PUBLIC COMMENT ITEM NO. 1

Tom Orvis of the Stanislaus County Farm Bureau reminded everyone that one week from Friday on December 16, 2016, the Oakdale Irrigation District and the South San Joaquin Irrigation District will be giving their presentation at the Stockton Memorial Civic Auditorium on the draft SED. He encouraged each and every person to attend.

Ken Kraus stated that he did not feel that his question was properly answered at the last Board Meeting.

Robert Frobose requested that Item No. 2 be pulled from the Consent Calendar for public comment. He also commented on General Manager's performance evaluation for 2016. Director Webb asked that the record reflect the following comment: Mr. Frobose has an active court case against this District and he does not agree with his assessment of the General Manager.

ITEM NO. 2

APPROVE THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF NOVEMBER 1, 2016 AND RESOLUTION NOS. 2016-64, 2016-65, 2016-66, AND 2016-67

Director Santos stated that she had challenged the timeline at the last Board meeting that was reflected in the Minutes of November 1, 2016 under Item No. 9 because she felt that it was not complete and requested that the Minutes be corrected. Director Santos requested that the following statement be reflected in the Minutes of today's meeting regarding her comments for the Minutes of November 1, 2016:

The request I made to correct the Minutes of November 1st have not been made. As I stated that timeline the General Manager included in the staff report is not accurate. I requested it to be removed or corrected with the complete and factual timeline. The staff board agenda report is merely

background information to the benefit of assisting the decision making process. The vote the Board takes is not a vote as to the information in the staff board report, it is only a vote reflecting the item number. In this instance it is Action Calendar Item No. 9 which states, "Review and Take Possible Action to Reject Any and All Claims Filed by Participants of the On-Farm Conservation Program and to Authorize General Counsel and the General Manager to Settle All Pending and Future Damage Claims." This is what the Board voted on, nothing more. The Board did not vote on the timeline from staff and it should not be presented as such in the minutes. As to the ancillary note on the bottom of the page, I did not create this conflict. Three Board members sued Gail Altieri and myself because we told the Court what our OID Minutes reflected. We told the Court the truth and that truth is in OID's Minutes. All five Board members are involved in this lawsuit. Director Altieri and Director Santos are defendants: Directors Doornenbal, Osmundson and Webb are the plaintiffs. Using Mr. Silva's analogy for me to recuse myself because I am a defendant in the lawsuit should also apply to every Board member sitting here. We are all involved in the lawsuit. Therefore, we are all in conflict according to Mr. Silva. Not one of us should be able to discuss or vote on this item according to your legal advice. Mr. Silva, you seem to be rendering your legal advice and I would like to know, are you advising us as our counsel or as plaintiffs' counsel. Judge Freeland said that there was no conflict of interest for Director Altieri and I. Judge Freeland is a higher authority and Judge Freeland heard all of the facts and evidence presented by you on behalf of OID against Director Altieri and myself. After extensive deliberation by Judge Freeland he determined that sufficient grounds do not exist to impose the Board, or the broad preliminary injunction. Regarding conflict, Judge Freeland stated, utterly unpersuasive. He went on to state you can't prevent the exercise of a public office in a lawful manner by the person in possession of that office. Technically, he dissolved the restraining order and refused to issue a stronger exclusion known as a preliminary injunction. Mr. Silva, I think you are really the one that has a You are giving legal advice to your serious conflict of interest here. opponent's clients, isn't that a serious conflict of interest, maybe criminal? I insist the Minutes be corrected to reflect the complete and factual account of this Board.

Director Webb stated that he wanted it noted in the Minutes that Mr. Frobose has a lawsuit against the Oakdale Irrigation District.

ITEM NO.17 REVIEW AND TAKE POSSIBLE ACTION TO ADOPT THE 2017 BUDGET

Staff presented the draft 2017 Budget and Organizational Chart at the Board's November 16, 2016 meeting as a Discussion Item. No changes were recommended by Board members at the meeting. Staff requested any clarification issues that may arise from the Board between November 16, 2016 meeting and Friday, December 2, 2016 to contact staff for assistance. No Board member has requested any clarification issues on the budget.

We are pleased to present this draft 2017 Annual Budget, as proposed by the District's Finance Committee, the Board, and Management, for your approval. Budget development is a year-long process. It begins with tracking expenses on a real-time basis and comparing budget to actual expenditures over the course of the budget year.

Each Manager reviews and submits their respective budgets for manpower, materials, equipment, and proposed capital projects and purchases. There are five (5) sections to the budget:

This budget projection is based on the implementation of the Water Resource Plan. A Plan that was developed with public input over a 2-year period to meet the long-term goals identified below:

- Long-term protection of Water Rights
 - o Curtailments, CCWD, BOR/88 Agrmt., Public Trust, SWB Regs., ESA
- Address Federal, State, Local Water Challenges
 - o D-1641, WQCP (40% unimpaired flows), WaterFix, SGMA, droughts
- Rebuild/modernization of an out-of-date system
 - o \$3 million in life cycle replacements and \$3 million in modernization
- · Develop affordable ways to finance improvements
 - \$168 million of costs to achieve goals by 2030
 - Funding from 67 TAF of Conservation water: 50 TAF in water sales, 17 TAF to SOI

Through implementation of the Water Resources Plan and adhering to the financial framework developed OID has been able to achieve the following benefits for its constituents:

- 1. OID continues to operate as a very lean organization generating a long term operational cost escalation of less than 3% annually.
- 2. 10 years ago it took 290,000 acre feet to meet OID water needs. Today it takes 240,000 acre feet. That conservation of water was generated through investments in infrastructure and modernization.
- 3. OID has spent \$55 million dollars in that infrastructure and modernization improvements since 2006.
- 4. Those efficiency improvements were paid for by water sale revenues of surplus water and not water rate increases. OID water rates would be \$100 per acre annually https://doi.org/10.15-2006/) if landowners had to carry those improvement costs.
- 5. Surface water delivery efficiency improvements has allowed OID to reduce its' reliance on its groundwater wells by 27% since the early 2000's. Last year OID pumped just 3,500 acre feet.
- 6. The strength and benefits of OID's conservation efforts manifested itself over the last 4-years of drought. OID delivered the most water of any irrigation district in the Central Valley to its farmers.
- 7. Yes, water rates were raised last year but for the first time since 1990. A 26 year run of leaving money in our constituents' pockets. OID rates are one of the lowest in the area.
- 8. OID is pro-ag and is the only irrigation district that has expanded its service area lands to the tune of 10,000 acres.

- 9. OID's efficiency improvements have strengthened our senior water rights by improving water delivery efficiencies and thereby allowing our farmers to better manage water on-farm and be more efficient as well. Poor efficiencies are a risk to water rights and OID is reducing that risk.
- 10. OID will have \$56 million (est.) in cash and in designated reserve funds at the end of 2016. A 300% improvement from where it was in 2002, despite 8 years of the worst economic recession on record.

It is through the fiscal management and investments, as outlined in the Water Resources Plan, that has placed OID in the position it is today. That fiscal strength will allow OID to replace a failing South Main Canal section downstream of Two-Mile Bar with a new tunnel at a cost of \$16-\$20 million and it will pay cash for that project. It is that same fiscal strength that will allow OID to pay off its \$26 million in bond debt by 2022/23, making OID debt free.

It is these accomplishments and the anticipation of doing more for OID water users that staff presents this budget for the Board's approval.

Public comment was made by Robert Frobose regarding this item.

Director Webb stated that Mr. Frobrose has an ongoing lawsuit against the District, an ongoing litigation against the District's On-Farm Program, and he did not agree with him on his assessment of the General Manager and his assessment of the \$1.5.

A motion was made by Director Doornenbal, seconded by Director Altieri, and unanimously supported to adopt the 2017 Budget.

1. OID has gone 43 days without a lost time injury accident.

Administration Activities

- 1. Continuing to develop and prepare comments to the Water Quality Control Plan (Unimpaired Flow Standard) from the State Water Resources Control Board.
 - a. Hearing dates Dec. 16^{th} , 19^{th} and 20^{th} in Stockton, Merced and Modesto, respectively.

- b. Reclamation will be seeking a 120 day extension of the comment period.
- 2. Settlement discussions on the Stanislaus River and other SJ River tributaries continues to creep forward.
- 3. OE3 labor negotiations continues. OID provided a draft tentative proposal to OE3. OE3 to take to their members on December 6th.
- 4. Still waiting for City of Oakdale's response on an Action Plan OID sent over.
- 5. OID and SSJID GMs and Counsels will be in D.C. the week of December 5th.
- 6. Chamber of Commerce's Ag Luncheon planning begins December 13th.
- 7. Timeline of interest for OID concerning recall petition benchmark dates:
 - a. December 28th Deadline by Registrar of Voters Office to certify results of signature verification on Recall Petition.
 - b. January 3rd If results of signature verification are confirmed Board will need to take action to adopt a resolution at its January 3rd meeting calling for a special election for the Oakdale Irrigation District.
 - c. Per Elections Code Section 11240, the next available election date would be May 2, 2017.

