#### **BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:**

The Phase I Total Channel Control System Modernization Project (Project) will involve the removal and replacement of selected canal structures on existing water conveyance facilities, specifically OID's Burnett, Kearney, Hirschfeld, and Tulloch Laterals. The existing canal structures consist of centerline drop structures and landowner delivery structures, or turnouts. Automated canal gates, flow control, and measurement devices will be installed to replace existing center gates and some landowner turnouts as part of the Project. Total Channel Control (TCC) refers to an operational mode in which the gates along a given canal communicate to each other, so that fluctuations in flow can be compensated by the neighboring gates automatically. There will be no new water conveyance facilities constructed as part of the Project, and all work will take place within OID's existing canal footprint and rights of way.

### OAKDALE IRRIGATION DISTRICT RESOLUTION NO. 2017-67

## ORDERING THE COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT WATER CHARGES AND OTHER RELATED CHARGES (STANISLAUS COUNTY)

WHEREAS, the Oakdale Irrigation District (hereinafter "District") on November 1, 1909 was formed into an irrigation district pursuant to Irrigation District Law, Division 11 of the California Water Code (commencing with Section 20500).

**WHEREAS**, the District has by previous resolutions or other proceedings declared its intent to levy and collect charges for the purpose of meeting the expenses of the District under the provisions of the State of California Water Code ("Water Code"), Section 25800 et seq. and 26500, et seq.

WHEREAS, the charges against the real property are not levied with regard to property values but for the costs associated with the operation and maintenance of the District's irrigation facilities recovered through water delivery service charges and other related charges as provided for by Section 25806(2)(b) of the Water Code.

**WHEREAS**, the District has determined and certifies that the charges are either exempt from or in compliance with all the provisions of Proposition 218, which was passed by the voters in November 1996. The District has further determined that charges are in compliance with all laws pertaining to the levy of such charges.

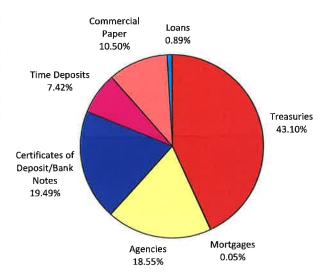

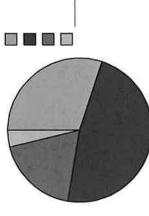

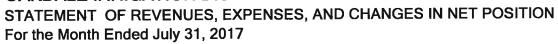

### **GENERAL SERVICES AGREEMENT**

THIS GENERAL SERVICES AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is effective as of <u>September 5</u>, <u>2017</u>, (the "Effective Date") by and between the Oakdale Irrigation District, an irrigation district organized pursuant to Division 11 of the California Water Code (the "District"), with offices at 1205 East F Street, Oakdale, California (95361) and <u>Sutter Care at Home</u> ("Contractor"), with offices at 8330 Ferguson Avenue, Sacramento, CA 95828.

In consideration of the promises herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Services: Contractor and the District agree that Contractor will furnish all work, labor, tools, equipment, materials, supervision, scheduling, coordination, and contract administration necessary to undertake and complete in a first-class, expeditious, and workmanlike manner the work specifically described in the Scope of Work attached as Exhibit "A" (the "Work") or Work Releases or Material Requisitions, signed by an authorized District Representative, issued for a specific defined Scope of Work.
  - A. Additional Services: No additional services beyond those required by the Scope of Work shall be performed by Contractor unless the District shall, in writing, specifically direct such services to be performed. Absent compliance with the foregoing, Contractor shall neither have nor make a claim for additional compensation by reason of the additional services.
  - B. **Approval by Engineer**: If required, prior to the commencement of Work or installation of materials, Contractor shall have all material submittals, data sheets and materials approved by the District Engineer. If the Work is to be inspected by the District, Contractor will coordinate such inspection of the Work with the District Engineer.
- Independent Contractor Relationship: Contractor's relationship with the District will 2. be that of an independent contractor, and nothing in this Agreement should be construed to create a partnership, joint venture, or employer-employee relationship. Contractor is not the agent of the District and is not authorized to make any representation, contract, or commitment on behalf of the District. Contractor will not be entitled to any of the benefits which the District may make available to its employees, such as group insurance, profit-sharing or retirement benefits. Contractor will be solely responsible for all tax returns and payments required to be filed with or made to any federal, state or local tax authority with respect to Contractor's performance of services and receipt of fees under this Agreement. The District will regularly report amounts paid to Contractor by filing Form 1099-MISC with the Internal Revenue Service as required by law. Because Contractor is an independent contractor, the District will not withhold or make payments for social security; make unemployment insurance or disability insurance contributions; or obtain worker's compensation insurance on Contactor's behalf. Contractor agrees to accept exclusive liability for complying with all applicable state and

