RESOLUTION APPROVING JOINT EXERCISE OF POWERS AGREEMENT ESTABLISHING THE EASTERN SAN JOAQUIN GROUNDWATER AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, on August 29, 2014, the California Legislature passed comprehensive groundwater legislation contained in SB 1168, SB 1319 and AB 1739. Collectively, those bills, as subsequently amended, enacted the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act ("Act"), Governor Brown signed the legislation on September 16, 2014 and it became effective on January 1, 2015; and

WHEREAS, OID has carefully considered the terms and conditions of the JPA Agreement and has determined that participation in the JPA Agreement is appropriate and in the best interest of OID.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Board of Directors of the Oakdale Irrigation District hereby approves the JPA Agreement and authorizes OID to participate in the JPA Agreement as a member of the Authority.

- 3. The General Manager is authorized and directed to take all action necessary to carry out and fulfill the requirements and purposes of the JPA Agreement.

BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:

Condor Earth Technologies (Condor) has assisted OID in all aspects of the Two Mile Bar Tunnel Project to date. The bid opening for this project occurred on Thursday, January 19th at 2:30 pm. OID staff and Condor have been working diligently to be able to provide the Board with a recommendation to award the bid to the lowest responsible and responsive bidder at today's meeting.

Amendment No. 04 will provide additional funds to finalize Task No. 5 - Contractor Bidding Support and includes funds for unanticipated costs that have incurred so that staff and Condor can provide a recommendation to the Board.

Based on the institutional knowledge Condor has pertaining to this Project, Staff recommends the Board authorize the General Manager to execute the Amendment No. 04 to Work Release No. 009 to Professional Services Agreement 2009-PSA-003 with Condor Earth Technologies.

Work Release No. 09 – Amendment No. 04 Final Design, Plans, Specifications, Engineer's Estimate, Geotechnical Baseline Report and the Contract Documents for the Two Mile Bar Tunnel

Description

As the final part of project development before the start of construction, this phase will complete the Final Design, Plans, Specifications, Engineer' Estimate, Geotechnical Baseline Report and the Contract Documents. Work Release No. 009 is issued to perform four (4) Tasks briefly identified in the following narrative. For more definition of the Tasks, refer to Exhibit "A" attached for the details.

Scope of Work

Provide the necessary resources to complete the Final Design and project documents as identified in the following four (4) Tasks:

- Task 1 90% Final Design Complete the design, preparation of plans, and preparation of Technical Specifications for the Two-Mile Bar Tunnel. The scope for Task 1 is based on completion of the 50% design concept provided in Condor's report dated March 30, 2007.
- Task 2 90% Construction Cost Estimate Prepare construction cost estimate for the 90% plans and specifications prepared in Task 1.
- Task 3 Geotechnical Baseline Report Preparation of a Geotechnical Baseline Report (GBR) based off of the Geologic Data Report published March 30, 2007, and recently updated in November of 2012, with additional geophysical data and additional core holes.
- Task 4 Contract Documents Preparation of the construction documents for bidding purposes which will include 100% final preparation of Plans and Specifications with an updated Cost Estimate.

Amendment No. 01

Provide the necessary resources to update the previously prepared (2013) Final Design, Plans and Specifications, Engineer's Opinion of Probable Costs, Geotechnical Baseline Report and Contract Documents, and provide assistance with Contractor Bidding. The Scope of Work for Amendment No. 01 is subdivided into four (4) primary Tasks:

Task 1 100% Final Design and Plan Preparation COMPLETED

Task 2	Update Engineer's Opinion of Probable Construction Costs (Construction Cost Estimate) COMPLETED
Task 3	Update Geotechnical Data Report (GDR) and Geotechnical Baseline Report (GBR) COMPLETED
Task 4	Update Contract Documents COMPLETED
Task 5	Contractor Bidding Support IN PROGRESS

Amendment No. 02

The anticipated costs for tasks 1 thru 4 is over budget due to additional sub-consultant survey services, unanticipated modifications to the Drawings including downstream canal plug ramp and outlet pipe details, and additional time spent by senior staff to update the Engineer's Opinion of Probable Construction Costs and Contract Documents based on OID comments of the above. This extra work is primarily offset by the contingency. Addendum No. 2 primarily includes unanticipated additional hours for responding to Bidder questions and an additional Bidder's site visit.

Amendment No. 03

The original anticipated costs for task 5 lack in sufficient funds to cover the additional work to qualify the bidders as being responsive. Condor has been requested to conduct extensive research and data compilation above and beyond the original scope of work and to aid in addressing a bid protest.

Amendment No. 04

This amendment is to add additional funds to Task No. 5 – Contractor Bidding Support, for Condor to assist in the final process of selecting the lowest responsible and responsive bidder.

Schedule

The Notice to Proceed will be issued on or before January 25, 2013. Based on this date for the Notice to Proceed a preliminary schedule will be as follows. A final schedule will be determined after the Kick-Off meeting has been completed.