Legal Activities

- OID/SSJID vs the State Water Resources Control Board; this case is over the legal ability of the SWRCB to issue curtailment orders over senior water right holders, as was done in 2015. Court date anticipated to be set for next summer.
- 2. OID/SSJID as intervenors in the CalSPA v. SWRCB regarding the legality of the SWB's use of Emergency Change Petitions issued to the BOR in managing the State's water resources. A trial date is set for Alameda County Court on August 7, 2017.
- 3. OGA/Brichetto/Frobose vs. OID:
 - a. Trial set for January 18th
- 4. OID vs Directors Santos and Altieri.
 - a. The case is moving forward.
- 5. Redistricting Process
 - a. Process to begin after first of the year. Board presentation in February and Hearing in late February with Board adoption in March.
 - b. Regulatory compliance is 180 days preceding the election (May 11th)

Construction Activities

- 1. C&M crews and equipment operators continue to progress on capital projects and maintenance work.
- 2. Assisting Water Ops./Eng. Dept. with various tasks.
- 3. Conducting Safety Coordinator tasks as needed.
- 4. Conducting Contract Administration tasks as needed.
- 5. C&M Worker Three candidates have been selected and have signed the offer letters. Currently conducted medical and background checks.
- 6. Two Mile Bar Tunnel Project Notice Inviting Bids was published in the Oakdale Leader on 11/30 and an email was sent to prospective bidders who have shown interest in the Two Mile Bar Tunnel Project. Contract and Tech Specifications, GBR and Project Drawings are available for review on OID's website. A mandatory Pre-Bid meeting and site visit is scheduled for 12/15. Bids are due on 1/5 and will be presented to the BOD for award of bid on 1/18 with a recommendation from staff. Start of construction is

- anticipated to be between 2/15 and 4/1 and will be determined based on the contractors schedule. Substantial completion date for the Project is 12/31/2018.
- 7. Received two new DSO trucks, two Kobelco 210 excavators and one Kobelco 140 excavator previously approved for purchase by the BOD.
- 8. ACWA/JPIA will be conducting a training day at OID on 12/14 at the request of the Safety Coordinator. The classes are Asbestos Cement Pipe Safety, Field Ergonomics and Fall Protection.

Water Operations Activities Engineering

- 1. Continued to process Encroachment and Ag Discharge Agreements and conduct field inspections during installation of the associated facilities.
- 2. Staff continued to work with landowners requesting deferred conditions of approval agreements, encroachment agreements and easements in accordance to OID's requirements for continued irrigation on recently completed lot line adjustments and parcel split projects.
- 3. ET monitoring stations installed as part of the 2016 ETAW monitoring and measurement program collected data through the end of October. The Tule ET stations may remain in the field to collect additional data for the full year of the contract period (+/- May 2016) pending permission and an updated contract with the associated landowners.
- **4.** The monthly ESJGBA work group meeting was held on November 9th. Discussion of the draft JPA/MOU agreement discussions continued. The draft GSP BMPs were also presented and discussed.
- 5. Staff completed draft mapping of OID's proposed GSA boundaries in the ESJ GW Basin and forwarded to SSJID, Calaveras County Water District and Stanislaus County for review of the line work in adjoining areas. The required GSA hearing, resolution and final filing is anticipated to be completed during the first few months of the year to allow for each election being proposed to meet or proceed the June 2017 DWR review, 90-day posting and approval deadline.
- **6.** The final draft MOU to proceed with formation of the STRGBA GSA was presented with a draft public hearing and notice schedule at the November 10th meeting. The final draft is anticipated to be brought before each agency's governing board during the month of January for final approval before filing a GSA formation application with DWR.
- 7. A request for data from OID as well as from the STRGBA was rec'd by Stan. Co.'s consultant in support of the County's draft PEIR GW model development. Staff was able to compile the requested data for submittal during the last week of November.
- 8. Staff is working on draft Annexation Agreements for final approval by the board. Unfortunately little progress has been made to date given the engineering department is temporarily shorthanded and the high priority of finalization of OID engineering plans, GSA formation efforts and permits for private winter construction and development projects.
- **9.** Pertinent factors and options for the Board of Director Divisions Redistricting Project will be brought back for consideration by the Board and subsequent staff direction no later than January to ensure completion prior to the next general election.
- 10. City staff continued to address a series of questions on the draft City of Oakdale Out of Boundary Service Agreement with OID on behalf of ID 41. Once these questions have been answered the agreement will be provided to the ID 41 membership for approval to proceed.

- **11.**Weekly meetings continued with Condor staff to proceed with the South Main Canal Segment 4 design along with the finalization of the Two Mile Bar Tunnel Project bid documents.
- **12.**A preconstruction meeting was held with ACOE staff at the Two Mile Bar Recreation Area near the upstream portal of the proposed tunnel project. The ACOE's concerns were mainly associated with maintaining public access and the condition of the facilities during the project. These concerns were noted and incorporated into the bid documents as necessary.
- **13.**A field assessment of the South Main Canal Segment 4 Project area was conducted along with Condor staff and the Support Services and Contracts Manager to proceed with development of a recommendation for improvements to address and prevent further deterioration and stabilization issues.
- **14.** Staff continued the surveying, design, cost estimates, landowner meetings and drafting of plans for 2016/17 winter work projects.
- **15.** Static groundwater level readings for both the Modesto sub-basin and the northern Stanislaus County triangle were uploaded to CASGEM reporting system.

Ag Water

- 1. The final round of volumetric water delivery tracking closed on October 31st. Staff is working to respond and address all questions received in the last few weeks.
- 2. The public comment period on the Prop. 1 grant funding draft awards list closed on September 14th. The final awards list is anticipated to be posted before the end of the year.
- 3. Interviews to fill a vacant DSO/C&M position were completed the week of November 7th. An offer was provided and accepted by one of the applicants. The pre-employment screening process is now underway.
- 4. Staff has progressed with updates and slight modifications to the Storm tracking software mainly based on customer and DSO feedback to continue to improve functionality and effective utilization of the software.

Water Utilities

- 1. Improvement District No. 41:
 - Pumping Station No. 3 remains out of service due to high turbidity issues.
- 2. Domestic Water Pumping Stations:
 - All Domestic Water Pumping Stations that are in service are operational.
- 3. Domestic Water Systems:
 - > All water systems are operating without restrictions.
 - > Performed quarterly blow-off valve exercising.
 - > Performed Air Relief Valve exercising.
 - > WUD has continued to test all backflow devices in accordance with our Cross Connection Control Policy.
 - > Conducted inspections of all well head seals and continuing to replace them as needed.
- 4. On-Call Activities:
 - There are zero calls to report.
- 6. Knights Ferry Pumping Station:
 - The Knights Ferry Pumps are activated. The river pumps are providing water to the treatment plant.

7. Irrigation Pumping Stations:

- All OID Ag pumps are operational.
- Staff continued to perform inspections on all winter drain pumps that are in operation for the winter. There was nothing unusual or out of the ordinary to report.
- Static groundwater level readings were collected during the first week of November.

C. DIRECTORS' COMMENTS/SUGGESTIONS

Director Altieri

Director Altieri stated that she had three comments/suggestions:

- 1. At the Knights Ferry Christmas Dinner on December 1st a number of people had questions and concerns regarding the OID letter regarding fringe parcels. Director Altieri suggested that they bring their questions/concerns to the Board and speak in public comment.
- 2. Director Altieri would like the Board to re-evaluate the Wednesday evening meeting. The Board voted on June 21st to move the meeting from a Tuesday evening to a Wednesday meeting to accommodate the Oakdale Leader. Mr. Paloma has only attended two to three of these meetings. Having a Wednesday evening meeting with a Thursday morning Tri-Dam meeting in Manteca every other month is inconvenient to some of us. She would like them returned to Tuesday night.
- 3. Some members of our audience suggested that at the end of our General Manager's report that there be a cheat sheet with the acronyms spelled out that are commonly used in the General Manager's Report.

Director Osmundson

Director Osmundson stated that another three weeks have gone by and his offer to meet with the people suing the District and one of our newest Board members has still not happened. You complain about somebody suing and in a roundabout way those people suing the District are responsible for all of the other lawsuits that go with it so why can't we meet like grown-ups and resolve this without lawyers and move on.

Director Doornenbal

Director Doornenbal asked if Gail wants to go back to Tuesday morning. Director Altieri responded no, she wants it to be Tuesday evening.

General Counsel Fred Silva

Attorney Silva wished to make a couple of comments. Attorney Silva wanted to remind the Board that the allegation of the Damrell Law Firm having a conflict was turned over to an independent law firm that specializes in attorney conflicts and they analyzed the allegations. They provided this Board with an opinion letter stating that there is no conflict in his representation of this Board or the Damrell Law Firm. He wanted to remind the constituents that issue has been addressed and resolved although it keeps coming up. The second issue that he commented on was Director Santos' comment that in the case where Directors Altieri and Santos are defendants that Directors Webb, Osmundson and Doornenbal are the plaintiffs; that is incorrect. The plaintiff in that case is the Oakdale Irrigation District. There is not a single case that the Oakdale Irrigation District has filed that Directors Webb, Doornenbal and Osmundson are the actual plaintiffs so that is not a conflict.

Director Webb

Director Webb stated that it has been a good year for the District even though some people try to keep the dark cloud over the District. We have tried to help our constituents, we have had a good water year, we have had a good hydro year. We have plenty of support out there because he received phone calls from his constituents stating this. They support everything that the District is doing and they appreciate the General Manager. We are doing a great job and the staff is doing a great job. The Board has been under a tremendous amount of pressure this year from outside and he wished for a better rapport with the Modesto Bee next year. He wished everybody a Merry Christmas; keep the Christmas spirit and maybe we can all return in a little better mood on January 1st.

Director Santos

Director Santos responded to Director Osmundson's comment stating that his actions speak louder than his words and his actions in the Boardroom when you voted to continue the suit against Gail and I after a Judge had ruled in our favor, speaks volumes. If we are so apart on our positions that you would think that it was appropriate to continue with lawsuit even after we had been through a court process and it rendered a decision that was in our favor, it is hard to think that just talking is going to achieve anything, since litigation seems to be the rule of thumb with the District.