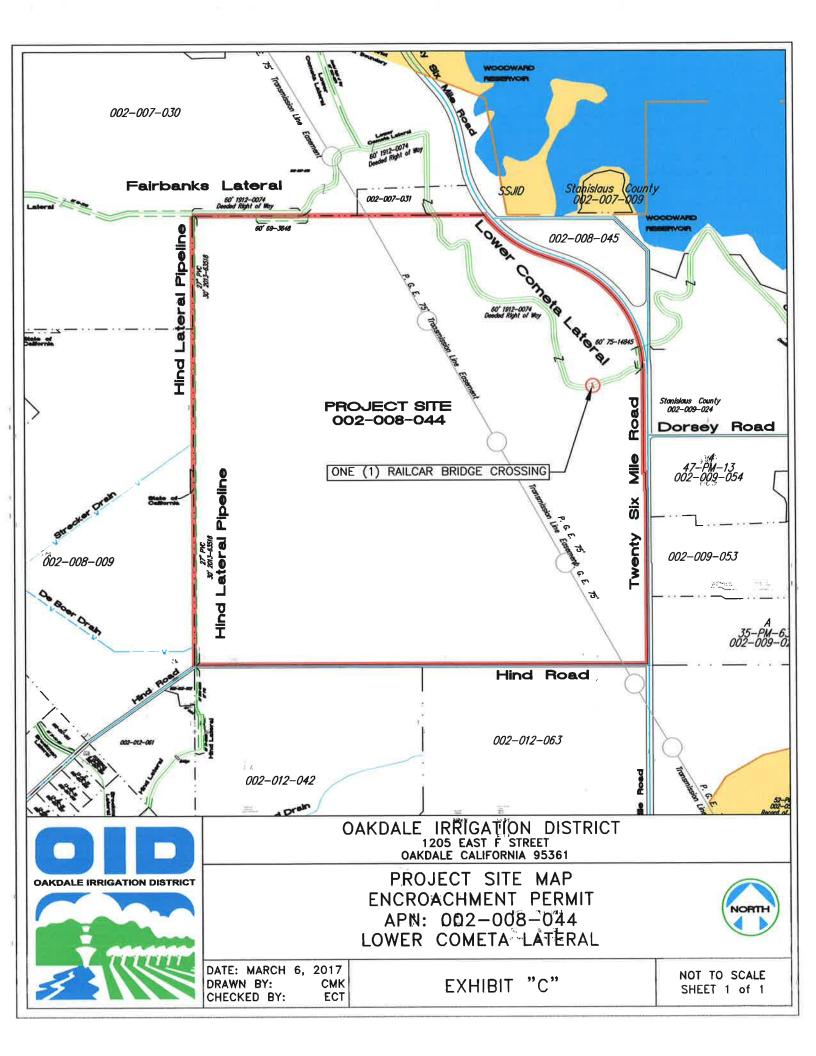

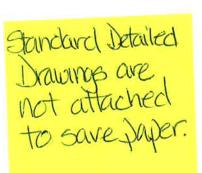

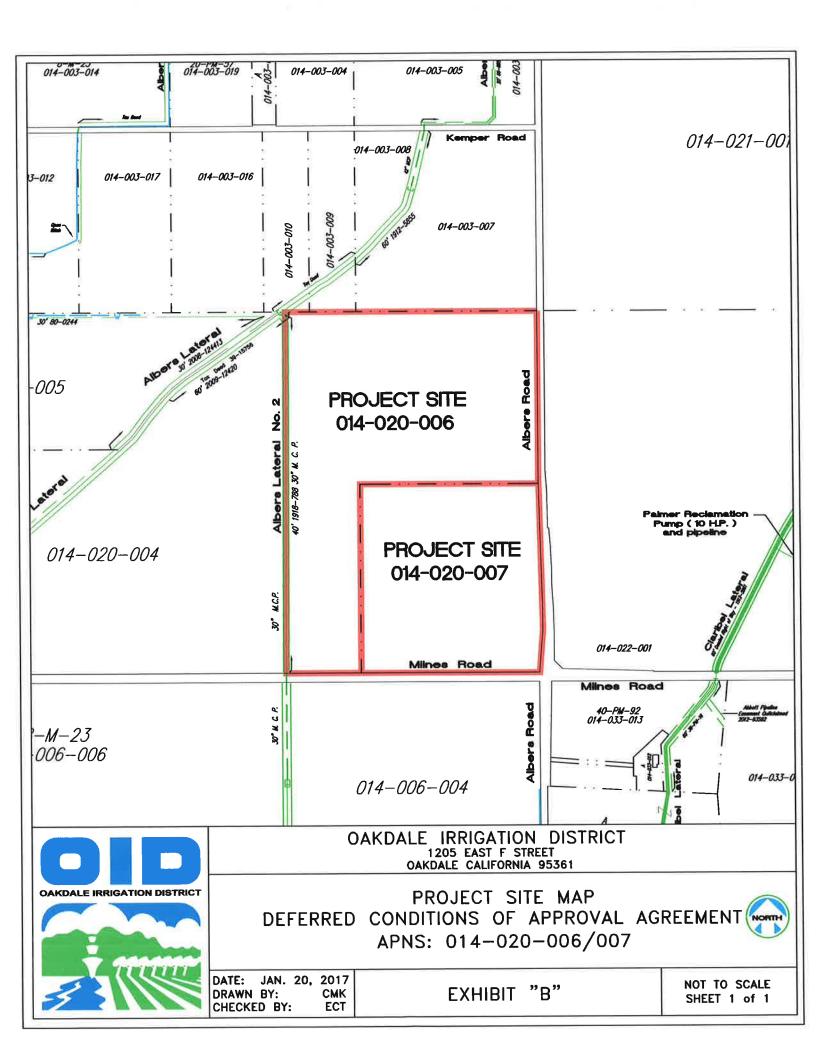

# NOTIFICATION AGREEMENT OF CROSSING OF THE HIRSCHFELD PIPELINE

THIS NOTIFICATION AGREEMENT ("Agreement") executed this FIFTH day of SEPTEMBER, 2017, by and between OAKDALE IRRIGATION DISTRICT, an irrigation district organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC (PG&E), hereinafter referred to as "OWNER" sets forth Permits as follows:

