ITEM NO. 9 REVIEW AND TAKE POSSIBLE ACTION ON FUNDING OF OJUSD FOR CONTINUED SUPPORT OF SALMON STUDIES PROGRAM

The Oakdale Irrigation District has supported the Fourth Grade Salmon Project for several years. This consisted of a project that connected the Fourth Grade class to the Stanislaus River by raising Chinook salmon from an egg to a fry before releasing the salmon into the river. Krista Smith, the Salmon Coordinator for Oakdale Joint Unified Salmon Studies heads up this project for the OJUSD. Ms. Smith has submitted a letter requesting the District's support in paying or the bussing costs for the 2016 Fourth Grade Salmon Project. Ms. Smith will be present at the Board Meeting and will give a PowerPoint presentation on the 2015 Salmon Project. Set forth below is a breakdown of the busing costs that the District has paid to support this project:

ITEM NO. 10 REVIEW AND TAKE POSSIBLE ACTION TO PROVIDE AND TRANSPORT CRUSHED ROCK FOR THE OJUSD SCHOOL FARM SITE

The Oakdale Joint Unified School District (OJUSD) owns a 26 acre parcel adjacent to Brady Road and is working towards developing 13 acres into an orchard and 13 acres into animal barns, a hoop barn, row crops, irrigated pasture, parking lot and a restroom facility. The site will enable FFA and 4-H members that do not currently have a facility to raise animals to do so along with a vast amount of agricultural related educational activities that go along with farming and raising animals. OID staff is actively engaged with the committees associated with this project. Currently the sub-committee is acquiring in-kind and cash donations with a goal to have the southern 13 acres developed into an almond orchard by the spring of 2017. A site meeting was conducted on April 6th to discuss breaking ground on the northern 13 acres commencing with Rivera & Son Earth Moving Co. donating time and equipment to start "roughing in" the access road, parking lot and pads for the barns. The access roads and parking lot need to be rocked so that access to the site can be year round

for construction and also for general access by school staff and participating students as the site develops. There has been discussions that a donation wall will be constructed recognizing all of those individuals and companies that were instrumental to the development of the school farm site, the exact location and design of the wall have not yet been determined.

Staff is requesting that the Board approve the donation of approximately 720 tons +/of ¾ crushed rock and the transportation of the rock to the site. The rock will be
graded by the dirt contractor noted above while he is on site. It is estimated that the
rock and trucking will cost approximately \$22,000.00, final costs will be determined
upon delivery to the site. This donation is an unbudgeted item for the community
outreach program.

ITEM NO. 11

REVIEW AND TAKE POSSIBLE ACTION TO EXECUTE WORK RELEASE NO. 014 TO PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT 2009-PSA-002 WITH CH2M FOR A DESKTOP REVIEW OF BIOLOGICAL RESOURCES AND SITE VISITS FOR THE 2016 ONE-YEAR PILOT ON-FARM CONSERVATION PROGRAM

Up to 3,000 acres in the Oakdale Irrigation District (OID) may be voluntarily idled during the 2016 irrigation season as part of the One Year Pilot On-Farm Conservation Program. During the CEQA review period, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) submitted comments which expressed concern over a number of special-status species that have the potential to occur in the project area. These species, their special-species status, and habitat requirements are outlined in Table 1 of the attached Assessment Plan (AP).

To comply with State and Federal laws, applicants intending to idle land and subsequently implement on-farm improvement projects would be screened, and those

applicants with lands that have a potential for special-status species to occur, according to a CNDDB review, cursory wetlands review, and critical habitat mapping, would progress to the screening process. Following the initial screening, a pedestrian survey would be conducted by a qualified biologist to further eliminate applicants with potential to adversely impact special-status species. Three initial screening criteria would be implemented including:

- Potential elimination of or Avoidance and Minimization Measures of any project that directly or indirectly impacts wetlands or vernal pools
- Potential elimination of or Avoidance and Minimization Measures of any project that may impact anadromous waterways or result in any take of listed fish species
- Potential elimination of or Avoidance and Minimization Measures of any project that would impact known critical habitat or listed species

In addition to the screening process, project-related impacts to the special-status species with even a minor potential to occur within the Project area would be minimized through the implementation of Avoidance and Minimization Measures. Table 2 in the attached AP summarizes survey requirements, avoidance buffers, and work windows for each species.

Staff recommends that the Board authorize the General Manager to execute the Work Release No. 014 for Professional Services Agreement 2009-PSA-002 for a desktop review of biological resources and site visits for the 2016 On-Farm Conservation Program.

Director Webb requested that this item be tabled until the next meeting due to the fact that there are a few questions that need to be answered.

ITEM NO. 12 REVIEW AND TAKE POSSIBLE ACTION TO AMEND THE OAKDALE IRRIGATION ORGANIZATIONAL CHART TO ADD A WATER UTILITIES TECHNICIAN

The OID Water Utilities Technician position was on OID's Organizational Chart as recently as 2013, but had been vacant for several years prior to that and was removed as a result. Based on the current technical needs within the department, management is recommending that this position be reestablished. While this position is unbudgeted in 2016, the Water Utilities Supervisor will be retiring on July 7th. Given management does not anticipate filling the Water Utilities Supervisor positon in the immediate future and the position is anticipated to be filled by in-house staff, there will be a net savings in workforce expenses to the District over the remainder of the year.

The proposed Water Utilities Technician position and job description has been revised to reflect the current wages, expectations and requirements. These revisions were minor and mainly included only incidental updates for physical activity durations

and general responsibilities for the position as well as standard wage increases that have occurred since 2013 according to union negotiations.

Staff recommends amending OID's Organizational Chart to add a Water Utilities Technician Position.