Director Santos discussed the letter from the law firm in San Francisco and appreciated what he has done. When she received the letter she realized that he had only submitted with the letter OID's side. Director Santos stated that their declarations had not been filed with the Court as of the date of the letter. Attorney Silva stated that is not correct there were two letters sent and they had access to the entire file both times. Director Santos stated that she had not seen the second letter. Attorney Silva will forward her a copy of the letter.

Director Santos stated that it has been an interesting year. She had never been a Board member before and she attended nine months prior to running for office. She felt that it was her civic duty and it has been a challenge. Director Santos stated that she has respect for her other Board members and staff. She stated that OID is a great entity and everybody works very hard. General Manager Steve Knell is a very smart man; he is very

well versed in the water world. She stated that she wished that things were more open and transparent and that it were easier to access the information that the public has a right to. She stated that if the District continues to have five independent thinkers on the Board there are going to be disagreements and discussions is a good thing because it exposes our individual positions. Director Santos stated that she is very proud of the District. She wished everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year and another year is coming. Director Santos reminded everyone to attend the hearing on draft SED.





Condor Earth Technologies has updated the Final Design, Plans and Specifications, Engineer's Opinion of Probable Costs, Geotechnical Baseline Report and Contracts Documents for the Two Mile Bar Tunnel Project working through Amendment No. 01 to Work Release No. 009. Due to the amount of comments provided by OID staff, the need for additional sub-consultant survey services, unanticipated modifications to the Drawings including the downstream canal plug ramp and outlet pipe details and additional time spent by senior staff to update the Engineers Opinion of Probable Construction Costs and Contract Documents, and the amount of time to respond to bidders questions including issuing addendum's to date, Tasks 1 thru 4 have gone over budget resulting in a need for additional funds to complete Task 5, Contractor Bidding Support (in progress).

Amendment No. 02 will provide addition funds to complete Task 5 of which potentially includes an additional site visit of the Project site, a site visit to review the core samples obtained during the exploration drilling, response to additional bidders questions and issuance of addendums as needed.

Condor Earth (Condor) appreciates the interest of Oakdale Irrigation District (OID) in having us continue to assist you with the Two-Mile Bar Tunnel Project. SUBJECT: DISCUSSION REGARDING A POTENTIAL REVISION TO THE FRINGE PARCELS WATER ALLOCATION POLICY

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

The Fringe Parcels Water Allocation Policy (Policy) was adopted on August 2, 2016 to provide guidelines to staff in making water deliveries to fringe parcels. Fringe parcels are properties of which only a portion lies inside the boundaries of OID's Service Area. The Policy provides all fringe parcels with an allocation for the applicable crop type on the in-district acreage according to the "normal year" crop evapotranspiration in OID's Service Area with a minimum irrigation efficiency of 70% from March 1st to October 31st. Once the annual irrigation season allocation to the property has been reached, no additional water deliveries are permitted to occur for the remainder of the irrigation season without an approved and fully executed Agreement Establishing the Terms and Conditions for Irrigation of Lands Outside Oakdale Irrigation District Boundaries.

After being notified of the new Policy, several fringe parcel landowners provided feedback on what staff believes to be an oversight of the Policy as drafted. In circumstances where only, or up to only, the total acreage inside OID's boundaries is being irrigated there's no exemption. While the Policy was intended based on direction from the Board to address the unauthorized water use on fringe parcel acreage outside OID's boundaries, the Policy as currently drafted treats all fringe parcels the same regardless of whether water applications are very similar to that of a non-fringe parcel. The following are believed to be circumstances in which an exemption from the Policy's allocation has merit:

- 1. Only the in-district acreage is being irrigated; or,
- 2. The total acreage being irrigated does not exceed the total in-district acreage of the parcel.

If this exemption were to be incorporated into the Policy, those fringe parcels falling under the exemption would remain exempt unless and until the surface water application area of the parcel changed at which point the Policy's allocation would be enforced. A draft revised Fringe Parcels Water Allocation Policy is attached for review and discussion. Pending further direction from the Board, staff would anticipate bringing the revised Policy back for consideration of approval at the second meeting in January.

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Draft revised Fringe Parcels Water Allocation Policy

Fringe Parcels Water Allocation Policy

Revised January 18, 2017 by Resolution No. 2017-

Introduction

Fringe parcels are properties in which only a portion of the total parcel acreage lies within the boundaries of OID's service area. The original boundaries of the Oakdale Irrigation District (OID) are thought to have initially been established generally based on the contour as the only means of irrigation at the time was by gravity flow. With modern irrigation practices and pressurized irrigation systems, lands outside and above this contour are now able to be irrigated. An analysis of all fringe parcels was completed in 2011 to address this issue around OID's service area and at the December 20, 2011 Board Meeting, the OID Board of Directors moved to provide a one-time opportunity for annexation of several groups of these fringe parcels. Those that were not provided the option of annexation, or those who chose not to move forward with the option of annexation by the October 1, 2012 deadline, were notified that they would be provided the volume of water for the in-district acreage each irrigation season determined to be reasonable for their specific crop. Once that crop allocation for the in-district acreage had been reached, the turnout would be locked shut and an out-of-district service agreement would be required before any additional deliveries were made.

As further development along OID's boundaries occurs, the number of fringe parcels continues to increase along with questions associated with the process of determining the maximum allocation for the in-district acreage of these fringe parcels. The intent of this policy is to provide clarification of the procedures in providing water to fringe parcels and the basis for determining the fringe parcels in-district allocation.

Guiding Principles

The guiding principles presented below are intended to illustrate the basis for which this policy was developed. The guiding principles are as follows:

- 1. Board direction on December 20, 2011 for any and all fringe parcels having lands both in and out of the OID Service Area was to provide the volume of water each irrigation season determined to be reasonable for their specific crop on their in-district acreage.
- 2. The expectation to maintain a minimum 70% irrigation efficiency is consistent with OID's Annexation Policy and OID's Agreement Establishing the Terms and Conditions for Irrigation of Lands Outside Oakdale Irrigation District Boundaries.
- 3. Crop specific demand will be in accordance with the "normal year" crop evapotranspiration (ET) values. These values were determined by satellite imagery calibrated with data from the Oakdale CIMIS station as part of the water balance from OID's 2015 Agricultural Water Management Plan.

Surface Water Delivery Procedures for Fringe Parcels

The following procedures will be taken to provide water to Fringe Parcels:

1. A maximum allocation for all fringe parcel acreage inside OID's boundaries will be provided each irrigation season for the applicable crop type according to the "Normal Year" Crop Evapotranspiration in OID's Service Area at a minimum of 70% irrigation efficiency. Regardless of when the irrigation season actually starts or ends, the allocation for in-district acreage of fringe parcels will be calculated based on a March 1st start date and October 31st end date. Refer to Table 1 below.

- 2. The fringe parcel in-district allocation for any crops that aren't listed in Table 1 shall not exceed 64 inches.
- 3. In years when a Water Allocation Program is implemented in accordance with OID's Surface Water Shortage Policy, the in-district allocation to fringe parcels will be consistent with the applicable in-district allocation put into effect for the rest of the district.
- 4. Once the fringe parcel in-district allocation has been reached, regardless of where the water was actually applied on the parcel, water deliveries will be terminated for the remainder of the irrigation season. Additional water will only be provided with an approved and fully executed Agreement Establishing the Terms and Conditions for Irrigation of Lands Outside Oakdale Irrigation District Boundaries. The same means and methods for volumetric measurement of in-district water deliveries from the existing delivery point will be permitted to continue to be utilized for out-of-district water deliveries to fringe parcels.

Exemptions to the Fringe Parcels Water Allocation:

The intent of this policy is to address the unauthorized water use on fringe parcel acreage outside OID's boundaries. In circumstances where only, or up to only, the total acreage inside OID's boundaries is being irrigated an exemption to the allocation would be provided. The following are circumstances in which an exemption to the fringe parcels water allocation will be provided:

- 1. Only the in-district acreage is being irrigated; or,
- 2. The total acreage being irrigated does not exceed the total in-district acreage of the parcel.

Those fringe parcel's falling under this exemption would remain exempt each year unless and until the application area of surface water on the parcel changed at which point the fringe parcels water allocation would be enforced.

Surface Water Allocation for Fringe Parcels

The following table specifies the maximum allocation for all Fringe Parcel acreage inside OID's boundaries according to crop type:

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

In September of 2014, Governor Edmund G. Brown signed the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act of 2014 ("SGMA") into law, which changed the landscape of groundwater management in California. SGMA is a comprehensive three bill package that sets the framework for statewide sustainable groundwater management by local agencies. SGMA requires, among other items, the formation of GSAs and the preparation of Groundwater Sustainability Plans ("GSP") with a focus on long-term sustainability. Formation of a GSA must occur no later than June 30, 2017 and development and adoption of a GSP must be adopted no later than January 31, 2022 for high and medium priority basins not currently in critical overdraft.

The Modesto Subbasin, within which all OID lands south of the Stanislaus River lie, is designated as a high-priority basin. SGMA authorizes a local agency—or a combination of local agencies—overlying a groundwater basin to form a GSA. Multi-agency GSAs can be formed through either a Memorandum of Understanding or other legal agreement.

The Stanislaus and Tuolumne Rivers Groundwater Basin Association ("STRGBA") member agencies are all local agencies, pursuant to SGMA's definition. The STRGBA member agencies include the cities of Oakdale, Riverbank, Modesto, and Waterford, Stanislaus County, Oakdale Irrigation District, and Modesto Irrigation District. Since its inception in 1994, STRGBA has provided a forum for local agencies to work cooperatively to provide for coordinated planning in the pursuit of effective and sustainable management of the groundwater resources within the Modesto Subbasin. The STRGBA member agencies believe that the sustainable management of the Basin pursuant to SGMA may best be achieved through the cooperation of the Member Agencies operating through the GSA MOU. OID staff's direction to pursue this option for OID's service area lying within the Modesto Subbasin was provided through action taken by the Board on November 2nd.