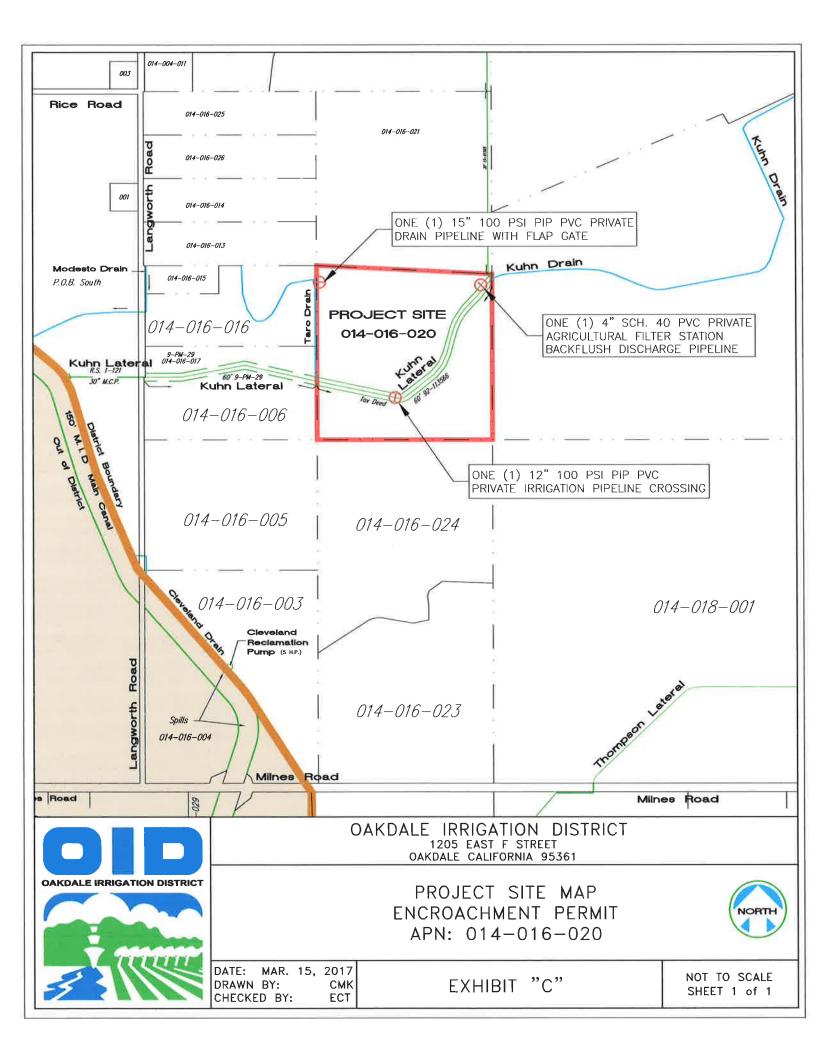
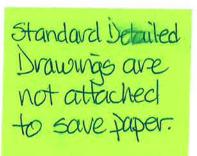