DISCUSSION ITEMS ITEM NOS. 13, 14

ITEM NO. 13 <u>DISCUSSION / UPDATE ON</u> IN-DISTRICT ALLOCATIONS FOR FRINGE PARCELS

Fringe parcels are properties in which only a portion of the total parcel acreage lies within the boundaries of OID's service area. The original boundaries of the OID are thought to have initially been established generally based on the contour and the only means of irrigation at the time was by gravity flow. With modern irrigation practices and pressurized irrigation systems, lands outside and above this contour are now able to be irrigated. An analysis of all fringe parcels was completed in 2011 to address this issue around OID's service area and at the December 20, 2011 Board Meeting, the Oakdale Irrigation District (OID) Board of Directors moved to provide a one-time opportunity for annexation of several groups of these fringe parcels. Those that were not provided the option of annexation, or those who chose not to move forward with the option of annexation by the October 1, 2012 deadline, were notified that they would be provided the volume of water for the in-district acreage each irrigation season determined to be reasonable for their specific crop. Once that crop allocation had been reached, the turnout would be locked shut and an Out of District Service Agreement would be required before any additional deliveries were made.

As further development along OID's boundaries occurs, the number of fringe parcels continues to increase along with the questions of the process used to determine the maximum allocation for the in-district acreage of these fringe parcels. definition of a reasonable in-district allocation for each crop has been, and is proposed to continue to be, based on a minimum 70% irrigation efficiency. The expectation to maintain a minimum 70% irrigation efficiency is consistent with OID's Annexation Policy and OID's Out of District Service Agreement. This irrigation season, crop specific demand will be in accordance with the "normal year" crop evapotranspiration (ET) values between March and October from the new ET tables created for OID's service area. The values in these tables were determined by satellite imagery calibrated with data from the Oakdale CIMIS station as part of the water balance from OID's 2015 Agricultural Water Management Plan. The table of "normal year" Monthly ET by Crop in OID's Service Area has been attached for reference. OID staff proposes to continue to enforce maximum allocation to all fringe parcels using this process and these parameters unless directed otherwise by the Board of Directors.

Director Webb suggested that staff start working on formulating a Policy for Fringe Parcels and bring it back to the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS ITEM NO. 15

A. **GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT**

Safety Activities

- 1. OID has gone 423 days without a lost time injury accident.
- 2. Robin Flynt, ACWA-JPIA presented OID with a Rate Stabilization Fund check for OID's reduced property losses in 2015. Much of this is due to both Eric Thorburn and Jason Jones oversight and management that garnered those reductions in losses.

Administration Activities

- 1. The Oakdale Chamber of Commerce Ag Scholarship luncheon, of which OID is a sponsor, was a well-attended success.
- 2. Numerous meetings with DWR, CFW have occurred with staff regarding the On Farm Program.
- 3. GM attended and supported the FFA Cake Auction on March 22nd. All proceeds were merrily consumed by staff the next day.
- 4. OE3 meet and confer on health insurance scheduled for April 7th.

5. Stanislaus County Farm Bureau's Annual Membership meeting is April 14th. See Lori for reservations.

Legal Activities

- 1. ID 52: ID52 Plaintiffs sued OID over ownership issue of facilities used to serve their parcels. Plaintiffs lost in Superior Court. OID has filed suit to recoup its attorney's fees. Waiting for hearing date to be set by the court.
- Curtailment Case involving the SJTA and State Water Board: OID and SSJID water rights curtailed in 2015. SJTA, of which both district are members, filed for writ of mandate on the action. Trial date is in abeyance until the BBID/WSD case is settled.
- 3. SJTA has filed as an interested party in the BBID/WSID Curtailment Case. Testimony began and an non-suit motion has been submitted by BBID/WSD counsels. Motion is under consideration.
- 4. OID is one of a number of agencies filing a test claims case against the State of California's issuance of unfunded mandates, i.e. SBx7-7. The matter was heard on February 5th. The judge's ruling came in last week against the agencies. The group is evaluating next steps. CSDA is one of the agencies supporting the groups' action.
- 5. A CEQA suit was filed by parties claiming injury if OID's On-Farm Conservation Funding Program Pilot Project is allowed to be implemented. A case management conference is scheduled for August 13.

Construction Activities

- 1. C&M crews and equipment are currently working on maintenance activities and JSF's completed by Water Dept. staff.
- Assisting Water Ops./Eng. Dept. with various tasks and field review of potential projects.
- Conducting Safety Coordinator tasks pertaining to all hands training, Safety Committee meetings and review of weekly tailgate safety meetings. Conducted the employee orientation for the new DSO/C&M Worker on 4/13 and annual Respirator Fit Test Training on 4/14.
- 4. Conducting Contract Administration tasks pertaining to contracts that need to be renewed and work releases that need to be completed with the assistance of Lori.
- 5. Conducting misc. landowner meetings in regards to capital projects and maintenance issues.
- 6. Out of District Turnouts With the water being pulled from the South Main Canal last week, C&M was able to install one additional out of District turnout on the South Main Canal.
- 7. Members of the School Farm subcommittee, OID staff and OJUSD staff conducted a site visit on 4/6 to review and discuss the start of the development of the upper 13 acres of the parcel.

Water Operations Activities

- 1. Continued to process Encroachment and Ag Discharge Agreements and continued field inspection during installation of the associated facilities.
- Staff continued to prepare and process several deferred conditions of approval agreements, encroachment agreements and easements in accordance to OID's

- requirements for continued irrigation on recently completed lot line adjustments and parcel split projects.
- 3. The ACOE draft easement documents for the proposed tunnel as well as the 2 Mile Bar access road continue to be reviewed by ACOE staff.
- 4. 2016 OFWCP estimates were finalized and agreements have been distributed to nearly all applicants. Fully executed agreements have started to be returned.
- 5. Staff attended the East SJ GW Basin Association and Workgroup meetings on April 13th. Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP) data collection and modeling options were discussed. Groundwater Sustainability Agency (GSA) discussions amongst those with overlapping boundaries continued independently from the group.
- 6. Working with Davids Engineering to select appropriate fields and contacting landowners for permission to temporarily stage ETAW stations for the 2016 ETAW monitoring and measurement program in OID's service area.
- 7. The Oakdale CIMIS station has been relocated and is actively reporting data. Information from the site is available to the public online at www.cimis.water.ca.gov/.
- 8. OID's comments on the City of Oakdale's draft out of boundary service agreement with OID on behalf of ID 41 is under review by City of Oakdale staff.