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the DISTRICT adopted the request for a Notification Agreement on September 5, 2017, as shown in the Resolution attached hereto as **Exhibit** "A."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT holds easements and for its irrigation and drainage facilities, and

WHEREAS, the property described in the attached **Exhibit "B"** (the "Subject Property") is subject to all or a portion of said easements, and

WHEREAS, OWNER wishes to install facilities crossing over the Hirschfeld Pipeline right-of-way with an installation as follows:

1. One (1) overhead electric service line crossing over the Hirschfeld Pipeline in a perpendicular manner at a minimum clearance of thirty (30) feet above finished grade

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is willing to accept said installation provided the OWNER agrees to the following provisions:

- 1. Nature of Right Conferred. This Agreement is valid only for the purposes specified herein. DISTRICT intends hereby to assent only to the installation described above upon an easement or easements held by DISTRICT. Nothing in this Agreement constitutes a grant or other disposition of any land or interest in land occupied by DISTRICT. OWNER acknowledges that the lands upon which the facilities of DISTRICT are located may not be owned by DISTRICT, and further acknowledges that the consent contained in this Agreement relates only to the rights of DISTRICT by virtue of an easement or easements upon Subject Property. It is understood that nothing in this Agreement shall be considered as a representation by DISTRICT of the authority to grant any interest in land over, across, or under any property owned or controlled by any person other than DISTRICT and OWNER shall obtain any further grants or consents from all others owning interests in the underlying easement land. DISTRICT recognizes the underlying rights of the owner of Subject Property to DISTRICT'S easement area and the rights to use said area for all purposes that do not unreasonably interfere with DISTRICT'S full enjoyment of said easement area. DISTRICT also recognizes the Land Owner has requested PG&E to install overhead electric facilities across the DISTRICT'S easement area.
- 2. <u>Assignments, Sublicenses and Termination.</u> The right to use or maintain the encroachments listed above on the subject DISTRICT facility as authorized herein shall be transferrable to OWNER'S successors or assigns.
- 3. Operational Access. DISTRICT shall have the right of necessary ingress to and egress from said strip of land at any and all times for people with tools and/or equipment required for the repair, replacement, maintenance and/or operation of that irrigation canal or pipeline system and appurtenant facilities located within DISTRICT right-of-way. OWNER agrees that the exercise of OWNER'S rights on the Subject Property shall not interfere with DISTRICT's rights as an easement holder or the operational use of its irrigation and drainage facilities.
- 4. Indemnity and Release. OWNER shall (i) indemnify and hold harmless and (ii) release DISTRICT, its officers, agents and employees, against and from any and all loss, damage, claims, costs and expenses of whatsoever nature, including court costs and attorney's fees resulting from the exercise of its rights under this Agreement including but not limited to, overflow of water from DISTRICT facilities, property damage, personal injury or, wrongful death from the installation, construction, maintenance, repair, renewal, modification, reconstruction, relocation or removal of the permitted OWNER facilities or any part thereof, except for such loss or damage caused by the gross negligence or willful misconduct of DISTRICT. OWNER shall promptly repair, at its own cost and under DISTRICT supervision, any damage caused to DISTRICT'S facilities due to work under this Agreement performed by or on behalf of OWNER
- 5. <u>Plans and Specifications: Construction.</u> All work shall be done in accordance with plans and specifications and upon locations agreed in advance by

DISTRICT as herein provided and shall be erected in such a manner as not to obstruct in any manner the flow of water in the canals, laterals or drain ditches of DISTRICT or to make more expensive or to interfere in any manner whatsoever with access to, or the construction, operation and maintenance of any part of the impacted irrigation and/or drainage works by DISTRICT. Any alterations or changes to the approved plans shall be approved by DISTRICT. **Exhibits "C" and "D"** (IF ATTACHED) indicate agreed locations and/or plans of herein described installations.

OWNER shall call DISTRICT'S Engineer at 847-0341 a minimum 48 hours prior to planned construction and shall coordinate all construction activities with DISTRICT'S Water Operations Department. Further, routine inspections by DISTRICT of construction activities such as trenching, backfilling, compaction, concreting, etc., are required. OWNER and/or its contractors shall comply with all applicable laws, regulations and guidelines including OSHA, CAL-OSHA, State of California Department of Industrial Safety and Health Orders, Cal-Trans, and California Health and Welfare.

6. Ordinary Maintenance, Repair or Replacement. OWNER shall maintain and repair said installations at its sole cost and expense. Where necessary, and to the extent required to perform ordinary operation, maintenance, and reconstruction functions, DISTRICT may request, upon 30 days notice, the removal or relocation of portions of OWNER'S installations and OWNER shall perform the required work at no cost to DISTRICT.