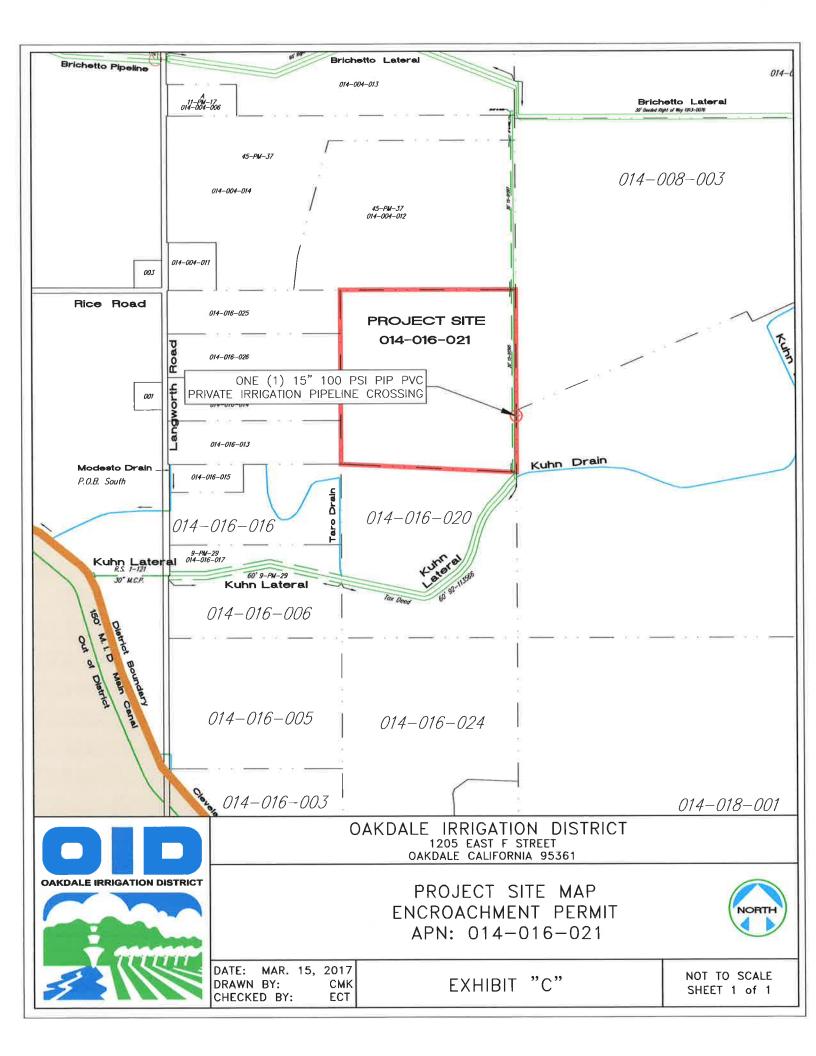

BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:

Staff solicited bids for the Two-Mile Bar Tunnel Project of which will consist of the construction of a new 5,949' long (approximate) tunnel, two portals and associated improvements on the South Main Canal as described in the Contract Documents. The bids were due January 19, 2017and five bidders submitted bids. The bids have been reviewed and a determination has been made by OID staff and Condor Earth Technologies (Condor) staff that Drill Tech Drilling & Shoring (DTDS) submitted the lowest responsive and responsible bid. DTDS meets the company tunneling experience requirements under Specification Section 02415, Subsection 1.07A. Condor staff contacted the references noted in DTDS's bid and all responded with the same comments; safe contractor, no litigation or claim issues, good contract administration and management and projects were on or ahead of schedule.

For the reasons noted above, OID and Condor staff are providing a recommendation to the Board to award the bid for the Two-Mile Bar Tunnel Project to DTDS for a lump sum price of \$14,930,576.00.

The Engineer's Estimate of Probable Construction Costs for this Project is \$15,700,000.00.

BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:

Condor Earth Technologies (Condor) were requested to provide Construction Management and Quality Assurance services for the construction of the OID South Main Canal Two-Mile Bar Tunnel Project. Construction Management and Quality Assurance services will be necessary to assure the Contractor is meeting the contract requirements and the construction is in compliance with the drawings and specifications. Condor will provide a Construction Manager/Resident Engineer utilized ½ time for the project duration, one full-time project inspector, one second inspector when work is conducted on both portals simultaneously, part-time support staff inclusive of office, field and laboratory personnel and a Project Manager utilized ¼ time for the project duration. Project inspectors will also collect samples of shotcrete and concrete for testing as well as perform compaction testing and collect samples for laboratory testing during grading and fill placement operations. Part-time support staff will be provided for tunneling consultations, geologic mapping, supplemental engineering and administrative support. The scope of this Proposal includes Construction Management and Quality Assurance throughout the duration of construction of the Two-Mile Bar Tunnel Construction project. The scope also includes materials sampling and testing services as required in the project specifications.

Condor has previously performed several phases of work on this project. They include:

- Two-Mile Bar Tunnel Preliminary Design Report (50% Design), dated March 30, 2007, Condor Project No. 3818E/3B/2c
- Two-Mile Bar Geologic Data Report dated March 30, 2007, Condor Project No. 3818E/3B/1i
- Two-Mile Bar Geologic Data Report (Third Stage Exploration) dated November 19, 2012, Condor Project No. 3818G1
- Two-Mile Bar 90% Final Design, Plan Preparation, Construction Cost Estimate, Geotechnical Baseline Report, Plans/Specifications and Contract Documents dated December 31, 2013, Condor Project No. 3818G2 (Work Release #009, January 17, 2013)
- Two-Mile Bar 100% Final Design, Plan Preparation, Updated Construction Cost Estimate, Updated Geotechnical Baseline Report and Geologic Data Report, Update and finalize Specifications and Contract Documents dated November 1, 2016, Condor Project No. 3818G3 (Work Release #009, Amendment No. 001 August 2, 2016)

The scope of work proposed herein is subdivided into five primary tasks of work based on our anticipated schedule for various stages of the Contractor's work. Additional details for each task is included in later sections. In summary, the stages are identified as the following tasks:

- Task 1 Mobilization, Site Development, Submittal Reviews
- Task 2 Upstream Portal Construction, Flare Development and Tunnel Construction

- Task 3 Downstream Portal Development and Adjacent Tunnel Construction
- Task 4 Upstream Flare Invert, Canal Berm Construction, Tunnel Completion and Site Reconstruction
- Task 5 Demobilization and Project Closeout

A discussion of each of these tasks is provided in the following sections, followed by a summary of estimated fees for each task.