Ag Water

- 1. SCADA integration and commissioning of new SCADA sites continued.
- 2. Josh Soares, one of the two recently hired DSOs, started on April 12th.
- 3. Water deliveries came to a halt after the storm hit on April 8th. DSOs that were scheduled to work were provided the option to assist with C&M duties.
- 4. With the storm near the end of the first rotation, the second rotation was delayed 3 days to start on or about April 17th. This second rotation will be a 14-day rotation and is anticipated to be followed by another 14-day rotation starting on or about May 1st.

Water Utilities

- 1. Improvement District No. 41:
 - Pumping Station No. 3 remains out of service due to high turbidity issues.
- 2. Domestic Water Pumping Stations:
 - WUD continues to conduct weekly inspection, servicing, and security checks of the pumping stations. There was nothing unusual or out of the ordinary to report.
 - Monthly Coliform Bacteria samples were taken on Monday April 4th. No problems were detected.
- 3. Domestic Water Systems:
 - ➤ All water systems are operating without restrictions.
 - Continued bi-annual fire hydrant inspections and flushing.
 - > Continued bi-annual street valve inspections and exercising.
 - Conducted inspections of all well head seals and began replacing them as needed.
- 4. On-Call Activities:
 - There have been no call outs to report.

- 5. Knights Ferry Pumping Station:
 - a. The KFWTP is de-energized at this time. Surface water is being provided and treated until further notice.
- 6. Irrigation Pumping Stations:
 - The Moulton Reclamation Pump was locked out for C&M repairs.
 - WUD has been performing weekly routine inspection, servicing and security checks on the irrigation pumping stations. There was nothing unusual or out of the ordinary to report.

Finance Activities

1. Testing was done on Wednesday, April 13, 2016 for the Account Clerk position.







DON PEDRO RELICENSING SETTLEMENT GROUP

AGREEMENT TO PROTECT CONFIDENTIALITY OF COMMUNICATIONS IN SETTLEMENT NEGOTIATIONS RELATED TO FERC LICENSING OF DON PEDRO AND/OR LA GRANGE HYDROELECTRIC PROJECTS ON THE TUOLUMNE RIVER

1. Purpose. The Don Pedro Relicensing Settlement Group is undertaking negotiations in order to resolve disputes related to conservation measures in response to applications filed under Federal Power Act Part I for licensing the Don Pedro and/or La Grange Hydroelectric Projects on the Tuolumne River. The purpose of this Confidentiality Agreement is to ensure that communications made by Participants during the Settlement Process are confidential to the maximum extent permitted by Applicable Law or as appropriate under agency policy.

2. **Acronyms and Definitions**.

- 2.1. **"Applicable Law"** means any statute, agency rule or policy, or other legal or regulatory authority applicable to the information or activities covered by this Confidentiality Agreement.
- 2.2. "Don Pedro Relicensing Settlement Group" means Participants as a whole.
- 2.3. **"Facilitator"** means a neutral person retained for the express purpose of assisting the Participants in reaching a Don Pedro Relicensing Settlement Term Sheet and/or Settlement Agreement.
- 2.4. "Federal Power Act Part I" means 16 U.S.C. §§ 791 et seq.
- 2.5. **"FERC"** means the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.
- 2.6. **"FERC Licensing Proceeding"** means a licensing proceeding under Federal Power Act Part I.
- 2.7. "Notice" means a written form of communication by a Participant to another Participant specifically concerning duties and obligations identified in this Confidentiality Agreement. Each Participant may only choose one designated person, and by extension one e-mail address, to receive Notices on its behalf concerning the performance of the obligations under this Confidentiality Agreement. All Notices shall be effective upon electronic receipt by the Participant's designee. It is incumbent upon each Participant to have a designee for receiving Notices, and to notify the other Participants if there is a change in its designee and/or the designee's email address.

- 2.8. "Participant" means an entity that (A) supports the stated purpose of the Settlement Process and elects to participate in this process and (B) signs this Confidentiality Agreement.
- 2.9. **"Policy Group"** means the group created in accordance with and pursuant to the Don Pedro Relicensing Group's "Process Document for Negotiations of Term Sheet and Settlement Agreement for the FERC Licensing of New Don Pedro and/or La Grange Hydroelectric Projects on the Tuolumne River."
- 2.10. **"Project"** means either the Don Pedro Hydroelectric Project (FERC P-2299) or the La Grange Hydroelectric Project (FERC P-14581), depending on the context.
- 2.11. **"Projects"** means both the Don Pedro Hydroelectric Project (FERC P-2299) and the La Grange Hydroelectric Project (FERC P-14581).
- 2.12. **"Public Agency Participant"** means a public agency that is participating in the Settlement Process.
- 2.13. **"Representative"** means an individual authorized to represent a Participant in the Settlement Process. This term includes any officer, director, manager or other employee, consultant, agent, or successor and assign, who receives or has access to Settlement Communications.
- 2.14. "Settlement Communication(s)" means any oral or written communications between Participants in this Settlement Process. The term excludes:
 - A. Any document that the Settlement Group consents to file in a regulatory, judicial or legislative forum, or otherwise discloses in the public domain;
 - B. Any document or information that a Participant prepares from sources other than a Settlement Communication, and which that Participant discloses, or consents to have disclosed, in the public domain;
 - C. Any document or information that a Participant files in a FERC Licensing Proceeding or in any regulatory, judicial, or legislative forum related to either Project pursuant to Section 4 or that a Participant otherwise issues pursuant to statutory authority, provided that such filing or issuance is not based on unauthorized disclosure of a Settlement Communication by another Participant;