THIS AGREEMENT shall be a covenant binding upon both DISTRICT and OWNER.

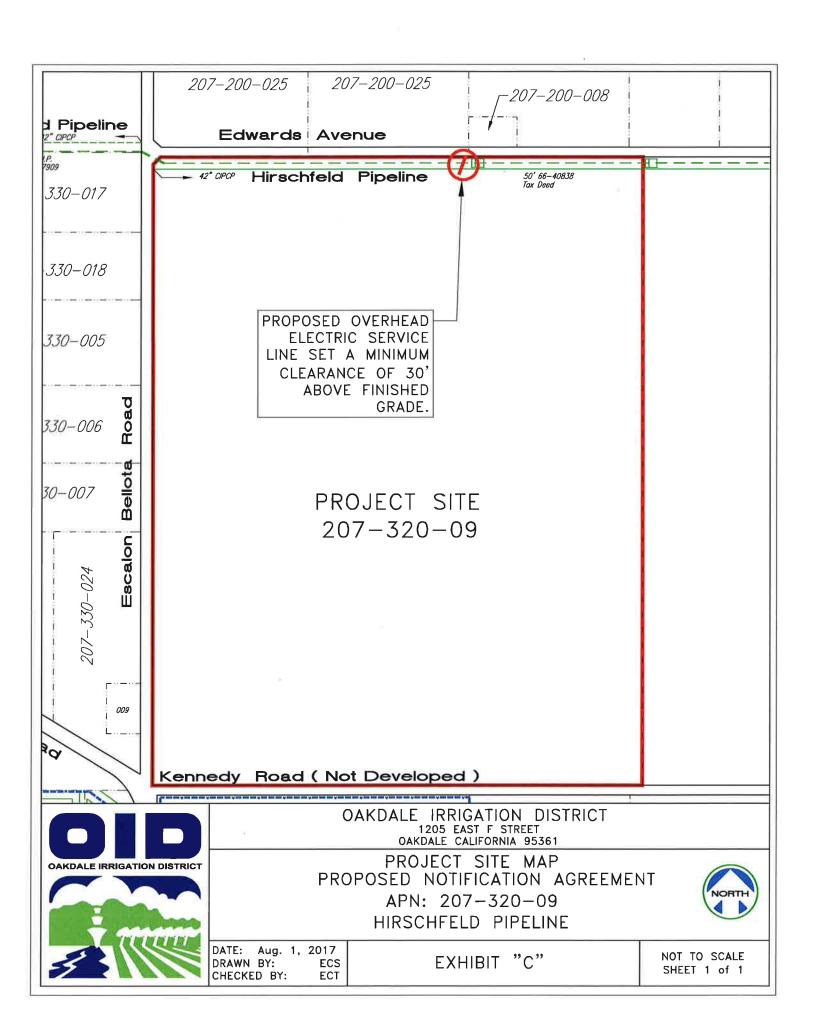

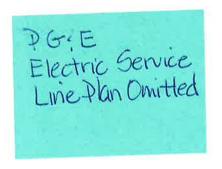

**IN OCTOBER 2017** 

**RECOMMENDED ACTION:** Staff recommends making water available until October 27th,

#### **BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:**

The 2016/2017 water year will end at midnight on September 30<sup>th</sup>. All water delivered after September 30<sup>th</sup> will be charged to OID's 2018 water year usage under the 1988 Agreement with the Bureau of Reclamation.

Water provided to OID customers in October however is now accounted (billed) for as part of their 2017 usage or allotment (if in place). This usage in October will have no impact in March 2018 should an allotment or usage restriction be set.

With a full 300,000 acre foot water supply available this year, no limitations for Tier I or Tier II water users were imposed. Although an unlimited amount of water was made available to local Ag growers outside OID boundaries only a total of 2,800 acre feet was purchased as of August 31st. OID's diversions for 2016/17 are projected to finish off at around 200k acre feet, inclusive of the 2,800 acre feet taken by local Ag.

Due to the water release operations of New Melones by the Bureau of Reclamation this winter, the 200,000 acre feet of water in OID/SSJID's Conservation Account was released and that account sits empty. All surplus water from the two districts on October 1<sup>st</sup> will be, by contract, placed in this account.

Given OID's investments over the years to build-up its surplus water supplies, and the certainty in meeting next year's crop water demands at this point, there are a number of benefits to extending the irrigation season: First; a longer irrigation season affords more opportunity time for aquifers to benefit from recharge. Second; post-harvest irrigation with surface water reduces landowner costs of pumping groundwater; Third; the ability to afford pre-irrigation of winter crops (oats) without relying on precipitation or groundwater to meet that water need is beneficial.

With all these benefits OID staff recommends starting the 2017/2018 water year and making water available until October 27<sup>th</sup>. While highly unlikely, if an allocation was to be imposed for either Tier I or Tier II water users in 2018, water used in October 2017 would not be deducted from that 2018 allotment. With concurrence from the Board, staff will also be preparing to start the 2018 irrigation season back up on or about the first of March or when practical based on precipitation.

<b>FISCAL IMPACT:</b> Some additional overtime will be incurred by water operations staff and the construction season will be compressed possibly incurring more overtime to get the same amount of work done.