SGMA requires formal procedures be followed in order to become a GSA. First, each of the local agencies electing to be a GSA must hold a noticed public hearing to receive public comment on the local agency's decision to become the GSA for the groundwater subbasin. At the conclusion of this public hearing, it is anticipated that the governing board for each local agency will authorize the execution of the MOU and adopt the attached resolution forming the GSA for the Basin. The attached draft MOU forming the STRGBA GSA is being provided today for review and discussion prior to the public hearing at the January 18th meeting and potential adoption immediately thereafter.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FORMING THE STANISLAUS AND TUOLUMNE RIVERS GROUNDWATER BASIN ASSOCIATION GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY AGENCY

- 1. PARTIES. The Parties to this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) are: the County of Stanislaus, a political subdivision of the State of California; the Oakdale Irrigation District, a California irrigation district; the City of Oakdale, a California public agency; the City of Riverbank, a California public agency; the City of Modesto, a California public agency; the City of Waterford, a California public agency; and the Modesto Irrigation District, a California irrigation district (each referred to individually as a "Party" or collectively as the "Parties").
- 2. **RECITALS.** This MOU is entered into with regard to the following facts and circumstances, among others:
 - 2.1 Groundwater and surface water resources within the Modesto Sub-basin of the San Joaquin Valley Groundwater Basin (DWR Bulletin 118 No. 5-22.02) ("Sub-basin") are vitally important resources, in that they provide the foundation to maintain and fulfill current and future environmental, agricultural, domestic, municipal and industrial needs, and to maintain the economic viability, prosperity, and sustainable management of the Sub-basin.
 - Agriculture has been prominent in making Stanislaus County one of the world's foremost agricultural areas, and has played a major role in the development of the economy of Stanislaus County; in an era of increasing competition for the area's finite water resources, it is important to understand and plan for the local area's economic well-being.
 - 2.3 Although each of the Parties overlies and has rights to extract groundwater from the Sub-basin, each Party's individual surface and groundwater rights, historical groundwater production, and groundwater recharge and conveyance activities vary greatly from one another.
 - 2.4 The California Legislature has adopted, and the Governor has signed into law, the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act ("SGMA"), which authorizes local agencies to manage groundwater in a sustainable fashion.
 - 2.5 The Parties intend to enter into this MOU in order to ensure that the Sub-basin remains locally and sustainably managed.
 - 2.6 SGMA requires groundwater basins designated as either medium or high-priority to be managed by one or more Groundwater Sustainability Agencies ("GSA") by June 30, 2017 and that GSAs adopt a groundwater sustainability plan ("Plan") by January 31, 2022.
 - 2.7 The Sub-basin is currently designated as a high-priority basin, and thus must comply with the deadlines in the previous recital.

- 2.8 Pursuant to SGMA, a combination of local agencies may form a GSA through a memorandum of understanding or other legal agreement.
- **2.9** Each of the Parties overlies a portion of the Sub-basin and is a local agency as defined by SGMA.
- 2.10 In order to coordinate groundwater management activities and to comply with SGMA, the Parties desire to form a GSA for the portion of the Sub-basin that lies within their collective jurisdictions.
- 2.11 This MOU is intended to be an agreement for formation of a GSA as authorized by section 10723.6(a)(2) of the Water Code.
- 2.12 The Parties further intend and will work cooperatively to develop a separate operating agreement for the Stanislaus and Tuolumne River Groundwater Basin Association ("STRGBA") GSA ("STRGBA GSA").
- 2.13 The Parties believe that cooperative and coordinated actions by local agencies and users within the Sub-basin will result in the continued sustainable use of the groundwater within the Sub-basin.
- 3. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>. The following terms, whether in the singular or the plural, and when used herein with initial capitalization, shall have the meanings specified below:
 - **3.1 Annual Budget.** The GSA budget developed annually, pursuant to Section 6.2, to fund certain project(s) to advance the goals and objectives of this MOU.
 - **3.2 Committee.** That body, consisting of one representative from each of the Parties, which governs the GSA, as established pursuant to Section 4.3 of this MOU.
 - **3.3** Coordinator. The individual appointed by the Committee pursuant to Section 5.
 - **3.4 Funding Percentage.** A Party's Funding Percentage as set forth in Section 7.1 of this MOU.
 - **3.5** Governing Bodies. The governing entities of the Parties to this MOU.
 - **3.6 GSA.** A Groundwater Sustainability Agency created pursuant to SGMA.
 - **MOU.** This Memorandum of Understanding creating the STRGBA GSA.
 - **3.8** Parties. Each of those entities named in Section 1 of this MOU, or those Parties added pursuant to Section 4.5 of this MOU.
 - **9.9 Plan.** A Groundwater Sustainability Plan developed and adopted pursuant to SGMA.
 - **3.10 SGMA.** The Sustainable Groundwater Management Act of 2014.
 - 3.11 Stanislaus and Tuolumne River Groundwater Basin Association GSA or STRGBA GSA. The GSA created pursuant to this MOU to manage the Sub-basin.

- 3.12 Sub-basin. The Modesto Sub-basin of the San Joaquin Valley Groundwater Basin (DWR Bulletin 118 No. 5-22.02), which is geographically defined as that area in the State of California bounded on the west by the San Joaquin River; on the north by the Stanislaus River, on the east by the base of the Sierra Nevada foothills; and on the south by the Tuolumne River, and includes the area of land overlying that Sub-basin and all tributaries therein as defined by the then-current Department of Water Resources Bulletin 118.
- **3.13 Voting Percentage.** A Party's Voting Percentage as set forth in Section 7.3 of this MOU

4. THE GSA.

- **4.1 Creation of GSA.** The Parties hereby establish the STRGBA GSA to manage the portion of the Sub-basin within the Parties' collective jurisdictions.
- **4.2 Purposes and Powers.** The purposes and powers of the STRGBA GSA are as follows:
 - 4.2.1 This MOU is entered into by and between the Parties to, consistent with SGMA, exert local control over the management of the Sub-basin and to facilitate a cooperative and ongoing working relationship that will allow compliance with SGMA and state law, as amended from time to time.
 - 4.2.2 The STRGBA GSA shall act on behalf of its members to coordinate the Parties' activities and actions to further the sustainable management of the Sub-basin and facilitate compliance with SGMA. It shall in no way determine or modify the surface water rights or groundwater rights, if any, of any Party.
 - **4.2.3** The STRGBA GSA shall determine and evaluate the Sub-basin's existing groundwater supply;
 - **4.2.4** The STRGBA GSA shall promote coordination of groundwater management planning activities within the Sub-basin;
 - **4.2.5** The STRGBA GSA shall evaluate the Sub-basin's need for additional or improved water extraction, storage, delivery, conservation, and recharge facilities;
 - **4.2.6** The STRGBA GSA shall provide and share information and guidance for the management, preservation, protection and enhancement of groundwater quality and quantity in the Sub-basin; and
 - **4.2.7** The STRGBA GSA shall have the powers and authorities granted to GSAs under SGMA.
- **4.3 Committee.** The STRGBA GSA shall be governed by a Committee whose membership and responsibilities are set forth herein.

- 4.3.1 Each Party shall designate one staff person to serve as a member of the Committee, and one or more alternates. The names of the member and alternates will be submitted to the Coordinator. Each member of the Committee, and each alternate, shall serve at the pleasure of the Party appointing such member. A Party's alternate may serve in the place of that Party's member in the absence of such member and, in such case, the alternate shall have the powers of the member.
- 4.3.2 The Committee shall elect a chair and vice chair from its members at the first meeting of each calendar year. The chair shall be responsible for presiding over meetings of the Committee, and shall notify members and the Coordinator of meetings of the Committee. The Committee shall establish a date, time and place for its regular meetings, and may hold special meetings when required for the proper transaction of business. All meetings of the Committee will be held in accordance with the provisions of the Brown Act, California Government Code Section 54950 et seq. The Committee shall prescribe such procedures for the conduct of its business as it deems appropriate.
- 4.3.3 A quorum will consist of a simple majority of the Parties, subject to the provisions of section 6.5, except that less than a quorum may adjourn meetings of the Committee from time to time. Alternatively, the Coordinator may adjourn a meeting of the Committee to a specified time, date and place if there is less than a quorum of members present for a meeting.
- **4.3.4** The Committee shall have the following duties and responsibilities:
 - a. Develop and implement activities designed to achieve the objectives of SGMA.
 - **b.** Designate a Party that will enter into contracts, and approve all amendments thereto, for and on behalf of the STRGBA GSA, necessary to carry out the powers and duties of the STRGBA GSA.
 - c. Establish an Annual Budget for the STRGBA GSA, and approve proposed revisions to such budget, provided that no action of the STRGBA GSA shall be deemed to bind any party to contribute such funds absent approval of each Party's Governing Body.
 - **d.** Recommend for approval by each Party's Governing Body's Annual Budget(s) necessary to carry out proposed project(s).
 - e. Establish such committees as may be necessary or desirable to carry out the purposes of the STRGBA GSA, and to exercise general supervision over such committees.
- **4.3.5** Except for actions for which a different approval standard is set forth in this MOU, all actions of the Committee will be approved by a majority of the members present.