- D. Any document or information prepared by a non-Participant, provided that such document or information is not based on an unauthorized disclosure of a Settlement Communication;
- E. Any record or information a Public Agency Participant determines it is required to disclose by Applicable Law or as appropriate under agency policy, including but not limited to the Freedom of Information Act, California Public Records Act, or San Francisco's Sunshine Ordinance (San Francisco Administrative Code Section §67.24(a)(2)) and implementing rules and policies; and
- F. Scientific or technical data or analyses (e.g., empirical facts, scientific observations, measurements, statistics, model runs, and the like).
- 2.15. "Settlement Process" means the communications between the Participants for the purpose of developing a Don Pedro Relicensing Settlement Term Sheet or Settlement Agreement.
- 2.16. "Don Pedro Relicensing Settlement Agreement" or "Settlement Agreement" means a settlement which the Participants negotiate and sign to propose conservation measures for inclusion in any Project license which may be issued under the Federal Power Act Part I.
- 2.17. "Don Pedro Relicensing Settlement Term Sheet" or "Term Sheet" means a document that the Participants negotiate and sign, as the non-binding basis for the subsequent development of the Settlement Agreement.
- 3. <u>Confidentiality</u>. During the Settlement Process and thereafter, the Participants agree that Settlement Communications shall be confidential, and shall not be admissible as evidence, argument, or admission in any forum, to the maximum extent provided by Applicable Law.
 - 3.1. <u>Marking</u>. Each Participant shall make best efforts to label its written communications made in the Settlement Process as follows: "Confidential and Privileged For Settlement Purposes Only." However, such a document shall be a Settlement Communication if it meets the definition of Settlement Communication even if not so labeled.
 - 3.2. <u>Use of Settlement Communications</u>. Participants shall use Settlement Communications only for the purpose stated in Section 1. Representatives may distribute Settlement Communications within the Participant they represent,

and specifically may distribute such communications to members or other entities whom the Participant represents in this Settlement Process, including consultants retained by the Participant; *provided* that:

- A. each recipient is notified that Settlement Communications are confidential, and
- B. each such recipient preserves the confidentiality of Settlement Communications pursuant to this Confidentiality Agreement. Participants shall not disclose such communications to other persons or entities, except as provided in Section 3.3.
- 3.3. <u>Mandatory Disclosure</u>. Consistent with Section 2.14(E) and notwithstanding Section 3.2, a Public Agency Participant that determines (in its discretion or in response to a court order) that disclosure of Settlement Communications is required by Applicable Law or appropriate under agency policy shall provide to the Don Pedro Relicensing Settlement Group:
 - A. Notice of its intent to disclose such Settlement Communications, prior to such disclosure. Such Notice shall be provided seven (7) days prior to such disclosure, to the extent practical.
 - B. Notice of actual disclosure, within seven (7) days of that event. The Public Agency Participant shall use an index or other reasonable method so that other Participants may identify the disclosed documents or information.
- 3.4. <u>Permissive Disclosure to Third Party</u>. A Participant may disclose Settlement Communications to a third party for the purpose of facilitating the resolution of specific issues, securing support for the final Settlement Agreement, or otherwise enhancing the approvability or durability of that agreement; *provided* that:
 - A. the Participant notifies the Settlement Group in writing of its intent to disclose specified Settlement Communications at least seven (7) days in advance of such disclosure, and no other Participant objects to such disclosure; and
 - B. the third party signs this Confidentiality Agreement and submits it to the Facilitator, or complies with an alternative procedure established by the Settlement Group for that third party, before any disclosure.
- 3.5. <u>Proffer of Settlement Communications</u>. A Participant who is involved in a regulatory or adjudicatory proceeding shall oppose the offer of Settlement Communications (whether by another Participant or third party) in such

- proceeding, or the admission of such communications into such proceeding to the maximum extent such protection is provided by Applicable Law.
- 3.6. Communications with Media or Third Parties. In communications with the media or other third parties, a Participant may state its interests and acknowledge its participation in the Settlement Process, but it shall not disclose Settlement Communications except as provided by this Confidentiality Agreement. A Participant shall not characterize any other Participant's interests or positions in the Settlement Process. Participants and the Facilitator may also pro-actively communicate with the media as agreed to by the Settlement Group.
- 4. <u>Continued Participation in FERC Licensing and Related Proceedings</u>. This Confidentiality Agreement does not affect any Participant's rights, obligations, and authorities to file documents or otherwise participate in the FERC Licensing Proceeding or other proceedings before any regulatory, judicial, or legislative forum related to either Project, or otherwise to meet statutory obligations. In such proceedings, a Participant shall not disclose Settlement Communications except as provided by this Confidentiality Agreement, or as otherwise agreed to by an affected Participant.
- 5. <u>Nature and Scope of Obligations</u>. This Confidentiality Agreement is an agreement between Participants to protect the confidentiality of Settlement Communications.
 - 5.1. This Confidentiality Agreement shall be binding on each Participant, including its Representatives, and the Facilitator.
 - 5.2. The Confidentiality Agreement is not a contract and does not establish a contractual relationship, by implication or estoppel, between the Participants. It does not create an independent right of action. It does not oblige the Participants to take any action (other than protection of the confidentiality of Settlement Communications), and specifically, does not oblige any Participant to participate in the Settlement Process or enter into the Term Sheet or Settlement Agreement.
 - 5.3. The Confidentiality Agreement does not predetermine or control the substantive content of any Term Sheet or Settlement Agreement.
- 6. **No Third Party Beneficiary**. This Confidentiality Agreement does not establish any third-party beneficiary.
- 7. **Remedies.** This Confidentiality Agreement establishes specific remedies for disclosure of Settlement Communications.
 - 7.1. In the event that a Participant breaches the duty to protect the confidentiality of Settlement Communications, any Participant who may be injured by such breach

will notify the Policy Group. If, in the Policy Group's sole discretion, the Policy Group confirms such breach, the Policy Group will notify the breaching Participant (A) that it may not participate in the Settlement Process, or (B) that the representatives who caused the breach may not participate, as acceptable to the injured Participant.

