provided by California law.

13. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement is the final expression of the complete agreement of the parties with respect to the matters specified herein and supersedes all prior oral or written understandings. Except as prescribed herein this Agreement cannot be modified except by written agreement signed by both parties.

14. ASSIGNMENT

This Agreement is not assignable by either District or Employee.

15. SEVERABILITY

If any provision, or any portion of any provision hereof is held to be unconstitutional, in valid, or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement, or portion thereof shall be deemed severable, shall not be affected, and shall remain in full force and effect.

16. COUNTERPARTS

This Agreement may be executed in two counterparts, which shall be identified by number, and each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

IN WITNESS HEREOF, the Board of Directors of the Oakdale Irrigation District has caused this Agreement to be signed and executed in its behalf by the President of the Board and the Employee has signed and executed this Agreement as of the day and year first above-written.

EXHIBIT "A" JOB DESCRIPTION

JOB DESCRIPTION FOR GENERAL MANAGER/SECRETARY

PRIMARY FUNCTION

Under general direction of the Board of Directors is responsible for the management and execution of District activities and programs; performs the function of chief executive officer in supervising day-to-day activities of the District with particular emphasis on providing oversight of irrigation and water utility operations, personnel matters, fiscal control and safeguarding the District assets; performs and directs other work as needed or assigned.

Managerial Dimension:

Oversee, advise, discipline, instruct, train, and provide leadership to Department Heads, attorneys, consultants and assigned administrative staff.

EXAMPLES OF ESSENTIAL DUTIES

Responsible for the planning, direction, coordination, organizing and controlling District activities.

Represents the District on committees and commissions and at meetings with various agencies.

Prepares recommendations for the Board of Directors and implements District policies and programs.

Evaluates the manpower and equipment requirements of each department and works with the department heads to improve operational efficiency and increases productivity.

Oversees interdepartmental coordination and scheduling of work.

Monitors proposed activities and authorizes purchases to assure that all expenditures are necessary, cost-effective, and consistent with District fiscal policy and the budget.

Approves and signs correspondence, documents, or reports.

Prepares annual budget to be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval.

Assist in the technical development and implementation of goals, objectives, policies, and priorities.

Plan, organize, supervise, and lead those involved in the scheduling and oversight of maintenance and engineering work in the design and construction of irrigation and domestic water facilities and structures.

Oversee and provide leadership in the preparation of hydraulic studies and structural design projects related to District physical facilities.

Oversee District collections and billing operations and those related to other accounting functions and elements of the District's operations

Oversee the preparation of estimates of project costs for competitive bidding, budgetary purposes, and field operation capital projects.

Lead the planning and coordination of ongoing maintenance and improvement programs.

Prepare comprehensive written reports and statistical support data relating to public works projects and programs.

Supervise, coordinate, and assist in the work of outside attorneys, accountants, and engineering consultants.

Work with the public to answer questions and provide technical information.

Respond to citizen complaints and questions.

Coordinate District activities with outside agencies.

Supervise, train, discipline, and evaluate Department Heads and assigned staff.

Advise the Board of Directors in the technical, specialized, and administrative areas of the District's operations and regarding it's needs for planning, direction, coordination, organization and control.

Investigates and prepares technical recommendations on District matters.

TYPICAL PHYSICAL AND MENTAL ACTIVITIES

Operates, in a sitting position, various office machines. Use of calculators, typewriters, and computers require sitting for prolonged periods of approximately 4 to 6 hours or more per day.

Use hands and fingers to grip and grasp and to manipulate books, instruments and equipment used in the performance of duties. These functions are intermittently performed for brief to moderate periods ranging from 5 to 10 minutes or more for daily totals between 4 to 6 hours total.

Communicates orally with staff and customers in face-to-face and one-to-one settings. Uses a radio and a phone for communication with staff on an as-needed basis. Requires continuous use of normal to corrected normal hearing and vision.

Work involves frequent and prolonged periods of typing and/or writing. Twisting of the wrists and elbows may be performed in conjunction with reaching, bending, lifting, grasping, and gripping. All such tasks are or may be repetitive in nature for periods of 30 to 40 minutes or more for 4 to 6 hours total.

Frequently uses knowledge and experience to make proper judgement decisions involving work processes and procedures.