An Encroachment Permit for a proposed railcar bridge crossing on OID's Lower Cometa Lateral was considered by the Board in a previous Agenda Report. The landowners of the parcel noted above have requested the Board provide a variance to District Policy to allow them to construct the bridge footings and associated earthwork within the sixty (60) foot Lower Cometa Lateral right-of-way.

Per OID's Irrigation and Drainage Infrastructure Policy, any construction within an OID right-of-way is to be completed by District forces, the only exception being the installation of private pipeline crossings.

Staff recommends denying this request to require the construction of the bridge footings and associated earthwork be completed by OID at the landowner's expense. While the landowners meet OID's insurance requirements to perform the work within OID's right-of-way, completing the work with OID forces ensures the work is done per OID standards and specifications, there are no scheduling conflicts with winter water operations during construction, and the project does not impede OID's ability to operate and maintain the facility upon completion of construction.

The purpose of this correspondence is to notify you of the Oakdale Irrigation District's (OID) conditional intent to issue a "Will Serve Letter", and accept the proposed 13-lot residential domestic water system for the Fairway 7 Estates Subdivision, hereafter referred to as subject water system.

The conditions of the "Will Serve Letter" are as follows:

- Developer must submit a tentative map for review and approval by OID, State of California and Stanislaus County;
- 2) Developer must submit a hydraulic analysis performed by a registered engineer to OID, State of California and Stanislaus County on the subject water system for review and approval. The hydraulic analysis shall accompany the tentative map and include such items as, but not limited to, proposed water line pipe sizes, flow and pressure calculations, and topography survey;
- 3) Developer to submit improvement plans for review and approval by OID prior to construction of subject water system;
- 4) Developer must obtain an OID Developer Agreement and all necessary construction permits, bonds, easements and rights-of-way, etc. required for the construction and future maintenance of the subject domestic water system;

- 5) Developer shall construct, complete and dedicate the subject domestic water system in accordance with OID, the Stanislaus County Department of Environmental Resources and the State of California Department of Public Health conditions, requirements and specifications.
- 6) OID shall supply domestic water for thirteen (13), 1"-inch metered domestic water services and fire flow capability for the subject water system. The Developer shall pay OID, upon dedication of the completed system, a buy in fee of \$15,391.00 per lot, for a total buy in fee of \$200,083.00 These funds are to be placed into OID's Designated Domestic Water Project Fund;
- 7) A Resolution of Acceptance is required by the Board of Directors for ownership, maintenance and operation of the subject water system to become part of OID's Rural Water System.
- 8) This "Will Serve Letter" will be valid for two (2) years from date of issuance. The Developer may petition the District's Board of Directors for an extension 30 days prior to the expiration date if the subject water system will not be completed as agreed in these conditions. Failure to complete the installation of the proposed improvement will result in OID rescinding this letter of intent.

**RECOMMENDED ACTION:** Staff Recommends the Consolidation of the Board of Directors Elections from Odd to Even Numbered Years to be Held with the General Election Cycle

#### BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:

Commencing January 1, 2018 Senate Bill 415 (SB415) requires districts to meet a threshold of voter participation in order to continue holding odd year elections without penalty. SB415 prohibits a district from holding an election other than on a statewide election date if holding an election on a non-statewide election date has previously resulted in a significant decrease in voter turnout. A significate decrease is defined as 25% less than the average voter turnout within that political subdivision for the previous four statewide general elections. The Registrar of Voters' Office compiled information on the prior election years which indicates that our voter turnout for the District's odd-year elections is a mixed bag with some of the Director's Districts falling below 25% when compared to the voter turnout during the general elections.

Since January 2017 ten districts and one city within Stanislaus County have moved from holding their elections during each odd numbered year election to coincide with the statewide elections scheduled each even numbered year.

There could be a savings of public funds if the District's elections were to be consolidated with the statewide general elections and it could also provide greater voter input and participation into the elections.

The District must adopt a plan by resolution AND have it approved by the Board of Supervisors no later than January 1, 2018. Said plan must state that the District will consolidate future elections with the statewide election not later than the November 8, 2022 statewide general election.

FISCAL IMPACT: Could result in a cost savings of public funds.

#### CHAPTER 1.7. Voter Participation

14050. Chapter name.

This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the California Voter Participation Rights Act.

(Added by Stats. 2015, Ch. 235, Sec. 1. Effective January 1, 2016. Section operative January 1, 2018, pursuant to Section 14057.)

#### 14051. Definitions.

As used in this chapter:

(a) "Political subdivision" means a geographic area of representation created for the provision of government services, including, but not limited to, a city, a school district, a community college district, or other district organized pursuant to state law.

(b) "Significant decrease in voter turnout" means the voter turnout for a regularly scheduled election in a political subdivision is at least 25 percent less than the average voter turnout within that political subdivision for the previous four statewide general elections.

(c) "Voter turnout" means the percentage of voters who are eligible to cast ballots within a given political subdivision who voted.

(Added by Stats. 2015, Ch. 235, Sec. 1. Effective January 1, 2016. Section operative January 1, 2018, pursuant to Section 14057.)

### 14052. Political subdivision elections to be held on statewide election date

- (a) Except as provided in subdivision (b), a political subdivision shall not hold an election other than on a statewide election date if holding an election on a nonconcurrent date has previously resulted in a significant decrease in voter turnout.
- (b) A political subdivision may hold an election other than on a statewide election date if, by January 1, 2018, the political subdivision has adopted a plan to consolidate a future election with a statewide election not later than the November 8, 2022, statewide general election.