SCOPE OF WORK

The Construction Management, Construction Phase Engineering and Quality Assurance scope was based on the anticipated Contractor schedule and construction approach detailed in the Two-Mile Bar Construction Cost Estimate Update Memo prepared by Condor dated September 1, 2016. As such, this scope of work is based on the following:

- Most of the work will be performed from the upstream portal, that shotcrete will be applied during one shift per day, and that a second shift is primarily used for tunnel excavation.
- A Construction Manager/Resident Engineer will be utilized one-half time for the project duration.
 There will be periods of higher or lower utilization of the Construction Manager/Resident
 Engineer, depending on the Contractor's work phasing and activities. The Construction
 Manager/Resident Engineer will be Mr. Ron Skaggs, Principal Engineer.
- One full-time project inspector for the project duration will be needed and a second inspector will be needed for a portion of the project (while work is being performed from both the upstream and downstream portal). Project inspectors will also collect samples of shotcrete and concrete for testing as well as perform compaction testing and collect samples for laboratory testing during grading and fill placement operations.
- Part-time support staff will be provided for tunneling consultations, geologic mapping, supplemental engineering and administrative support. Anticipated support includes the Project Manager, Mr. Scott Lewis, Principal Engineering Geologist, at one-quarter time utilization, and additional support from Condor office, field and laboratory staff.
- We have estimated the scope of laboratory testing for each task based on the project schedule assumptions and technical specification requirements.
- Additional assumptions with regards to staffing and the number of anticipated hours are included in the detailed Construction Management and Quality Assurance Fee Estimate Table (attached).

Task 1 - Mobilization, Site Development, Submittal Reviews

Task 1 is based on 4 weeks of Contractor mobilization and development of the project office site. This task will also include review of Contractor submittals and Resident Engineer response. While the Oak Tree Mitigation fees have not been included in this task, we have included consultation costs for mitigation fee processing by the tree consultant, Quincy Yaley of C2 Consult. While the mitigation fee processing may be a two-step process (upstream and downstream portals), we have included the anticipated hours in Task 1.





Task 2 - Upstream Portal Construction Flare Development and Tunnel Construction

Task 2 is based on 29 weeks of work and includes the upstream portal construction, flare development and tunnel construction. Condor will provide Resident Engineer, project inspectors, support staff and laboratory services.

Task 3 - Downstream Portal Development and Adjacent Tunnel Construction

Task 3 is based on 12 weeks of work and includes the downstream portal development and tunnel construction from the downstream portal. Condor will provide Resident Engineer, project inspectors, support staff and laboratory services.

Task 4 - Upstream Flare Invert, Berm Construction, Tunnel Completion, Site Reconstruction

Task 4 is based on 14 weeks of work and includes the upstream flare invert, berm construction, tunnel completion and site reconstruction. Condor will provide Resident Engineer, project inspectors, support staff and laboratory services.

Task 5 - Demobilization and Project Closeout

Task 5 is based on 5 weeks of work and includes destruction of piezometers, preparation and submittal of a final report, along with Project Contract Closeout. Condor will provide Resident Engineer, project inspectors and support staff.

SCHEDULE

Condor's work for the Two-Mile Bar Tunnel Construction project is anticipated to start immediately following Contractor Award or as directed by OID pending Contractor schedule. We anticipate that construction would begin no earlier than February 15, 2017 and no later than April 1, 2017 as described in the Contract Documents for Bidding. Based on this assumption, the project should be completed in the fall of 2018, or potentially sooner.

FEES

Condor proposes to perform the work on a time-and-expenses basis, according to our 2016 – 2017 Schedule of Fees, attached. To tie current employees to their fee schedule rate, we are also providing a supplemental table, 2016 Condor Earth Employee Rate List. The listed professional and staff employees will use the effective rate for the duration of the proposed scope. The listed rates for prevailing wage field staff includes current DIR published rates and published rate increases for each craft (inspector) group. Additional or newly hired employees that are not currently listed on the Employee Rate List will be billed at their fee schedule rate by title. Condor understands that OID will issue an amendment listed under our current Professional Services Agreement.

Condor's scope and fees do not include any project schedule extension due to changes in scope (such as adding Segment 4), failure of the Contractor to meet the Contract Schedule, or out-of-scope construction management support due to Contractor claims, arbitration, or litigation.

The estimated fees for the proposed scope are detailed on the attached spreadsheet (Construction Management and Quality Assurance Fee Estimate Table), and are based on the staff and rate tables. The staff listed is based on our planned execution as of the preparation of this Proposal, and assumes the Contractor's Work Plan will generally follow the approach as described in the Two-Mile Bar Construction Cost Estimate Update Memo prepared by Condor dated September 1, 2016. Changes in staff members or work load may cause some shifting of anticipated hours between staff, or new staff hired, to





more efficiently execute the work. However, rates of similarly qualified staff will not vary. The estimated total fee will not be exceeded without prior authorization by OID. The fees are summarized below by Task.

BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:

Bumgardner Biological Consulting were requested to submit a proposal to provide biological monitoring for the construction of the OID South Main Canal Two-Mile Bar Tunnel Project. Work Release No. 005 has been prepared for biological monitoring for the project and focuses on nesting bird and roosting bat clearance as well as California tiger salamander monitoring in accordance with the environmental documentation (EA) prepared for the Two Mile Bar Tunnel Project. Pre-construction training will be required and provided by the biological monitor for nesting bird/roosting bats and CTS, and the monitor will be present twice a week during the nesting season and daily during ground breaking activities at the downstream portal. Bumgardner's budget (attached Exhibit "A") includes monitoring twice a week for any nesting birds with the intent of monitoring to allow for the removal of any nests before eggs are laid; however, there is always the chance of a nest being missed in which case the biologist would be able to remove the nest once the fledglings are no longer dependent on it. Should there be any concerns identified within the project site during construction, the biological monitor will work with the contractor to put measures in place to avoid destruction of the nest/species while creating the least inconvenience and time delay for the contractor. District management will be assisting with all aspects of biological monitoring relating to this project.

Work Release No. 005 consists of five tasks; Task 1 - Nesting Bird & Roosting Bat Monitoring, Task 2 California Tiger Salamander Monitoring, Task 3 – Environmental Awareness Training, Task 4 – Miscellaneous, and Task 5 - Reporting. The estimated Not to Exceed Amount for Work Release No. 005 is \$290,764.00.

Based on the institutional knowledge Bumgardner has pertaining to this Project, Staff recommends the Board authorize the General Manager to execute the Work Release No. 005 to Professional Services Agreement 2011-PSA-003 for Bumgardner Biological Consulting to perform the biological monitoring for the South Main Canal Two-Mile Bar Tunnel Project.

BACKGROUND:

Action(s) to be taken:

By majority vote of the OID and SSJID Boards at the end of September 2016, the Board's approved a water sale to the Department of Water Resources and San Luis Delta Mendota Water Authority that resulted in a \$2 million one-time revenue to each District. If this transaction had not taken place before the end of the September 2016, this water would have been left behind in New Melones and under Bureau control. Reclamation would have tagged this water for fish and water quality purposes and have sent it down the river without benefit of revenue to the two Districts.

But for the actions of the majority of the two Boards, this revenue loss was averted and a financial benefit was derived to OID. In recognition of that benefit the Board of Directors may wish to direct that this money be reallocated to the benefit of its constituents.

An Ad Hoc Committee was established for that purpose and they may wish to provide a recommendation to the whole Board.

SUBJECT: REVIEW AND TAKE POSSIBLE ACTION TO SET THE 2017 OUT-OF-DISTRICT

WATER RATE

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:

On March 7, 2017, the Board declared "surplus" water available for annual Out-of-District (OOD) Service Agreements and set a reservation requirement for all applicants for out-of-district water. The setting of the water rate for out-of-district water was postponed to this Board meeting.

Water Operations Staff have evaluated the "readiness" of each of the 8,000 acres of CEQA certified OOD applicants eligible for delivery of out-of-district water. They estimate that around 8,850 acre feet (+/-) at most will be the water demand. That is because, for a variety of reasons, many of the OOD applicants have not yet connected their pump systems to OID's surface water delivery point.

In making a determination on a water rate for OOD applicants, the Board should be mindful that the water rate for Tiered II constituents is about \$65 per acre foot (\$58 per acre foot water charge plus the per-acre base rate of \$27 per acre divided by 4 acre foot assumed water use).

The 2016 OOD water rate was \$100 per acre-foot. This rate had increased incrementally over the last few years at \$15 per acre foot in each year to reach the current rate for out-of-district water. Staff emphasized at the last meeting that OOD water users are being sold conserved water. At that point at the March 7, 2017 Board meeting there was confusion amongst some Directors about the difference in the "cost of conserved water" versus the "cost of water delivered to OID water users." That difference is explained below.

The cost of conserved water, as presented at the last Board meeting, is about \$95 per acre foot. That number was derived by the following analysis, which appeared in the February 21, 2017 Board Agenda;

Between 2005 and 2015 OID had spent nearly \$53.5 million in capital construction to generate about 30,000 acre feet of conserved water. It is this water that is being made available to local out-of-district water users. Of that cost, roughly \$30 million was financed through bonds acquired by OID over a 30 year period at an average interest rate of 5%. The remaining \$21.5 million was paid for by water sales to out-of-area buyers. If one was to look at the cost of that conserved water the brief analysis would be;

\$32.0 million over 8 yrs. at 5% (avg.) over 30,000 af =

\$26.0 million over 22 yrs. at 4% (avg.) over 30,000 af =

\$23.5 million over 30 yrs. at 1%* over 30,000 af =

Cost of Conserved Water = \$ 94.85 /af

*rate is the assumed investment rate of return on that money if it were placed in OID's investment portfolio

The "cost of water delivered to OID water users" is provided below;

The cost of water delivered to OID water users" is highly variable but is derived by dividing OID's annual O&M&A cost for that year by the amount diverted and produced (inclusive of deep well, reclamation pumps, drain pumps, etc.) for that water year. Going back to predrought conditions to find a "normal" year (2014), we find OID had an O&M&A budget of \$11,775,541 (2015 Financial Report). The water diverted and produced that year totaled 241,430 acre feet (2015 AWMP Table 5-16), making the "cost of delivered water to OID water users" \$48.75 per acre foot in that year. Last year's (2016) "unofficial numbers" put that same cost closer to \$75-\$80 per acre foot. Like Staff has said, the numbers are highly variable and dependent on a number of factors specific to that year.