- 7.2. As a result of such breach, any Participant may withdraw from the Settlement Process as provided in Section 10.1.
- 7.3. All Participants will cooperate to prevent the unauthorized use of Settlement Communications in any regulatory, judicial, or legislative forum, or otherwise in the public domain, and may disclose this Confidentiality Agreement as appropriate for that purpose.
- 7.4. The Participants expressly reserve all authorities, rights, obligations, remedies and defenses that arise under Applicable Law in the event of disclosure of Settlement Communications. This agreement does not create an independent right of action.
- 8. <u>Amendment</u>. An amendment of this Confidentiality Agreement, including any waiver of any term, shall take effect if executed in writing by the authorized Representatives of the Participants.
- 9. <u>Term.</u> This Confidentiality Agreement shall be effective when signed by the authorized Representatives below. It shall remain in effect for the duration of the Settlement Process, or until terminated as provided in Section 10.2. Certain obligations shall survive withdrawal or termination, as provided in Section 10.3.

10. Termination and Withdrawal.

BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:

In 2009 the Board of Directors approved entering into a Professional Services Agreement with FISHBIO Environmental, LLC for the implementation of the Honolulu Bar Floodplain Enhancement Project on the Stanislaus River. The projects intent was to increase the spawning area for Chinook Salmon and Central Valley Steelhead in the lower Stanislaus River through restoration of floodplain and side-channel habitat along approximately one mile of River at Honolulu Bar.

OID's involvement in the project was specifically related to the Approved Final Mitigation Plan for the construction of the North Side Regulating Reservoir for which OID was mitigating for 0.6 acres of jurisdictional waters at a ratio of 4:1 (2.4 acres). FISHBIO was a federal grant recipient for implementing the project, which OID committed to participating in Phase II - Pre-project Monitoring, Construction and Re-Vegetation and Phase III - Post Project Monitoring and Evaluation of Success. OID, FISHBIO and other regulatory agencies worked in conjunction to complete Phase II in 2012. The final budget for Phase II and Phase III was contingent upon the final design plans that were being developed during Phase I. The final design plan required monitoring of the success of the physical design and of re-vegetation for a period of ten years (2022), the previous estimates only extended through 2015. FISHBIO will continue to monitor the re-vegetation and physical design and report to the Army Corps of Engineers in 2016, 2018, 2020 and 2022 as required by the mitigation and monitoring plan as outlined in the attachment to the Amendment for an estimated cost of \$147,537.12.

Staff recommends that the Board authorize the General Manager to execute Amendment No. 02 for revised hourly rate schedule and updated estimated costs for Phase III of the Honolulu Bar Floodplain Enhancement Project and associated Amendments until Project completion.

Re: Estimated Cost of Honolulu Bar Monitoring 2016-2022

Dear Ms. Cook:

The Mitigation and Monitoring Plan for the Honolulu Bar Floodplain Enhancement Project required monitoring of the success of the physical design and of re-vegetation for a period of ten years following construction. Construction was completed in 2012, and previous estimates of project costs extended only through 2015. At your request we have developed the following scope of work for the remainder of the required monitoring period (2016-2022).

Irrigation Management and Maintenance

Due to persistent drought conditions following project construction, we have needed to continue providing irrigation to the re-vegetated areas beyond what was initially scoped. Irrigation is necessary in 2016 to support the plantings, and it is unclear if irrigation will be required in 2017. As a contingency, we have included the possibility of needing to provide irrigation in 2017 in our estimated costs. Maintenance and repair of the irrigation system are expected on a regular basis, incurring minor costs for most repairs. Irrigation and maintenance of the irrigation system will continue to be provided by FISHBIO.

Re-vegetation Maintenance

River Partners will continue to spot spray and provide mechanical weed treatment (with expanded footprint to include treatment of crowding invasives within channel) four times annually from 2016-2018 and 2 times annually from 2019 to 2022.

Monitoring and Reporting:

Monitoring of re-vegetation success will continue to be conducted by River Partners. Monitoring will include determining absolute coverage of woody and herbaceous vegetation (2016, 2018, 2020, and 2022), photo point monitoring (twice annually), and quarterly site inspections (all years).

Monitoring of the physical design of the project will be continue to be conducted by FISHBIO. Monitoring will include determining frequency, depth, and duration of inundation of the side channel and floodplain; transect and longitudinal profile surveys to document channel stability within the side channel and floodplain; and sediment characterization throughout the Project Area as necessary during the monitoring period to document channel stability.

A photographic record of the site at permanent photo stations will be kept through the end of the monitoring period to provide comprehensive assessment of the progress of floodplain restoration and revegetation efforts. Additional photographs of natural recruitment, disturbance, or special conditions will be taken as needed.

Reports of the re-vegation and physical design monitoring results will be submitted to the Army Corps of Engineers in 2016, 2018, 2020, and 2022 as required by the mitigation and monitoring plan. In addition to the re-vegetation and physical design monitoring results, relevant data collected as part of on-going fisheries monitoring conducted by FISHBIO for Tri-Dam will be included in the annual reports.

The total estimated cost for continued monitoring of the Honolulu Bar Project during 2016-2022 is \$147,537.12. A table of total cost by activity is provided below. Current rate schedules for River Partners and FISHBIO are enclosed as Attachment A and Attachment B, respectively.

SUBJECT: REVIEW AND TAKE POSSIBLE ACTION TO REVISE THE MISCELLANEOUS RATES AND CHARGES FOR SPECIAL SERVICES

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Board Discretion

BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:

On July 2, 2014 the CH2M's (CH2M Hill) Comprehensive Miscellaneous Rates and Charges Study was approved by the Board. The State of California Water Code, Section 22283, provides that the District prescribe reasonable rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of Section 22280 et seq.