(Added by Stats. 2015, Ch. 235, Sec. 1. Effective January 1, 2016. Section operative January 1, 2018, pursuant to Section 14057.)

#### 14053. Penalties for violation.

Upon a finding of a violation of subdivision (a) of Section 14052, the court shall implement appropriate remedies, including the imposition of concurrent election dates for future elections and the upgrade of voting equipment or systems to do so. In imposing remedies pursuant to this section, a court may also require a county board of supervisors to approve consolidation pursuant to Section 10402.5.

(Added by Stats. 2015, Ch. 235, Sec. 1. Effective January 1, 2016. Section operative January 1, 2018, pursuant to Section 14057.)

#### 14054. Attorney's fee.

In an action to enforce subdivision (a) of Section 14052, the court shall allow the prevailing plaintiff other than the state or political subdivision of the state, a reasonable attorney's fee consistent with the standards established in Serrano v. Priest (1977) 20 Cal.3d 25, 48-49, and litigation expenses including, but not limited to, expert witness fees and expenses as part of the costs. A prevailing defendant shall not recover any costs, unless the court finds the action to be frivolous, unreasonable, or without foundation.

#### 14055. Voter may file action.

A voter who resides in a political subdivision where a violation of subdivision (a) of Section 14052 is alleged may file an action pursuant to that section in the superior court of the county in which the political subdivision is located.

#### **GENERAL SERVICES AGREEMENT**

THIS GENERAL SERVICES AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is effective as of <u>September 5</u>, <u>2017</u>, (the "Effective Date") by and between the Oakdale Irrigation District, an irrigation district organized pursuant to Division 11 of the California Water Code (the "District"), with offices at 1205 East F Street, Oakdale, California (95361) and <u>Bovee Environmental Management</u>, <u>Inc.</u> ("Contractor"), with offices at <u>1900 McHenry Ave.</u>, <u>Escalon</u>, <u>CA 95320</u>.

In consideration of the promises herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Services: Contractor and the District agree that Contractor will furnish all work, labor, tools, equipment, materials, supervision, scheduling, coordination, and contract administration necessary to undertake and complete in a first-class, expeditious, and workmanlike manner the work specifically described in the Scope of Work attached as Exhibit "A" (the "Work") or Work Releases or Material Requisitions, signed by an authorized District Representative, issued for a specific defined Scope of Work.
  - A. Additional Services: No additional services beyond those required by the Scope of Work shall be performed by Contractor unless the District shall, in writing, specifically direct such services to be performed. Absent compliance with the foregoing, Contractor shall neither have nor make a claim for additional compensation by reason of the additional services.
  - B. **Approval by Engineer**: If required, prior to the commencement of Work or installation of materials, Contractor shall have all material submittals, data sheets and materials approved by the District Engineer. If the Work is to be inspected by the District, Contractor will coordinate such inspection of the Work with the District Engineer.
- Independent Contractor Relationship: Contractor's relationship with the District will 2. be that of an independent contractor, and nothing in this Agreement should be construed to create a partnership, joint venture, or employer-employee relationship. Contractor is not the agent of the District and is not authorized to make any representation, contract, or commitment on behalf of the District. Contractor will not be entitled to any of the benefits which the District may make available to its employees, such as group insurance, profit-sharing or retirement benefits. Contractor will be solely responsible for all tax returns and payments required to be filed with or made to any federal, state or local tax authority with respect to Contractor's performance of services and receipt of fees under this Agreement. SUBJECT: DISCUSSION ON HOW THE SALE OF SURPLUS WATER HAS BENEFITED THE UNDERGROUND AQUIFER AND INCREASED WATER SUPPLIES LOCALLY

#### **BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:**

There have been questions raised recently on the potential impacts water transfers and water sales of OID's surplus water to non-local buyers may be having on OID's ability to recharge the local aquifer. Such a good question deserved a public response.

The answer to this question can be found in the publically available data OID tracks, produces and reports to the State of California's Department of Water Resources (DWR). OID's actions are in compliance with the Ag Water Suppliers Efficient Water Management Practices Act of 1990. These reports, called Ag Water Management Plans (AWMP), are prepared by an independent consultant hired by OID to insure the methodology, consistency and accuracy of the reports meet the standards set by the State's DWR.

Constituents of OID should be happy to know that as of the 2016 AWMP report the amount of groundwater recharging our local aquifer has <u>increased</u> 50% since 2001. By the numbers, the amount of recharge to the aquifer in 2001 was 46,246 acre feet. In the 2016 AWMP, the average recharge in the 2005-2104 study years has increased to an average of 69,524 acre feet.

During this period of time OID was engaged in water sales and transfers outside the OID service area in all but 2 (2011 and 2014) of those 13 years. It is clear to see that water transfers and sales has facilitated the improvement in groundwater recharge in OID's service area. This very question was asked and studied as part of OID's 2007 Water Resources Plan (WRP). The Environmental Impact Report (EIR) that was prepared to analyze the actions contained in the WRP supports the benefits to groundwater. The EIR stated that the infrastructure improvements in the OID water delivery system, funded by the sales of surplus water, would result in both direct and indirect benefits to the underground aquifer. Those determinations in 2007 have proven to be true.