Capital costs are not figured into the "delivery cost" for water as they are not a part of getting water to the farm gate. Capital costs are primarily funded (80%) by outside water sales.

Hopefully there is enough discussion provided here to arrive at a fair and equitable rate for OOD water for 2017. A rate that generates revenues for OID but is mindful of the need to encourage the use of surface water over the use of groundwater to the benefit of our local aquifer.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Staff recommends granting a waiver to Section 10(b) of the Trinitas

Annexation Agreement

BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:

OID received notification (letter attached) of the transfer of interests of some of the investment holdings at Trinitas Partners, LLC. I refer to it as an "investment shuffle" and is not unusual for a development investor group of which Trinitas Partners, LLC represents. Under the terms of the Annexation Agreement with OID, Trinitas is required within the first five (5) years of the Agreement to notify OID of such transactions, hence the letter OID received. After 5-years of the Agreement (April 2018) this requirement will no longer be applicable.

Rather than restate many of the points contained in the Annexation Agreement, staff would direct the Board to read the Trinitas letter in its entirety. Their letter contains all the facts of the Agreement that will be in discussion. Of note is the fact that Trinitas, who has acted as the management group and who OID interfaces with, will not be transferring its investment shares. The faces and names associated with the farming operations will not change but will be known as Pomona Farming, LLC going forward.

Trinitas has requested that the District waive the provisions of Section 10(b) and consent to its request to waive the call on the remaining annexation fees. Per the Annexation Agreement, this request shall not be unreasonably withheld and <u>shall be based</u> (emphasis added) on the District's assessment of the transferee's creditworthiness.

This is a solely a legal issue and has been reviewed by counsel. Staff has done a review of Public Sector Pension Investments (PSP) and provided that review in the attachments. In staff's assessment, PSP Investments and their holdings represent a creditworthy investor and therefore meet the legal standard of the contract in granting a waiver by the Board.

Dear Mr. Knell:

As you know, effective April 2, 2013, the Oakdale Irrigation District and various affiliates of Trinitas Partners, LLC ("Trinitas") executed nine "Agreements Establishing Terms and Conditions of Annexation of Land Into Oakdale Irrigation and Establishing Terms and Conditions of Service and Covenants Running with the Land" (the "Annexation Agreements"). As you also know, each of the entities that owns land subject to an Annexation Agreement is ultimately managed by Trinitas or its three principals, who also supervise the farming operations on that land. The principals of Trinitas also have direct or indirect ownership interests in each of those entities, meaning that there is overlap in control between Trinitas and those entities.

As we have discussed with OID staff, the entities that currently own the land subject to the Annexation Agreements propose to transfer that land. As is the case with the current owners, the acquiring parties will be a group of related entities, with each acquiring entity purchasing all of the land owned by one of the current landholding entities. The current land configurations will therefore remain unchanged. Trinitas will continue to be the day to day manager of the acquiring entities and will continue to manage the farming of the land just as it has since before the Annexation Agreements were executed. In addition, the principals of Trinitas will have an ownership interest in the parent company of the acquiring entities, and Trinitas principals will serve on the governing body of that company.

The acquiring entities will all be owned by Pomona Farming, LLC, which will be owned by the principals of Trinitas and the Public Sector Pension Investment Board ("PSP Investments"), a Canadian crown corporation established by an act of the Canadian Parliament in September 1999. It is one of Canada's largest pension investment managers, with CAD\$125.8 billion of assets under management as of September 30, 2016. PSP Investments invests net contributions from the pension plans of the public service, the Canadian Forces, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and the Reserve Force. PSP Investments manages a diversified global portfolio including stocks, bonds and other fixed-income securities, and investments in private equity, real estate, infrastructure, natural resources and private debt. Section 10 of each Annexation Agreement addresses transfers of the land subject to that agreement. Section 10(a) requires each transferring landowner to grant OID certain deeds of rights of way, and Trinitas is working with OID staff to determine if any such deeds are necessary. If any deeds are required, they will be granted to OID prior to the proposed transfer.

Section 10(b) provides that the annexation fees paid under an Annexation Agreement become immediately due and payable upon the transfer of the subject land to an unaffiliated party before April 2, 2018 unless a waiver is granted by OID. Section 10(b) further provides that a waiver "shall not be unreasonably withheld" and is to be based "solely upon the District's assessment of the transferee's creditworthiness."