- **4.4 Staff.** The staff of the STRGBA GSA shall be composed of staff from each Party. The STRGBA GSA shall also have the authority to hire or retain agents, contractors and consultants as the Committee shall determine necessary and appropriate.
- **4.5 New Parties.** New parties may join the STRGBA GSA, provided that they meet the requirements set forth below:
 - **4.5.1** Any county or local public agency that meets the definition of "local agency" as set forth in SGMA.
 - **4.5.2** Application for membership will be subject to simple majority approval by the Committee.
 - 4.5.3 As a condition of admission to the STRGBA GSA, any new Party to this MOU shall agree to be subject to the terms of this MOU and shall be required to first pay its proportionate share of back contributions or as otherwise determined appropriate by the Committee.

5. COORDINATOR.

- **5.1 Appointment.** The Committee shall appoint a one of the Committee members as the Coordinator, who shall have the duties and responsibilities set forth in this Section 5.
- **5.2 Duties and Responsibilities.** The Coordinator will have the following duties and responsibilities:
 - 5.2.1 Develop and submit for review and approval by the Committee a work plan and schedule of activities designed to comply with the requirements of SGMA, or as may be otherwise directed by the Committee.
 - **5.2.2** Propose an Annual Budget, and from time to time such revisions as the Coordinator may feel necessary or desirable, to the Committee for its review and approval.
 - 5.2.3 Submit to the Committee, as directed by the Committee, a progress report as to the STRGBA GSA's activities and a report which compares actual expenditures with the Annual Budget, as adopted.
 - **5.2.4** Execute and administer contracts as directed by the Committee.
 - **5.2.5** Maintain proper records and accounts of work performed by the Committee.
 - **5.2.6** Receive and disburse funds at or under the direction of the Committee.
 - **5.2.7** Act as secretary/treasurer to the STRGBA GSA, and acting in that capacity, prepare, record and distribute minutes of all Committee meetings.
 - **5.2.8** Perform such other actions as may be necessary or desirable to promote the work of the Committee and the STRGBA GSA.

GSA BUDGET AND COSTS.

- **6.1 Budget Cycle.** The budget cycle of the STRGBA GSA shall be on a calendar year basis.
- 6.2 Annual Budget. The Coordinator shall prepare an Annual Budget for each calendar year that the Committee determines certain projects are necessary. The Coordinator's draft Annual Budget for the following year shall be delivered to the Committee members no later than June 1 of each year. The Committee shall approve or revise the draft Annual Budget and distribute the draft Annual Budget to each Party no later than July 1 of each year. The Committee shall meet to review input from the Parties' Governing Bodies no later than August 1 of each year, and shall approve a final budget no later than September 1 of each year for the following year. The respective Governing Bodies of the Parties shall review the Annual Budget no later than October 1 of each year and notify the Coordinator that it has allocated or appropriated its respective contribution to the Annual Budget no later than October 15 of each year. The Committee shall adopt and approve the Annual Budget and have it in place and effect by January 1 of each year, or as approved by the Parties.
- 6.3 Allocation of Funds. Within the Annual Budget adopted pursuant to Section 6.2, the Committee shall have the authority to make minor adjustments in the allocation of funds between budget categories; provided, however, that the cumulative change in the budget category does not exceed ten percent (10%) of the amount authorized in the Annual Budget and the total amount of the Annual Budget is not increased. Other budget adjustments require approval of the Governing Bodies.
- **Budget Increases.** Increases in the total amount of a budget must be approved by the Governing Bodies of a simple majority of the Parties.
- 6.5 Failure to Pay. If any Party fails to pay its respective share of any Annual Budget or budget increase when due, whether or not that Party's Governing Body approved the Annual Budget or the budget increase, then that Party shall be ineligible to vote on any subject or issue unless such failure is excused by the Committee through formal action and majority approval of the Committee. During any period of time during which a Party is ineligible to vote on a matter by reason of the application of this Section 6.5, such Party shall not be counted as a Party in determining a quorum, or in determining a "majority" with regard to the approval of any action. In order to restore its eligibility to vote, a Party must be current on all amounts due, including any expenditures approved by the Committee while such Party was ineligible to vote.
- **Expenditures.** STRGBA GSA funds may be properly expended for all costs approved by the Committee and properly incurred in the performance of the work approved by the Committee, or under such authority as may be delegated to the Coordinator by the Committee.
- 6.7 Non Reimbursable Costs. Costs incurred by any Party in connection with any functions of the STRGBA GSA, or any committee established by the Committee, and expenses of a Party's personnel including, without limitation, the regular and alternate members appointed by a Party to any committee while performing such

functions, shall not be reimbursed by the STRGBA GSA except through formal action and majority approval of the Committee provided that a Party shall be reimbursed for the services performed by such Party's employees while serving as staff to the STRGBA GSA as approved through the Annual Budget process.

7. FUNDING AND VOTING PERCENTAGES.

7.1 Funding Percentage. Each Party shall be responsible for its proportionate share of the funding requirements of the STRGBA GSA. The proportionate shares of each Party shall be determined by dividing the funding requirements of the STRGBA GSA by the number of Parties. During Committee approval of certain projects that beneficially affect the Parties disproportionately, equitable project funding shall be determined through formal action and majority approval of the Committee.

The Parties shall provide funding consistent with the Annual Budget adopted by the Committee on the schedule set forth in such budgets, or pursuant to the Coordinator's discretion. Funding needs of the STRGBA GSA payable by the Parties shall be determined by the Committee, and such funds shall be transmitted by the Party to the Coordinator within sixty (60) days of project approval. Upon receipt, the Coordinator will immediately deposit funds in an interest-bearing bank account, separate from other accounts of the Parties. The funds in such account shall remain the property of each contributing Party until spent, and interest earned thereon shall belong to each contributing Party.

- **7.2** Payment Reduction. Each Party agrees that the Parties' respective obligations to make payments hereunder shall not be subject to any reduction, whether by offset, counter claim, recoupment or otherwise. A Party's funding contributions to the STRGBA GSA, or a portion thereof, may be reimbursed upon termination of that Party's participation in the STRGBA GSA and approval by a simple majority vote of the Committee.
- 7.3 Voting Percentage. Each Party's representative on the Committee shall be entitled to one vote; provided however, that if a matter being decided by the Committee will have a disproportionate effect on the financial obligations of one or more Parties, as contemplated in Section 7.1, each Party shall be entitled to a weighted vote proportionate to the financial obligation or benefit of the Parties. The Voting Percentages set forth in this Section shall remain in effect only until voting percentages are established in the operating agreement for the STRGBA GSA.
- **7.4 Modification by Party.** Funding Percentages and/or Voting Percentages may be changed only upon simple majority approval of the Committee.

8. RELATIONSHIP OF PARTICIPANTS.

8.1 Each Party's Action Independent. The obligation of each Party to make payments under Section 7.1 of this MOU is an individual and several obligation and not a joint obligation of the Parties. Each Party shall be individually responsible for its own covenants, obligations and liabilities under this MOU. No Party shall be under the control of or shall be deemed to control any other Party or the Parties collectively. No Party shall be the agent of or have the right or power to bind any

other Party without such Party's express written consent, except as expressly provided in this MOU.

8.2 Indemnity. No Party, nor any officer or employee of a Party, shall be responsible for any damage or liability occurring by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by another Party under or in connection with this MOU. The Parties further agree, pursuant to Government Code Section 895.4, that each Party shall fully indemnify and hold harmless each other Party and its agents, officers, employees and contractors from and against all claims, damages, losses, judgments, liabilities, expenses and other costs, including litigation costs and attorney fees, arising out of, resulting from, or in connection with any work delegated to or action taken or omitted to be taken by such Party under this MOU.

In no event, except for any claim, demand, liability, loss or damage arising out of or resulting from any action taken or not taken by one Party at the direction of its directors, officers, or employees of management or administrative responsibility, which is knowingly or intentionally taken or not taken with conscious indifference to the consequences thereof or with the intent that injury or damage would result or would probably result therefrom, shall a Party be liable to any other Party for any indirect or consequential damage claim, demand, liability, loss, expense (including attorney's fees), or damage arising out of or in any way connected with this MOU, including any negligence in connection therewith.

- 8.3 No Creation of a Joint Powers Authority. The Parties agree that by this MOU they do not intend to provide for the creation of an agency or entity which is separate from the Parties pursuant to Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 6500) of Division 7 of Title 1 of the Government Code, relating to the joint exercise of powers.
- 9. <u>TERM OF THIS MOU</u>. The term of this MOU shall commence once all named parties have executed this MOU and shall remain in effect unless terminated by the mutual written consent of all Parties. Upon termination of this MOU, the Committee shall determine the assets and liabilities of the STRGBA GSA, make every effort to satisfy all obligations within sixty (60) days of the termination of this MOU, and equitably distribute any remaining fund balance to each Party in proportion to each Party's Funding Percentage.