The AWMP sent to the DWR on a legislative required schedule is a "report card" if you will regarding the water management activities of OID. The data produced in the AWMP supports the district's actions that conservation projects in OID are both supportive and positive to groundwater recharge in our basin. So let's look at the numbers and the reasons we believe that continuing with water sales and the funding of conservation projects will continue to improve groundwater conditions in OID.

That 50% improvement in aquifer recharge is directly related to two factors;

1. Since water transfers and sales began in 1998 and through 2016, OID has derived a revenue of \$69 million from such sales. During that same period, OID has invested \$67.8 million back into its water delivery system in capital replacement/improvement and modernization projects. That investment in capital projects has provided both direct and indirect project benefits to the underground aquifer.

2. The conversion of thousands of acres of pastureland to high-dollar crops has contributed to the ability to put more water into the aquifer. Such land conversions necessitate the ripping and sub-soiling of those acres before planting of these high dollar crops. The OID service area is dominated by hardpan soils that are resistant to the vertical infiltration of water. Once these soils are opened up by ripping/sub-soiling their infiltration value to the aquifer improves dramatically.

These land conversion benefits also extends throughout the winter. Previously, when 12 inches of rain would fall in the winter and spring it would hit these hardpan soils, run vertically off these saturated fields and into the OID drains and out of the district. Now, with the open soil profile, that rainwater and applied irrigation water can infiltrate into the ground and eventually into the aquifer.

Additionally, a ripped/sub-soiled parcel surrounded by hardpan pasture or rice ground acts as a local pathway for perched and saturated soils to gain drainage access to the aquifer this did not exist previously.

The numbers in support of these two factors are presented below. They are a comparison of the 2005 AWMP using a 2001 Base Year as a starting point versus the 2016 published Ag Water Management Plan which covers the years 2005-2014. There was also an interim report published in 2012 that only advances what the 2016 numbers show.

#### Seepage from OID Canals and Drains:

In the 2001 AWMP the seepage from canals and drains to the aquifer was 27,368 acre feet. In the 2016 AWMP that number had increased to an average 42,050 acre feet. Seepage benefits to the aquifer have improved 54%.

#### Quantifying the Increase in Seepage from OID Canals and Drains:

1. OID has automated much of its main canals and service canals with Rubicon Gates at a cost of \$8.3 million. Again, all monies to pay for that project came from the sale of surplus water. An ancillary benefit of the Rubicon Gates is that they keep water ponded (pooled) more often and at higher levels in the canals thereby contributing to more infiltration along their reach. When you have 300 miles of canals and 100 miles of them are ponded more frequently, it offers a significant recharge opportunity and benefit that did not exist before. Canals are like percolation reservoirs only long and narrow. Very advantageous and beneficial for recharge.

As the Rubicon System continues to be implemented throughout OID, funded by water sale revenues, OID will have more ponded miles of water in its canals resulting in more groundwater recharge opportunities.

2. OID built two regulating reservoirs at a cost of \$11.82 million. This money came from the sale of surplus water. OID built one reservoir on the south side (2001-02) and one on the north side (2010-11). Those reservoirs, while built for water operation purposes, added about 40-45 acres of percolation area to the OID system. With their depth of water, they are incremental contributors to the total district infiltration volume.

More distributed storage within the OID delivery system is also planned as part of the Rubicon system build-out. Additional reservoirs will include dual purpose designs, operational control of irrigation water during the irrigation season and stormwater-capture-recharge systems in the

winter. However, the funding and building of these expensive modernization systems will only be possible through water sales that can meet their high capital cost of construction. That estimated build-out cost is \$35 million.

3. The canal and delivery system improvements in OID and their associated net water savings, all generated from sales of surplus water, has allowed OID to start the irrigation season sooner and to keep water in the system much later into October. An advantage that did not exist previously. Through investment of monies into OID's dilapidated deliver system, these services are now possible. These changes add to increased opportunity time for more seepage to occur from OID canals and drains and on-farm systems.

#### Deep Percolation of Applied Water "On-Farm:"

In the 2001 AWMP the deep-perc loss to the aquifer from on-farm applied water was 18,063 acre feet. In the 2016 AWMP that number had increase to an average 27,063 acre feet. Deep-perc benefits to the aquifer from applied on-farm water has improved 52%.

#### Quantifying the increase in Percolation from Applied Water On-Farm:

- 1. In 2001 the amount of permanent crop acreage was 6,923 acres. In 2016 the permanent crop acreage stood at 30,639 acres. This change represents a 442% increase in permanent crop acreage within OID. It's a logical assumption that a significant part of the 23,716 acres of "new" permanent crop acreage (31,000 acres minus 6,923 acres) was ripped and subsoiled prior to planting. Such activity on 23,716 acres is positively correlated to the large increase in percolation of applied water on-farm.
- 2. As identified in the 2007 WRP, OID was losing in-district acreage from its surface water delivery system due to OID's inability to provide consistent heads to the farm gate. A symptom of its dilapidated canal delivery system. At the time, in-district acreage was converting to groundwater pumping as a means of convenience. Through its modernization efforts, funded by water sales, OID has brought back, and continues to bring back, those lost acreages and is getting them off pumping groundwater.