Trinitas does not believe Section 10(b) is applicable to the proposed transfer because the current landowning entities and the acquiring entities will all be affiliates of Trinitas as described above. Thus, the transfers will not be to "unaffiliated third parties." However, in the interest of transparency, we wanted to call the proposed transfer to your attention and request OID's concurrence that it will not trigger Section 10(b). Alternatively, to the extent OID believes Section 10(b) might be triggered, Trinitas respectfully requests that OID grant a waiver of the acceleration clause included in Section 10(b) of each Annexation Agreement so that the outstanding balance of each annexation fee does not become immediately due and payable upon the consummation of the proposed transfer. The acquiring entities or Pomona Farming, LLC will continue paying the annual installments of the annexation fees in accordance with the Annexation Agreements. The creditworthiness of the acquiring parties should not be at issue.

Section 10(b) was added to the Annexation Agreements to address concerns that Trinitas would annex its affiliates' lands to OID, then "flip" those lands for a profit and depart the Oakdale community. That is not what is happening. As explained above, Trinitas will effectively remain in the same position it has occupied since before the Annexation Agreements were executed and intends to continue as a part of the Oakdale farming community. The impending transaction is more akin to a refinancing than a sale; other than the identity of the primary capital source, nothing is changing "on the ground."

We therefore request that the OID board concur with our conclusion that the transaction described above does not trigger Section 10(b). In the event that OID believes Section 10(b) would be triggered by the proposed transaction, Trinitas respectfully requests that OID grant a waiver of the acceleration clause because of the substantial creditworthiness of the acquiring entities.

- (c) All such facilities shall remain in the ownership of either Landowner or the MWC. Landowner and the MWC shall be solely responsible for obtaining the easements and/or rights of way necessary to convey water to the Property. All such easements and rights of way shall remain in the ownership of Landowner or the MWC. District shall have the right to access, control and maintain the point of delivery, to install, integrate, operate and maintain connections between the District's SCADA system and the point of delivery, and to read the meter as necessary. Landowner agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend District from and against any and all damages or losses related to the District's access, control or maintenance of the point of delivery, and/or the reading of the meter, expect for any damages or losses caused by the District's negligence or willful misconduct.
- (d) Landowner and the MWC shall be solely responsible for the design, construction, maintenance and repair of its water distribution system located on the Property.
- (e) This Agreement supersedes and makes void all other existing written or oral agreements concerning the construction or maintenance by the District of facilities for the benefit of the Landowner or the Property, including but not limited to bridges, fences, ditches and other infrastructure.
- (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, the District shall have no obligation to deliver water to the MWC for the benefit of the Property unless and until Landowner and/or the MWC has complied with all of the actions identified in this Section 8.
- 9. DIVISION, PARCELING OR SUBDIVISION OF THE PROPERTY. All subdivision or division of the Property shall be subject to the District's "Subdivision Parcel Map Policy" as it may be amended from time to time. Additional points of delivery shall not be permitted unless expressly approved by the District in writing, which approval shall be subject to the District's sole discretion.

10. TRANSFER OF TITLE.

- (a) Prior to the sale, transfer, division or other change of ownership or identity of the Property, Landowner shall grant to the District surveyed and recorded deeds of rights of way, adequate for ingress and egress with workers and equipment on established roadways in order to perform all necessary inspection, monitoring and maintenance of District facilities. The District's obligation to continue to provide irrigation water shall be waived as to those parcels for which necessary or required deeded rights of way are not provided to the District.
- (b) Except as the result of inheritance, should Landowner sell or otherwise transfer ownership of the Property to an unaffiliated third party prior to the fifth anniversary of the date this Agreement is recorded in the Official Records of Stanislaus County, all annexation fees identified in Section 7(a) above associated with the portion of the Property transferred shall

immediately become due and payable, and payment must be made prior to the closing of the escrow for the Property transferred. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Landowner may request that the District waive the provisions of this Section 10(b) in connection with any proposed transfer with the applicable five year period. The District's consent to any such request shall not be unreasonably withheld and shall be based solely upon the District's assessment of the transferee's creditworthiness.