10. GENERAL PROVISION GOVERNING MOU.

- 10.1 Severability. In the event that any of the terms, covenants or conditions of this MOU or the application of any such term, covenant or condition shall be held invalid as to any Party, person or circumstance by any court of competent jurisdiction, all other terms, covenants or conditions of this MOU and their application shall not be affected thereby, but shall remain in full force and effect unless any such court holds that those provisions are not separable from all other provisions of this MOU.
- **10.2 No Third Party Beneficiaries.** This MOU is for the sole benefit of the Parties and shall not be construed as granting rights to any person other than the Parties or imposing obligations on any person other than another Party.
- 10.3 Good Faith. Subject to the right of a Party to withdraw or terminate its membership in the STRGBA GSA, each Party shall use its best efforts and work wholeheartedly

- and in good faith for the expeditious completion of the objectives of this MOU and the satisfactory performance of the terms and provisions contained herein.
- Withdrawal or Termination of Membership. Except in the event of the 10.4 termination of this MOU pursuant to Section 9, a Party who withdraws or terminates its membership in the STRGBA GSA shall not be entitled to a refund of its funding contributions. Any Party may terminate membership and withdraw from the STRGBA GSA upon thirty (30) days written notice of termination to the STRGBA GSA. If a Party withdraws from the STRGBA GSA when the Party is in arrears as to complying with its Funding Percentage, that Party's entitlement to use any groundwater model or other work product of the STRGBA GSA as provided for herein shall be determined by the Committee. Whenever a Party withdraws from the STRGBA GSA, it is the intent of the Parties and of the STRGBA GSA that the withdrawal shall remove the area within the Party's water service area from further management by the STRGBA GSA, provided that the withdrawal shall be in accordance with the requirements of SGMA and shall leave no area within the Basin unmanaged.
- **10.5 Amendment.** Unless provided otherwise, this MOU may be amended upon the affirmative vote of the Governing Bodies of a simple majority of the Parties.
- **10.6 Counterpart Execution.** This MOU may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- **10.7 Governance.** This MOU is made under and shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. Venue of any action arising from this MOU shall be in the County of Stanislaus.
- **10.8** Reasonable Delivery of Documents. The Parties agree to act in good faith to promptly execute any documents that are necessary, or may become necessary, to implement activities approved by the Governing Bodies in the Annual Budget, subject to the authority and the right of the Governing Bodies to terminate participation in this MOU.
- 10.9 Attorney Fees. If any action at law or in equity, including action for declaratory relief, is brought to enforce or interpret provisions of this MOU, the prevailing Party shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees and costs that may be set by the court in the same action or in a separate action brought for that purpose, in addition to any other relief to which such Party may be entitled.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Parties have caused this MOU to be executed, each signatory hereto represents that he has been appropriately authorized to enter into this MOU on behalf of the Party for whom he/she signs.

SUBJECT: DISCUSSION ON THE BUREAU OF RECLAMATION'S LETTER TO THE STATE WATER BOARD REGARDING MEETING D-1641 SAN JOAQUIN RIVER FLOW **OBJECTIVES AT VERNALIS**

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

This letter is being discussed for the benefit of the Board and public regarding the operation of New Melones in meeting the State Water Resources Control Board's existing 1995 Water Quality Control Plan for the San Joaquin River and Bay-Delta Estuary. It's an important letter to read and understand from a basin operations perspective.

In simple terms, New Melones water is being used by Reclamation to meet the flow and water quality objectives established at Vernalis by the State Board as outlined in D-1641. The problem for Reclamation, and to a certain extent OID/SSJID, there is not enough water generated in this basin alone to meet those objectives. It is evident in the deteriorated condition of New Melones storage that exists today when compared to the other reservoirs feeding the San Joaquin River from the upper San Joaquin, the Merced and the Tuolumne Rivers.

As the letter indicates, were it not for the assistance of OID/SSJID in providing water for fish and wildlife preservation, the likely compliance by Reclamation in meeting those flow requirements would have been small. As the letter indicates, Reclamation will need to continue to rely upon OID/SSJID water and the involvement of other parties downstream, who pay for that water, to continue to meet D-1641 and the Biological Opinion flows outlined in Table 2E of the BO.

A healthy reservoir serves the needs of both Reclamation and the two districts. Without that cooperation there are risks to OID/SSJID water rights with regard to curtailments by the State Water Board and potentially ESA actions by National Marine Fisheries. These are not the legal entanglements OID/SSJID wish to incur when participation and cooperation are practical options.

Flow Objectives in Future Years

Dear Mr. Howard:

On April 1, 2016, Reclamation filed a Temporary Urgency Change Petition (TUCP) to temporarily modify requirements in its water right permits for the New Melones Project. The resulting April 19, 2016, Temporary Urgency Change Order (TUCO) from the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) requires Reclamation to:

"...submit a proposal to the Executive Director by November 1, 2016, identifying how it plans to address its difficulty meeting D-1641 San Joaquin river flow requirements until such time as the State Water Board updates and implements the San Joaquin River flow objectives."

Reclamation has had difficulty meeting D-1641 San Joaquin River flow requirements since the San Joaquin River Agreement (SJRA) expired in 2011, which expired on its own terms (i.e, it was not prematurely withdrawn from by any party). The expiration of the SJRA has significant implications to whether the spring pulse flow requirements are supported with currently available water supplies. In addition, even prior to the expiration of the SJRA, Reclamation had difficulty meeting the February through June base flows contained in Table 3 of D-1641 TUCPs were submitted in 2003, 2004, 2005, 2009, 2015, and 2016) due to concerns about the base and pulse flow impacts to New Melones Reservoir storage.

Reclamation has not operated to the D-1641 April-May pulse flows for the San Joaquin River at Vernalis contained in Table 3. Modified spring pulse flows were implemented on an interim basis through the SJRA. The SWRCB record is clear that instream flows for the San Joaquin River cannot consistently be met with such heavy reliance on New Melones yield, a reservoir situated on a single tributary to the San Joaquin River. This situation is further complicated due

to the senior water right obligations at New Melones, and the potential for slow refill of New Melones given the variable hydrology of the Stanislaus River.

When the SJRA ended on December 31, 2011, after twelve years, Reclamation was unsuccessful in negotiating a temporary agreement to extend the SJRA with the original partners. Reclamation was able to negotiate an additional 2-year agreement with Merced Irrigation District in order to continue to provide a 31-day spring pulse flow similar to SJRA spring pulse flow operations.

However, the advent of the drought in 2013, and the sequential critically dry years in the San Joaquin Basin, has severely limited any available water for purchase for Vernalis pulse flows. The past five years have also demonstrated the futility of relying solely on New Melones Reservoir to meet Delta water quality and flow requirements, and the lack of a durable implementation plan to provide for these flows, especially during prolonged droughts.

Oakdale Irrigation District and South San Joaquin Irrigation District (Districts) have provided some additional volumes of water post-SJRA for the purpose of fish and wildlife preservation and enhancement in the Stanislaus and San Joaquin Rivers. A spring 2013 release of 80,000 acre-feet augmented the 2009 National Marine Fisherics Service (NMFS) Biological Opinion Appendix 2E schedule for a pulse flow in the April-May pulse period. In 2015, due to the lack of Central Valley Project water in the extremely low storage in New Melones Reservoir, the Districts made available about 23,000 acre-feet of water during the October-November time period for the fall pulse flow. This water was provided by the Districts using water they conserved over the summer of 2015 through water conservation efforts. In April-May 2016 the Districts contributed 75,000 acre-feet of water for the spring pulse flow in addition to the Appendix 2E flow volume and the October-November fall pulse flow (Appendix 2E volume of 23,200 acre-feet) was supplemented by an additional 16,000 acre-feet of the Districts' water.

After four years of extended drought, 2016 hydrologic conditions improved somewhat, however, in spite of average to slightly above average precipitation, runoff was significantly below average due to replenishment of depleted soil moisture, increased uptake by vegetation and less precipitation falling as snow. Conditions at New Melones Reservoir at the end of Water Year 2016, have improved slightly in comparison with the end of Water Year 2015 (end of September storage in 2016 is approximately 260 thousand acre-feet higher than in 2015), however, overall storage is currently only 22% of total capacity and 39% of the historical average to date. In comparison, New Don Pedro Reservoir storage is presently at 65% of total capacity and 98% of the historical average and Lake McClure (New Exchequer) is at 36% of total capacity and 80% of the historical average. The entire San Joaquin basin remains in a depleted hydrologic state and may face continuing drought conditions in the months ahead.

Condition 3 of the TUCO required Reclamation to provide an analysis of water rights for water stored in New Melones Reservoir from October 15, 2015, through September 30, 2016. The result of that analysis showed that Reclamation does not have adequate carryover water available in New Melones Reservoir to meet all future water rights terms and conditions and other regulatory requirements if drought conditions persist. The potential carryover volume into water

year 2017, was only about 71,000 acre-feet. Very little storage has been built up over the past years of drought, leaving the Project heavily dependent on future inflow. It may be as long as a decade before New Melones Reservoir storage recovers with only average inflows.

In the future and until the updates to the Bay-Delta Plan are completed and implemented, Reclamation anticipates that flow releases to the Stanislaus River will be consistent with the provisions of the NMFS Biological Opinion and the actions under its Reasonable and Prudent Alternatives. Flows will follow the Appendix 2E schedule as modified through the Stanislaus Operations Group and Reclamation will continue to meet the D-1641 salinity objective at Vernalis. Reclamation will continue to work closely with the Districts to facilitate the release of any water they are able to provide to help meet flows additional to the Appendix 2E flows and including the fall attraction flows. Any future release of the Districts' water will likely involve the participation of other parties willing to pay for the release and will be contingent on that water contributing to improved water supplies in other areas of the State. Such agreements are often dependent on the hydrologic conditions at the time and are difficult to evaluate well in advance of the action given the complex hydrodynamics and fishery concerns involved. Such coordinated actions require close involvement with the Federal and State fishery agencies on a case-by-case basis.

In addition, Reclamation will also work closely with the Federal fishery agencies and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife to coordinate the Stanislaus River flows with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission flows on the Merced and Tuolumne rivers.

SUBJECT: DISCUSSION ON REINITIATION OF CONSULTATION ON THE COORDINATED LONG-TERM OPERATION OF THE CENTRAL VALLEY PROJECT AND STATE

WATER PROJECT

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

The previous agenda item points out the difficulties in the federal management of water in the Stanislaus River in compliance with existing law, that being D-1641 and the OCAP (Operations Criteria and Plan) BO's (Biological Objectives) RPA's (Reasonable and Prudent Alternatives), specifically Table 2E flow criteria for the Stanislaus river.