Employee may stand intermittently for moderate duration ranging up to 20 to 40 minutes at each occurrence for approximately 2 to 4 hours per day. Standing will occur intermittently with walking, sitting, kneeling, squatting, and climbing.

Job requires intermittent walking for brief to moderate duration for a total of 1 to 2 hours daily. Distances walked will range from a few feet to as much as one-quarter mile at each occurrence. Walking surfaces will generally be concrete or a similar relatively smooth material however, when working under field conditions the walking surface may often be irregular, sloping, wet to dry, and smooth to broken.

In performance of job inspections and problem solving, the employee will find it necessary to kneel, squat, bend, carry, and climb. Each such demand is intermittent and totals 20 to 40 minutes per day. These functions will be performed on a variety of work surfaces including dirt, pavement, and metal and may occur on sloping and narrow surfaces requiring a great deal of balance.

Movements such a reaching, pushing/pulling, twisting, bending, stooping, lifting, carrying, gripping, and grasping are frequently performed and will each total approximately 2 to 4 hours per day. These movements will generally be performed in conjunction with one or more of the others.

Twisting of the wrist and elbows, the upper torso and knees and ankles will occur when the employee performs routine inspection tasks.

Some bending of the wrists may be repetitive in nature for brief to moderate periods of 10 to 15 minutes. Bending of the knees and ankles will total approximately 4 to 6 hours, with intermittent, brief to continuous movement, occurring throughout the work shift.

Stooping or bending at the waist may be performed while the employee is in a great many positions, including standing, kneeling, and squatting and the duration of such movement range from 5 to 15 minutes at each occurrence.

The employee may hand-carry items over a variety of surfaces ranging from smooth and level to sloping and broken, dry to wet in order to perform survey or inspection work. Distances traveled will not normally exceed 250 feet, however, on occasion the employee may walk up to as much as one-quarter of a mile.

The employee will perform intermittent finger manipulation and some fine finger dexterity movements when using the phone and radio and to complete written reports. Such movements will total about 2 to 3 hours per day.

Speak in English at a level sufficient to communicate effectively over the phone, in person, over the radio, and in large groups.

Principles of management, supervision, accounting, engineering, and organizational administration.

California Water, Labor, and Government Codes.

Contract administration, especially those relating to capital improvement projects.

Word processing and other computer uses.

Ability to:

Prepare, read, and interpret real property and contract documents.

Employ good judgement and make decisions in accordance with established systems and procedures.

Operate various office equipment, including electronic typewriters, calculators, PC computers, copiers, radios, phones, and fax machines.

Prepare and maintain clear, concise, and accurate manual and computer records.

Work well under the pressures of established time constraints.

Follow and understand written and oral instructions in English.

Make verbal presentations in English in one-on-one and large group settings.

Perform technical work of a complex nature with a minimum of guidance.

Establish and maintain cooperative relationships with those contacted in the course of work.

Equivalent to a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university with major work in engineering, construction, public administration, business administration, economics, personnel management, industrial relations, government or related field. Additional qualifying experience and/or education in other professional disciplines may be substituted for bachelor's degree.

Emphasis on water resources, construction, business, or public administration is preferred.

NECESSARY SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

Provide two acceptable forms of identification for proof of citizenship.

Possession of an appropriate California Driver's License, and a good motor vehicle driving record as evidenced by freedom from multiple or serious traffic violations or accidents for at least two (2) years duration. DISCUSSION

1. No accidents, injuries or near-misses to report.

- 2. Tunnel advancement from the upstream portal continued with the roadheader excavation machine. Failure of the main power generator on site prevented tunnel advance for most of the week. Tunnel advancement was approximately 7 feet this week.
- 3. Tunnel excavation (from the upstream and downstream sites combined) is approximately 71% (~4,243 feet) complete.
- 4. Schedule Update:
 - DTDS submitted an updated baseline schedule on May 30, which indicates that DTDS will
 have the tunnel and canal work items completed in early January 2019, approximately 3 weeks
 ahead of the substantial completion schedule included in the Contract (no change from prior
 report).
 - Anticipated project substantial completion date remains January 2019 to accommodate wintertime canal tie-in (no change from prior report).