#### **Deep Percolation of Precipitation:**

In the 2001 AWMP "irrigation season" percolation of precipitation was determined to be 815 acre feet. In the 2016 AWMP, number has increased to an average 13,584 acre feet. Irrigation season percolation of precipitation has increase by 16 times.

#### Quantifying the increase in Precipitation:

1. The magnitude of the change in infiltration of precipitation is again positively correlated to the dramatic increase in land conversions to permanent crop and the benefits previously attributable to ripping and subsoiling of hard pan soils. A good portion of the OID farming soils are now opened and penetrable to water infiltration that benefit recharge.

#### Efficiency Improvements in OID Keeps Water Local:

Not related to percolation or infiltration or groundwater, but one of the biggest benefits of the conservation projects funded by the sale of surplus water is that it has allowed OID to keep more water local.

In 2001, the amount of water <u>leaving</u> the OID service area from farmer's fields (tailwater), OID drains and OID canal and lateral spills totaled approximately 74,616 acre feet. Today, that amount has been

reduced to 48,605 acre feet. That's a reduction of water leaving the OID of 26,011 acre feet (35%). The 26,000 acre feet leaving OID via drains and spills was done without benefit to OID. It was a significant loss both in revenue opportunity and a diminishment in water reliability to in-district water users.

Back 2001, the loss of 26,000 acre feet leaving OID was considered an "operational loss" of water and acceptable. Today, because of modernization and system improvements funded solely by the sale of surplus water, that water sits in New Melones Reservoir available to meet the needs of OID constituents where and when needed. This water represents a huge increase in OID's water reliability and drought resilience which served constituents well from during the 2012-2016 drought. It is this conserved water, with other conserved water, that allowed OID to annex 10,000 acres of land and expand its' agricultural footprint, keeping water local.

There is no question that the sale of OID's surplus water and associated system improvements from the revenues derived from those sales have been a very healthy benefit to our groundwater aquifer and to our local water supplies. The data OID has collected and tracked since 2001 shows this to be a fact. By all indications, the local aquifer should be responding, but it's not. A problem has emanated that was not anticipated nor forecasted by OID. That problem is currently impacting OID and our constituent's ability to realize the aquifer benefits OID has invested in.

To the east of Oakdale and in the Sierra foothills has evolved the development of 35,000 acres (est.) of tree-crops. All these lands are pumping groundwater at the rate of 100,000 acre feet (est.) annually from the aquifer. These lands are lying upstream of OID and the City of Oakdale. OID can spend millions to improve recharge by 20, 30 or 40,000 acre feet but it will be for naught due to these upstream extractions. This 100,000 acre feet of intercepted groundwater was water migrating westward to replenish our local aquifer. That water will now not get here for that purpose.

Until this extraction of groundwater east of OID is addressed by the Groundwater Sustainability Agency, OID and the City of Oakdale will continue to see lowering of water tables in our area, but it is clearly not because of nor attributable to out-of-district water sales by OID.

On August 16<sup>th</sup> Keith Forbes and I conducted three JPIA training classes; Injury Illness Prevention Program (IIPP), Accident Investigation, and Hazard Identification. These classes also met the JPIA's Professional Development Program (PDP) curriculum.

Our first class was the IIPP which highlighted staff roles and responsibilities related injury prevention, the benefits of routine workplace inspection & hazard correction and best practices when investigating a workplace accident or near miss.

Our second class was Accident Investigation and the goal of this course is to understand why a water agency should manage risk and when an accident occurs implement corrective action(s) to ensure a similar accident doesn't reoccur. In response to requests pursuant to the Public Records Act and the State's effort to bolster transparency in government, the California Division of Safety of Dams (DSOD) will soon publicly release information related to all dams under the State's jurisdiction.

This letter is to inform you that the following information about your dam will be made available soon on DSOD's website for public viewing (<a href="https://www.water.ca.gov/damsafety">www.water.ca.gov/damsafety</a>):

- Downstream hazard classification
- Reservoir restriction status
- Condition assessment

As you have been recently notified, DSOD updated the downstream hazard classification for all State jurisdictional dams in accordance with Sections 6160 and 6161 of the California Water Code. The updated hazard classification for your dam is "low."

As described by the Federal Emergency Management Agency, a dam hazard classification represents the possible adverse incremental consequences that result from the release of water or stored contents due to failure of the dam or mis-operation of the dam or appurtenances. It does not represent the current condition of the dam.

DSOD may order a reservoir to be operated to a specific level that is lower than the maximum design storage level when a dam or its appurtenant structure(s) has a known major deficiency or when repairs are not resolved in a timely manner. Restrictions are lifted once the deficiency is remediated or studies demonstrate that the dam is safe for continued use. The reservoir level of your dam is not currently restricted for a deficiency related to dam safety.

In accordance with the annual data collected by the US Army Corp of Engineers for the National Inventory of Dams, DSOD rates the condition of all jurisdictional dams as satisfactory, fair, poor, unsatisfactory, or not rated. Dams without identified deficiencies are considered satisfactory, whereas dams with unresolved deficiencies will be considered in fair, poor, or unsatisfactory condition depending on the severity of the deficiencies. Your dam has been rated in "satisfactory" condition.