11. DISTRICT ACCESS TO PROPERTY

- (a) Landowner shall grant to the District, at no cost to the District, surveyed and recorded "Access Easements" adequate for ingress and egress with workers and equipment on established roadways in order for the District to perform all necessary and required inspection, monitoring and maintenance of District facilities, as well as required meter reading, as may be necessary and reasonable for the delivery of water for irrigation purposes to the Property hereunder.
- (b) Access Easements shall provide the District, its employees, vehicles, and contracts and agents, access to the Property perpetually and at all reasonable times.
- 12. RECORDATION OF AGREEMENT. This Agreement shall be recorded by the District in the Official Records of the County of Stanislaus immediately after the Executive Director of the Stanislaus County Local Agency Formation Commission certifies the annexation of the Property requested by Landowner and the modification of the District's Sphere Of Influence requested by District to encompass the Property.
- BINDING ON SUCCESSORS, HEIRS, GRANTEES, AND ASSIGNS. This Agreement, upon recording, shall inure to the benefit of, and be binding upon, the District, and all successors of the District, and all heirs, successors, grantees and assigns of the Landowner to all or any portion or subdivided parcel of the Property, who shall be deemed to agree and consent to the terms of this Agreement by acceptance of such title or interest in such lands or any part thereof, whether such interest be considered legal or equitable. It is the intent of the parties that this Agreement shall constitute a covenant, both as to the benefits and the burdens, running with the Property and shall be binding on Landowner and all successive owners of the Property, or any portion thereof, for the benefit of the District. The Landowner and the Landowner's successors, heirs, and assigns, shall further, by the act of acceptance of title, have constructive notice of all terms of this Agreement without necessity of showing actual notice of consent to said terms, or showing receipt of a copy of this Agreement. Such successors shall hereafter be estopped from relying upon or contesting the conditions of this Agreement as unlawful, counter to public policy, beyond the legal power or authority of District, or that they are unenforceable in whole or in part for any reason or cause. In the event there is more than one owner of the Property, the rights and obligations of such parties shall be (to the extent practical and permitted by law) apportioned among them in proportion to their interests (quantified in acreage equivalents) in their respective parcels. Any successor of Landowner shall be deemed to be a "Landowner" under the terms of this Agreement.
- 14. INDEMNITY. The District shall not be responsible for, and Landowner shall defend and indemnify the District and hold the District free and harmless from, all claims, damages,

PSP Investments is a Crown corporation which operates at arm's length from the Government of Canada. Its governance framework is outlined in the *Public Sector Pension Investment Board Act* and includes its mandate, the responsibilities of its Board of Directors and its accountability to the Government and to its contributors.

Mandate

PSP Investments' mandate is twofold:

Manage the funds transferred to it by the Government of Canada for the Public Service, the Canadian Armed Forces, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and the Reserve Force pension plans (the "Pension Plans") in the best interests of the contributors and beneficiaries.

Invest its assets with a view to achieving a maximum rate of return without undue risk of loss, having regard to the funding, policies and requirements of the Pension Plans and their ability to meet their financial obligations.

Duties and Responsibilities of our Board of Directors

PSP Investments's operations and activities are overseen by a Board of Directors composed of 11 members. The Board adopts, amends and repeals by-laws governing the conduct and management of PSP Investments' business and affairs and prescribes the duties and responsibilities for all facets of the administration and operations of PSP Investments. It is also responsible for the selection, appointment, performance evaluation and compensation of the President and CEO, who reports to the Board of Directors.

The Terms of Reference describing the respective duties and responsibilities of the Board, its committees and the Chair of the Board are approved by the Board and reviewed on a regular basis. The Terms of Reference can be found in the Board of Directors section of this website.

Accountability and Reporting

PSP Investments reports to the ministers responsible for the Pension Plans through its quarterly financial statements and annual report. The annual report must also be made available to contributors to the Pension Plans and is tabled in each House of Parliament by the President of the Treasury Board.

The President and CEO, and the Chair of the Board are required to meet once a year with advisory committees appointed to oversee the Pension Plans. PSP Investments is also required to hold an annual public meeting. In addition, we communicate on an ongoing basis with the Chief Actuary of Canada, Treasury Board officials and other Government of Canada officials in the execution of our statutory mandate.

Pursuant to the *Financial Administration Act* (FAA), PSP Investments must undergo a yearly external audit. The Auditor General of Canada and Deloitte LLP serve as our joint external auditors and are also responsible for conducting Special Examinations at least once every 10 years. The last Special Examination was performed in fiscal year 2011; its report is available in the News Room section of this website.

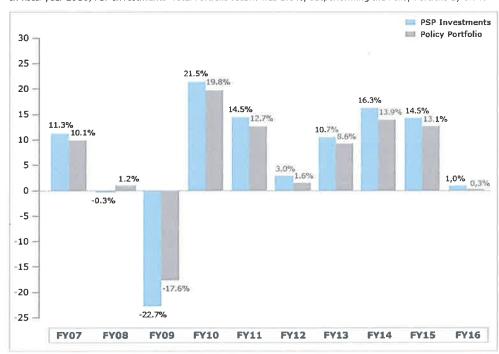

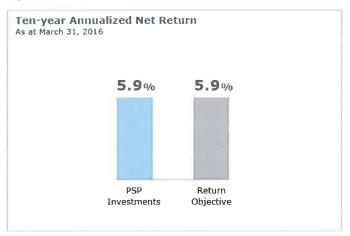
Annual Performance (as at March 31, 2016)

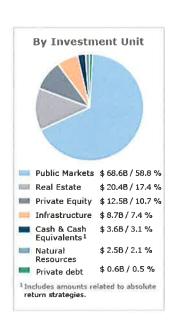

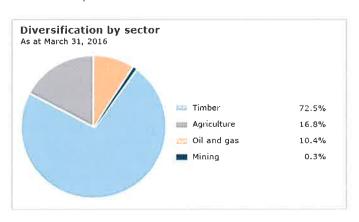