The District provides many special services for individual or prospective customers. Because these services do not benefit all of the customers of the District, the possibilities of inequitable service exist. These costs are recovered through and by way of charges related to the services provided. The Miscellaneous Rates and Charges Model was developed to perform the calculations and document the level of effort and costs associated with each charge.

Recently, the Water Committee was asked by several in-district landowners to revisit these charges. Subsequently, the Water Committee recommended that these rates and fees be re-visited by the entire Board.

Options:

- 1. Rates remain as previously adopted.
- 2. Continue to update the rates January 1st of each year. There would be In-District versus Out-of-District rates as follows:
 - a. In-District landowner rates would be at 50% of the labor component plus 100% of any direct costs.
 - b. Out-of-District landowner rates would be at 100% of the rates.
 - c. Some rates will not be subject to the 50% reduction. Refer to page 3 on the attached Miscellaneous Rates & Charges Schedule for clarification.

If Option 2 is selected, a new Resolution will be brought back for board approval.

FISCAL IMPACT: Based off of 2015 revenues - \$37K reduction

2016 TEMPORARY WATER TRANSFER AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN OAKDALE IRRIGATION DISTRICT/SOUTH SAN JOAQUIN IRRIGATION DISTRICT AND STOCKTON EAST WATER DISTRICT

This Agreement is entered into this 10th day of May 2016, by Oakdale Irrigation District ("OID"), South San Joaquin Irrigation District ("SSJID") (collectively "Districts") and Stockton East Water District ("Purchaser"). The Districts and Purchaser are collectively referred to hereafter as "parties."

The parties agree as follows:

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Districts are operating under and by virtue of Division 11 of the California Water Code; and

WHEREAS, Purchaser supplies irrigation, municipal and industrial (M&I) and domestic water to portions of eastern San Joaquin County from a combination of surface and groundwater sources; and

WHEREAS, Purchaser has a contract with the Department of the Interior's Bureau of Reclamation ("Reclamation") to be supplied with water from the Stanislaus River utilizing the Goodwin Dam Intake Facility and other facilities owned by the Purchaser; and

WHEREAS, Purchaser has been informed that its water supply for 2016 from Reclamation will be insufficient for Purchaser's needs and Purchaser desires to purchase water from Districts to make up for such insufficient supply; and

WHEREAS, Districts are the owners of certain water rights to the waters of the Stanislaus River, including pre-1914 appropriative water rights; and

WHEREAS, due to ongoing conservation practices and improvements in facilities by the Districts, the water to be sold to the Purchaser by this Agreement, ("Agreement-Water" or "water") is surplus to the current needs of the landowners and water users of the District in accordance with California Water Code section 22259; and

WHEREAS, the quantity and quality of groundwater within lands underlying the Purchaser and in some parts of Districts is threatened from over-drafting of groundwater in areas of San Joaquin County, including some areas within Purchaser's boundaries and without the sale of the water to Purchaser under this Agreement, water users within Purchaser's boundaries will have to use more groundwater; and

WHEREAS, by this Agreement, the parties intend to facilitate a sale of conserved water during 2016 by Districts to Purchaser,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Districts and Purchaser, on the terms and conditions herein set forth, agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

- 1. **TERM:** This Agreement shall commence upon the Effective Date and shall terminate on August 31, 2016.
- 2. **QUANTITY:** Districts will sell and deliver 10,000 acre-feet of water to Purchaser of which up to 5,000 acre-feet may be used by Purchaser for irrigation purposes
- 3. **PURCHASE PRICE:** The Purchase Price for the Agreement-Water is \$200 an acre-foot for M&I water and \$100 an acre-foot for irrigation water Purchaser shall make an initial payment of \$1,500,000 on or before June 1, 2016. Should Purchaser use less than 5,000 acre-feet for irrigation, Purchaser shall make payment to Districts of any additional amount owing by September 30, 2016.
- 4. **BENEFICIAL USE OF WATER BY PURCHASER:** Districts will sell and make Agreement-Water available to Purchaser for reasonable and beneficial uses within its boundaries in the quantities described and subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The Purchaser shall be solely responsible for putting the Agreement-Water to beneficial use.
- 5. **WATER QUALITY:** Districts make no warranty or representation as to the quality or fitness for use of Agreement-Water sold and delivered to Purchaser.
- 6. <u>COMMENCEMENT OF DELIVERY AND DELIVERY SCHEDULE</u>: Purchaser may begin taking water when this Agreement has been signed by both parties and a copy delivered to both parties and when Purchaser and District have agreed on a delivery schedule to be attached to this Agreement as Exhibit A. The delivery schedule shall include the monthly amount to be delivered for M&I and irrigation purposes. Should there be any modification to the purpose of use of the water resulting in an additional amount owing to Districts, Purchaser shall provide Districts with the modified delivery schedule and any resulting amount owing in accordance with Section 3 of this Agreement.
- 7. WATER DELIVERY AND MEASUREMENT: Agreement-Water will be delivered or otherwise made available to Purchaser for diversion at the Goodwin Intake Facility during the term of this Agreement. Diversions shall not exceed 100 cubic feet per second without Districts' prior approval. Tri-Dam Project personnel will determine the water measurements using the measuring device installed on the Goodwin Tunnel and such other means as are customarily used by them to measure water taken by Purchaser through the Goodwin Tunnel. No water may be diverted after August 31, 2016.

- 8. <u>NO RESALE</u>: The Agreement-Water is being sold to Purchaser for M&I and irrigation use within its boundaries. Purchaser will not resell Agreement-Water without the prior written consent of Districts, which approval may be withheld in Districts' sole and unlimited discretion.
- 9. **NOTICES:** All notices that are required, either expressly or by implication, to be given by any party to the other under this Agreement shall be delivered or mailed, United States first-class postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

Notice shall be deemed given (a) two calendar days following mailing via regular or certified mail, return receipt requested, (b) one business day after deposit with any one-day delivery service assuring "next day" delivery, (c) upon actual receipt of notice, or (d) upon transmission, if by facsimile, whichever is earlier. The parties shall promptly give written notice to each other of any change of address, and mailing or shipment to the addresses stated herein shall be deemed sufficient unless written notification of a change of address has been received.

10. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT:** This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties, and supersedes any oral agreement, statement or promise relating to the subject matter of the Agreement. No other agreement, statement, or promise made to any party, or to any employee, officer, or agent of a party to this Agreement, or to any other person, that is not in writing and signed by all parties to this Agreement shall be binding upon them. Any amendment, including oral modifications, must be reduced to writing and signed by all parties to be effective.

- 11. **COOPERATION:** To the extent reasonably required, each party to this Agreement shall, in good faith, cooperate and assist each of the other parties in meeting such requirements of federal and/or state law and such requirements of regulatory agencies as may be applicable to performance of any terms of the Agreement. Should there be any lawsuit or regulatory challenge filed concerning any aspect of this Agreement, either party may terminate this Agreement and Purchaser shall pay Districts for water it diverted at the contract price before termination of the Agreement. Should the parties decide not to terminate the Agreement but defend against the action, the parties agree to cooperate in the defense and to equally share the attorneys' fees and costs incurred in defending the legal challenge.
- 12. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** The effective date of this Agreement shall be the date first above written which shall be the date this Agreement is signed by both parties, or if signed on different dates, the latter of the two dates.

AGREEMENT FOR DIVISION OF RESPONSIBILITY AND PAYMENT

This Agreement is made on May ____, 2016, by and between Oakdale Irrigation District ("OID") and South San Joaquin Irrigation District ("SSJID").

OID and SSJID agree as follows

- 1. OID and SSJID are parties to the "Agreement for Release of Water by and among the Oakdale Irrigation District, the South San Joaquin Irrigation District, the San Luis and Delta Mendota Water Authority and the California Department of Water Resources dated April 8, 2016" ("Release Agreement"). OID and SSJID each agreed to release ½ of the 65,000 acre-feet to be released in accordance with the Release Agreement. Such water was released during the 2016 April May pulse flow period. Each is entitled to receive compensation at the rate set forth in the Release Agreement for its portion of the 65,000 acre-feet and each is responsible for billing and collecting the sum due it.
- 2. OID released an additional 10,000 acre-feet during the April May 2016 pulse flow period. OID is entitled to compensation for that water in excess of the 65,000 acre-feet, according to the terms of the Release Agreement and is solely responsible for billing and collecting sums due it for such portion.
- 3. OID and SSJID anticipate entering into a water transfer agreement with Stockton East Water District ("SEWD") for 10,000 acre-feet of water to be made available during the 2016 water year ("SEWD Agreement"). OID and SSJID agree that SSJID will be solely responsible for making the 10,000 feet of water available to SEWD and for billing and collecting the sums due it in accordance with the SEWD Agreement.
- 4. Each Party understands that both water Agreements referred to above are stated in the manner of joint responsibility. It is the purpose of this agreement to allocate that responsibility between the Parties as indicated. In that regard, where each Party has assumed sole responsibility and therefore benefit under either Agreement or part thereof, each Party agrees to hold the other Party harmless for issues arising from the performance of that responsibility.

Therefore, the parties enter into this Agreement the date set forth in the first paragraph above.

This agenda item was presented to the Board on April 19, 2016 for approval of a donation of approximately 720 tons +/- of ¾ crushed rock and transportation of the rock to the site. The estimated cost for the rock and transportation was approximately \$22,000. Staff was directed to check with local contractors to get donations or lower prices for the rock and bring it back to the Board. 
After extensive conversations with the rock quarry and multiple trucking companies asking for donations to assist OID with the donation request, George Reed, Inc. has reduced the per ton price for the ¾ crushed rock from \$17 to \$10.75/ton and GCU Trucking has also reduced their rate to haul the rock to the site with double bottom dumps. It is estimated that the rock and trucking will cost approximately \$12,500.00, final costs will be determined upon delivery to the site. This donation is an unbudgeted item for the community outreach program.

CRUSHED ROCK FOR THE OJUSD SCHOOL FARM SITE

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Board Discretion

BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:

The Oakdale Joint Unified School District (OJUSD) owns a 26 acre parcel adjacent to Brady Road and is working towards developing 13 acres into an orchard and 13 acres into animal barns, a hoop barn, row crops, irrigated pasture, parking lot and a restroom facility. The site will enable FFA and 4-H members that do not currently have a facility to raise animals to do so along with a vast amount of agricultural related educational activities that go along with farming and raising animals. OID staff is actively engaged with the committees associated with this project. Currently the sub-committee is acquiring in-kind and cash donations with a goal to have the southern 13 acres developed into an almond orchard by the spring of 2017. A site meeting was conducted on April 6th to discuss breaking ground on the northern 13 acres commencing with Rivera & Son Earth Moving Co. donating time and equipment to start "roughing in" the access road, parking lot and pads for the barns. The access roads and parking lot need to be rocked so that access to the site can be year round for construction and also for general access by school staff and participating students as the site develops. There has been discussions that a donation wall will be constructed recognizing all of those individuals and companies that were instrumental to the development of the school farm site, the exact location and design of the wall have not yet been determined.