On a broader scale, over the last 4 years of drought the federal operations of Shasta, Folsom, New Melones and Friant along with the state operations of Orville under the OCAP-BO have raised concerns about the continued operations of these facilities in meeting the ESA Section 7 requirements contained in the operating permits for both the State and Federal pumping systems in the delta.

In light of new information learned from multiple years of drought, more recent data on listed-salmonid population levels for the endangered Sacramento River winter-run Chinook salmon and threatened Central Valley Spring-run Chinook salmon, both the Bureau of Reclamation and DWR have requested re-initiation of consultation on the Coordinated Long-Term Operation of the Central Valley Project (CVP) and State Water Project (SWP).

While not a federal or state contractor, OID and SSJID have been offered a seat at the table to monitor this re-consultation effort and provide input as a stakeholder. During the 2009 OCAP-BO consultation that was not the case and the districts ended up in federal court challenging much of the decisions regarding the flow demands and resultant impacts placed on New Melones, in violation of the districts senior water rights. This will be a pleasant change and hopefully a productive opportunity for the districts to provide positive input that both protects their water rights but improves the viability of New Melones.

Dear Mr. Stelle:

On June 4, 2009, the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) issued its biological opinion (2009 BiOp) on the Coordinated Long-term Operation of the CVP and SWP (LTO). The purpose of this letter is to request reinitiation of consultation with NMFS, as provided for under Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act (ESA), on the LTO. This request is based on new information related to multiple years of drought, recent data demonstrating extremely low listed-salmonid population levels for the endangered winter-run Chinook salmon, and new information available and expected to become available as a result of ongoing work through collaborative science processes. We expect this consultation to update the system-wide operating criteria for the LTO consistent with Section 7 requirements and to review the existing Reasonable and Prudent Alternative (RPA) included in the 2009 Biological Opinion (2009 BiOp) to determine the continued substance and efficacy in meeting the requirements of Section 7 of the ESA. Consistent with this reinitiation request, U.S. Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) and the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) will also seek reinitiation of consultation from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) on the LTO.

During this reinitiated consultation, the CVP and SWP will continue to operate pursuant to the requirements of the 2009 BiOp until a new opinion on the LTO is issued. In addition, Reclamation will be requesting that NMFS commence the Amendment process for the 2009 BiOp RPA (section 11.2.1.2 Research and Adaptive Management page 9 of the 2011 amendment) through a separate letter. Lastly, because we believe an open and transparent science process is essential to effective conservation, the Collaborative Science and Adaptive Management Program (CSAMP) and Collaborative Adaptive Management Team (CAMT) processes can provide important input to the reinitiated consultation. In addition, we plan to involve and have the benefit of the Delta Science Program and its processes.





For this reinitiated consultation, Reclamation and DWR will coordinate with NMFS and FWS to prepare a Consultation Agreement (CA), expected October 31, 2016, that will outline the tasks, process, and schedule to complete a biological assessment (BA) and BiOp. Additionally, the directors of Reclamation, DWR, FWS, NMFS, and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) will meet in late 2016 to discuss progress and next steps. We believe it is appropriate to include DFW in the development of the CA to ensure consistency with legal requirements for those listed species covered in the BiOp that are also listed under the California Endangered Species Act. We expect the CA to outline the specific steps involved and agency roles in developing the proposed action, the scientific framework for the effects assessment, and preparation and review of drafts of the BA and BiOp, including independent scientific review.

Dear Directors Murillo and Cowin:

Thank you for your August 2, 2016, letter requesting reinitiation of Endangered Species Act (ESA) section 7 consultation on the Coordinated Long-Term Operation of the Central Valley Project and State Water Project. We agree that reinitiation is required under the terms of the 2009 Biological Opinion and ESA regulations (50 CFR 402.16). Reasons for the reinitiation include new information related to the effects of multiple years of drought, recent data demonstrating extremely low abundance levels for endangered Sacramento River winter-run Chinook salmon and threatened Central Valley spring-run Chinook salmon, and new information resulting from ongoing scientific collaboration.

We agree with your proposal to develop a Consultation Agreement this fall that will outline the tasks, process, and schedule to complete a Biological Assessment and Biological Opinion. Due to staff resource constraints, however, we will not be able to begin work on this reinitiation until we complete the California WaterFix Biological Opinion and the Shasta Reasonable and Prudent Alternative adjustment efforts. Formal section 7 consultation will not begin until the initiation package pursuant to the requirements of 50 CF 402.14(c) is complete.

We recognize that this type of operations consultation is most efficiently done with participation of multiple agencies, including the Bureau of Reclamation, California Department of Water Resources, California Department of Fish and Wildlife, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, along with NOAA's National Marine Fisheries Service. As required, the consultation will utilize the best scientific and commercial information available. We agree that the consultation process should be informed by the Collaborative Science and Adaptive Management Program and



Collaborative Adaptive Management Team process, the Delta Science Program, and the Interagency Ecological Program as appropriate.

Thank you for your request to reinitiate consultation. We look forward to continuing our collaborative work as we move forward on this important issue.

SUBJECT: DISCUSSION ON THE PASSAGE OF THE WATER RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT ACT (WRDA) AND THE BENEFITS TO OID/SSJID

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

The week of December 5-9 in Washington D.C. was a very busy time as the Water Resources Development Act was introduced to the House of Representatives for a vote. The eventual outcome of that bill's signage on December 16th by President Obama was a significant step forward for both the nation and California agriculture.

A portion of that legislation contained significant benefit to our agency to improve fisheries on the Stanislaus River through its predator suppression language and allows the districts to work with our federal partners on the river in discussing storage opportunities in New Melones Dam. Many thanks to our Congressman Jeff Denham who was a major player in much of the legislations content that benefited our two districts.

Attached is a shortened version of the legislation's benefit to the Central Valley. The GM will discuss certain portions that are of interest to OID.

California Water

Section 4001. Operations and Reviews.

- Requires the Interior and Commerce Secretaries to provide the maximum amount of water to CVP and SWP contractors by approving operations or temporary projects as quickly as possible, consistent with Federal and State law and regulation, such as:
 - Keeping the Cross Channel Gates open for the maximum extent possible while protecting migrating salmonids;
 - o Implementing turbidity control measures to protect Delta smelt;
 - Expanding the window for and expediting review of water transfer requests through the Delta; and,
 - Creating a process for the Governor of California to request the Interior or Commerce Secretary to implement the emergency authorities under this subsection to approve projects to provide emergency water supplies or address the drought.

Section 4002. Scientifically Support Implementation of OMR Flow Requirements.

- Directs pumping to occur at the high end of the allowable limits established in the Delta smelt and salmonid biological opinions.
- Authorizes reductions in pumping if there are additional adverse impacts to listed species beyond the range of effects anticipated to occur to the listed species for the duration of the biological opinions.

Section 4003. Temporary Operational Flexibility for Storm Events.

- Under certain conditions, authorizes higher pumping rates to capture water during winter storm events to increase water supplies to the CVP and SWP provided there are no additional adverse impacts to listed species beyond the range of effects anticipated to occur to the listed species for the duration of the biological opinions.
- Requires the Interior and Commerce Secretaries to take into account certain factors when authorizing higher pumping rates.

Section 4004. Consultation on Coordinated Operations.

- Directs Federal agencies to cooperate with State and local agencies during any consultation or re-consultation on the coordinated operations of the CVP and SWP.
- Directs the Interior and Commerce Secretaries, during any consultation or reconsultation, to solicit input from CAMT and CSAMP.
- Directs the Interior and Commerce Secretaries to conduct quarterly meetings on any consultation or re-consultation with stakeholders representing various interests, including but not limited to, environmental, recreational and commercial fishing, agriculture, municipal, Delta, and other regional interests.

Section 4005. Protections.

- Includes provisions:
 - o Protecting SWP contractor water supplies;
 - o Protecting area of origin and senior water rights holders;
 - o Preventing any adverse re-directed impacts to CVP or SWP contractors that would reduce water supplies resulting from implementation of this Act, if any; and
 - Directing the Interior Secretary, to the extent practicable, to allocate certain amounts of water to contractors in the Sacramento River Watershed division of the CVP.

Section 4006. New Melones Storage.

- Directs the Bureau of Reclamation to work with water districts in the Stanislaus River Basin to increase available storage for conservation, conjunctive use, transfers, and rescheduled water projects to maximize storage and water supplies in New Melones Reservoir.

Section 4007. Storage.

- Authorizes the Secretary of the Interior to participate in and provide financial assistance to develop new and expanded Federally-owned and State-led storage projects if certain criteria are met. The provision of Federal funding for construction of a State-led storage project in California is subject to the condition that the California Water Commission determines that the project is consistent with the California Water Bond. Authorizes \$350 million and includes language that requires projects to receive funding only if enacted appropriations legislation designates funding to them by name after the Secretary recommends the project. Funding only applies to Federally-owned and State-led storage projects that the Secretary determines to be feasible before January 1, 2021 but the funding for such projects found feasible can continue to receive funding after that date.
 - Federal Cost Share:
 - Federally-owned Project: Not more than 50 percent of the total cost of the federally owned storage project.
 - State-led Project: Not more than 25 percent of the total cost of the State-led storage project

Section 4008. Losses Caused by the Construction and Operation of Storage Projects.

- This section is designed to protect private landowners/businesses (marinas, recreational facilities, and other businesses) and power utilities whose existing facilities may be flooded as a result of the construction of any new or modified Federal surface water storage project. Directs the Secretaries of the Interior and Agriculture to compensate and provide the owner of an affected marina, recreational facility or other water-dependent business the right of first refusal to construct and operate replacement facilities on U.S.

land associated with the new or modified surface water storage project. Directs the Secretary to compensate the owner of an existing non-federal hydroelectric generating facility whose generation capacity is either eliminated or reduced as a result of inundation by a new or expanded surface water storage project, and provide the owner with the right of first refusal to construct, operate and maintain a replacement facility at the new or modified water storage project. Stipulates the how costs would be allocated on compensation and replacement power facilities.