Staff is requesting that the Board approve the donation of approximately 720 tons +/- of ¾ crushed rock and the transportation of the rock to the site. The rock will be graded by the dirt contractor noted above while he is on site. It is estimated that the rock and trucking will cost approximately \$22,000.00, final costs will be determined upon delivery to the site. This donation is an unbudgeted item for the community outreach program.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT JUNE 7, 2016

Safety Activities

1. OID has gone 489 days without a lost time injury accident.

Administration Activities

- 1. On May 11th, at the FFA Awards Banquet, OID was honored with a presentation of the FFA Degree for its efforts in supporting the FFA Program over the years. OID is the "first" agency to have been presented such an honor since the program began back in 1934.
- 2. City of Oakdale and OID Board members (Webb, Altieri) met to discuss "common interests." At the June 21st Board meeting staff will present an overview of those discussions and make recommendations on how our agencies can work together to reduce costs.
- 3. April 28th GM spoke to the Oakdale Realtors Association.
- 4. ACWA Convention June 3-5. Attended numerous sessions and meetings on the following;
 - An afternoon seminar; Protecting Your Board Meetings from Chaos,
 - An afternoon meeting of the State Water Management Committee,
 - Bureau of Reclamation meeting on basin and state water management issues with regional and DC staff,
 - Breakfast meeting with two of Westlands Water District Board members,
 - Meeting with State settlement negotiators and TID, MID and CCSF GM's and legal representatives.
- 5. Met with Sacramento Valley and SJ River water agencies and POTW's with diversion rights to rivers on May 18th to discuss settlement options over the State Water Resource Control Board's release of the their WQCP.

Legal Activities

- 1. ID 52: ID52 Plaintiffs sued OID over ownership issue of facilities used to serve their parcels. Plaintiffs lost in Superior Court. OID has filed suit to recoup its attorney's fees. Waiting for hearing date to be set by the court.
- 2. The BBID/WSID Curtailment Case was dismissed last week by the State Water Resource Control Board.
- 3. OID is one of a number of agencies filing a test claims case against the State of California's issuance of unfunded mandates, i.e. SBx7-7. The group is evaluating next steps after having a negative ruling by the court. CSDA is one of the agencies supporting the groups' action.
- 4. A CEQA suit was filed by parties claiming injury if OID's On-Farm Conservation Funding Program Pilot Project is allowed to be implemented. OID successfully defeated a TRO action by the Plaintiffs, OGA, Louis Brichetto and Bob Frobose, however after receiving a favorable Tentative Ruling on the Preliminary Injunction proceeding the court reversed its decision and granted in favor of Plaintiffs. The OID will be looking at options in today's closed session on this matter.

Construction Activities

- 1. C&M crews and equipment are currently working on maintenance activities and JSF's completed by Water Dept. staff.
- 2. Assisting Water Ops./Eng. Dept. with various tasks and field review of potential projects.

- 3. Conducting Safety Coordinator tasks pertaining to all hands training, Safety Committee meetings and review of weekly tailgate safety meetings. Started to conduct CPR/First Aid/AED training to OID staff.
- 4. Conducting Contract Administration tasks pertaining to contracts that need to be renewed and work releases that need to be completed with the assistance of Lori.
- 5. Conducting misc. landowner meetings in regards to capital projects and maintenance issues.
- 6. OID Pest Dept. continues to conduct magnacide applications to OID facilities to reduce aquatic growth issues.
- 7. School Farm Subcommittee met on 4/27 to discuss scheduling the start of the orchard development and donation request flyers. Next meeting scheduled for June 8th.

Water Operations Activities

- 1. Continued to process Encroachment and Ag Discharge Agreements and continued field inspection during installation of the associated facilities.
- 2. Staff continued to prepare and process several deferred conditions of approval agreements, encroachment agreements and easements in accordance to OID's requirements for continued irrigation on recently completed lot line adjustments and parcel split projects.
- 3. All work on the On-Farm Conservation Program came to a halt after notice of the preliminary injunction. All previously contracted participants were notified of such on May 24th and 25th.
- Comments from the ACOE were received on the draft easement documents for the proposed tunnel as well as the 2-Mile Bar access road. Staff will review and respond.
- 5. Fields appropriate for ET monitoring stations within various crops were selected. The associated landowners were contacted to request permission to temporarily stage ETAW stations for the 2016 ETAW monitoring and measurement program in OID's service area. Several contracts were executed and multiple stations have been installed and are actively collecting data.
- 6. A response to OID's comments on the City of Oakdale's draft out of boundary service agreement with OID on behalf of ID 41 was received. Staff will review and respond.

Ag Water

- 1. SCADA integration and commissioning of the new Tulloch Pipeline measurement sites was completed. Installation of a new SCADA tower on the southeast side of the District will begin soon to allow these new sites along with several others in the area to be integrated into OID's existing SCADA system.
- 2. The first round of tracking water deliveries for volumetric billing up to May 31st was completed and forwarded to the Finance Department.
- 3. Staff met with Rubicon on May 5th to discuss future TCC expansion areas, logistics and schedule in case OID's grant application is successful. Awards are scheduled to be announced in June 2016.
- 4. The fifth rotation started on or about May 27th. This is a 12-day rotation and is anticipated to be followed by another 12-day rotation starting on or about June 8th.

Water Utilities

- 1. In-house interviews were held for the Water Utilities Technician. Joe Buila, previously OID's Water Utilities Serviceman, was awarded the position. Congratulations Joe.
- 2. Improvement District No. 41:
 - Pumping Station No. 3 remains out of service due to high turbidity issues.
- 3. Domestic Water Pumping Stations:
 - Monthly Coliform Bacteria samples were taken on Monday May 2nd. No problems were detected.
- 4. Domestic Water Systems:
 - > All water systems are operating without restrictions.
 - Performed quarterly blow-off valve exercising.
 - > Continued testing of all backflow devices in accordance with OID's Cross Connection Control Policy.
 - Conducted inspections of all well head seals and continued replacing them as needed.
- 5. Rural Water System No. 1:
 - Placed (1) system air vent on Poppy Hills Drive out of operation for repairs.
- 6. On-Call Activities:
 - Called out to activate the Knights Ferry Pump Station on May 29th. See below for details.
- 7. Knights Ferry Pumping Station:
 - On May 29th the Knights Ferry Pump Station was placed back into operation due to the lack of surface water reaching the treatment plant.
- 8. Irrigation Pumping Stations:
 - WUD has been performing weekly routine inspection, servicing and security checks on the irrigation pumping stations. There was nothing unusual or out of the ordinary to report.