Section 4009. Other Water Supply Projects.

- Authorizes the Secretary of the Interior to participate in and provide financial assistance to develop desalination projects in the Reclamation states using certain criteria, including if there is a federal benefit. Authorizes \$30 million and includes language that requires desalination projects to receive funding only if enacted appropriations legislation designates funding to them by name after the Secretary recommends the project.
- Creates a Title XVI competitive grant program at a \$50 million authorization. Such projects must meet certain criteria, including a federal benefit. Includes language that requires water recycling and reuse projects to receive funding only if enacted appropriations legislation designates funding to them by name after the Secretary recommends the project.
- Authorizes an additional \$100 million for the WaterSMART program.

Section 4010. Actions to Benefit Threatened and Endangered Species and Other Wildlife.

- Directs the Secretary to use real-time monitoring and the most updated science to make real time decision-making about operations to maximize fish and water supply benefits. Authorizes \$15 million for gravel and rearing area additions and habitat restoration to benefit Chinook salmon and steelhead trout; \$3 million for the Secretary to conduct Delta smelt distribution studies. Allows conservation fish hatcheries to be used to enhance, supplement and rebuild Delta smelt and salmonid fish species under the Delta smelt and salmonid biological opinions. Authorizes the Secretary to acquire land, water or interests from willing sellers for environmental purposes. Authorizes \$15 million for the Fisheries Restoration and Irrigation Mitigation Act of 2000, and includes three provisions aimed at protecting native anadromous fish species from non-native predation. Authorizes \$10 million for the acceleration and completion of water infrastructure and conveyance facilities for refuges and habitat areas.

Section 4011. Offsets and Water Storage Account.

- Allows certain Federal water users to pre-pay their repayment contracts, either in lump sum or by accelerated prepayment of remaining construction costs. This will allow for early receipts to flow into the Treasury. Out of the receipts generated from the prepayment provision, \$335 million shall be directed to the "Reclamation Storage"

Account" established in this section. Subject to appropriation, the Account may be used for the design and construction of new surface water storage facilities.

Section 4012, Savings Language.

- Establishes that nothing in the Act preempts State law or overrides or modifies the Endangered Species Act or the application of the Delta smelt and salmonid biological opinions regarding the operation of the CVP and the SWP. States that the Secretaries of the Interior and Commerce shall apply this Act to successor biological opinions only to the extent that it is deemed consistent with the successor biological opinions.

Section 4013. Duration.

- The Act expires five years after the date of its enactment with the exception of projects under construction in sections 8, 10(a) and 10(b) and section 5, which will expire 10 years after the date of enactment of this Act.

- 6. Settlement discussions on the Stanislaus River, the Tuolumne and Merced are to begin anew in January. The Governor has brought in Bruce Babbitt to lead this effort. Babbitt is a Democrat and was governor of Arizona from 1978-1987 and then Secretary of Interior from 1993-2001.
- 7. OE3 labor negotiations continue.
- 8. Met with City Manager of Oakdale on Action Plan OID had submitted.
- 9. Tunnel tour scheduled for January 11th for Farm Bureau auction winner Joe Tune.

Legal Activities

- 1. OID/SSJID vs the State Water Resources Control Board; Court date anticipated to be set for next summer.
- 2. OID/SSJID as intervenors in the CalSPA v. SWRCB; A trial date is set for Alameda County Court on August 7, 2017.
- 3. OGA/Brichetto/Frobose vs. OID regarding CEQA case:
 - a. Trial set for January 18th
- 4. OGA/Brichetto/Frobose vs. OID regarding Contempt of Court by OID:
 - a. Hearing set for January 18th
- 5. OID vs Directors Santos and Altieri regarding their ability to be in Closed Session on matters related to the OGA case due to their declarations in support of the OGA case, two breaches of closed session, and undisclosed conflict of interests with Frobose.
 - a. The case is moving forward.
- 6. Redistricting Process
 - a. Water Committee meeting today.
 - b. Board presentation in late January and hearing in February with potential Board adoption in March.
 - c. Regulatory compliance date is 180 days preceding the election or May 11th.

Construction Activities

- 1. C&M crews and equipment operators continue to progress on capital projects and maintenance work.
- 2. Assisting Water Ops./Eng. Dept. with various tasks.
- 3. Conducting Safety Coordinator tasks as needed.
- 4. Conducting Contract Administration tasks as needed.

- 5. C&M Worker The second candidate, John Phillips started employment at OID on 12/12, the third candidate will commence employment on 1/3.
- 6. Two Mile Bar Tunnel Project The mandatory pre-bid meeting and site visit was conducted on 12/15. There were 30 +/- people in attendance with approximately 9 potential prime contractors. There has been three addendums issued as of 12/28 addressing questions presented by the potential bidders, of which one was to extend the bid due date. Bids are now due on 1/19 and will be presented to the BOD for award of bid on 2/7 with a recommendation from staff. Start of construction is anticipated to be between 3/1 and 4/15 and will be determined based on the contractors schedule. Substantial completion date for the Project is still 12/31/2018.
- 7. Purchased and received one used class six flatbed truck on 12/27.
- 8. ACWA/JPIA conducted a training day at OID on 12/14, the training was of great benefit to OID employees. The classes were Asbestos Cement Pipe Safety, Field Ergonomics and Fall Protection.
- 9. Annual fire extinguisher training is tentatively scheduled for 2/10 pending approved of a work release at the Board meeting.

Water Operations Activities

Engineering

- Continued to process Encroachment and Ag Discharge Agreements and conduct field inspections during installation of the associated facilities.
- 2. Staff continued to work with landowners requesting deferred conditions of approval agreements, encroachment agreements and easements in accordance to OID's requirements for continued irrigation on recently completed lot line adjustments and parcel split projects.
- 3. ET monitoring stations installed as part of the 2016 ETAW monitoring and measurement program collected data through the end of October. The Tule ET stations remain in the fields that aren't being developed to collect additional data for the full year of the contract period (+/- May 2016).
- 4. Staff continued to work with SSJID, Calaveras County Water District, San Joaquin County and Stanislaus County to complete the draft mapping of OID's proposed GSA boundaries in the ESJ GW Basin. The required GSA hearing, resolution and final filing is anticipated to be completed during the first few months of the year to allow for each election being proposed to meet or proceed the June 2017 DWR review, 90-day posting and approval deadline.
- 5. A public hearing announcement was posted in the Oakdale Leader on December 28th and will be posted again on January 4th. The final draft MOU to proceed with formation of the STRGBA GSA is being provided to the Board for review at the January 3rd meeting to allow for a draft public hearing followed by potential adoption at the January 18th meeting. Each agency is anticipated to take action to adopt the MOU on or before the 14th of February to before a formal filing for GSA formation in the Modesto Subbasin is submitted to DWR.
- 6. Staff picked the draft Annexation Agreements back up for finalization during the first week of the new year.
- 7. Pertinent factors and options for the Board of Director Divisions Redistricting Project are being brought back for consideration by the Water Committee on January 3rd.
- 8. City staff continued to address a series of questions on the draft City of Oakdale Out of Boundary Service Agreement with OID on behalf of ID 41. Once these questions have been answered the agreement will be provided to the ID 41 membership for approval to proceed.

- 9. Staff attended the pre-bid meeting for the Two Mile Bar Tunnel Project on December 15th.
- 10. Staff continued the surveying, design, cost estimates, landowner meetings and drafting of plans for 2016/17 winter work projects.

Ag Water

- 1. The final round of volumetric water delivery tracking closed on October 31st. Staff continues to respond and address all questions received during the final billing.
- 2. The final funding decision for the 2015 Prop. 1 Agricultural Water Use Efficiency Grants was approved and posted on December 15th. OID is the recipient of a grant award for up to \$2.97 million towards the proposed \$6.5 million TCC expansion project. A request for Board action to accept the funds will follow and OID staff will begin to work with DWR on the draft grant agreement for final approval by the Board prior to initiation of any construction. DWR staff anticipates execution of the agreement to take a minimum of 6 months, but is required within one year of the awards announcement.
- 3. The pre-employment screening process is now underway with two successful candidates who were provided job offers to fill the DSO positions that are currently vacant.
- 4. Staff has continued to progress with updates and slight modifications to the Storm tracking software mainly based on customer and DSO feedback to continue to improve functionality and effective utilization of the software.
- 5. Met with the PG&E Customer Relationship Manager along with Water Utilities Department staff to determine the appropriate rate structures for OID's deep wells, drain pumps and reclamation pumps considering current and anticipated operations in 2017.

Water Utilities

- 1. Improvement District No. 41:
 - Pumping Station No. 3 remains out of service due to high turbidity issues.
- 2. Domestic Water Pumping Stations:
 - All Domestic Water Pumping Stations that are in service are operational.
- 3. Domestic Water Systems:
 - > All water systems are operating without restrictions.
 - Performed quarterly blow-off valve exercising.
 - Performed Air Relief Valve exercising.
 - > Annual testing of all backflow devices has been completed in accordance with OID's Cross Connection Control Policy.
 - Conducted inspections of all well head seals and continued to replace them as needed.
- 4. On-Call Activities:
 - At the request of a customer, their water service was shut off due to a leak on the customer's property. Water service is turned back on later that day.
- 5. Knights Ferry Pumping Station:
 - The Knights Ferry Pumps are active and continued to provide water to the treatment plant.
- 6. Irrigation Pumping Stations:
 - Agricultural deep well pumps have been deactivated for winter.
 - Inspections continued on all drain pumps that have been left in service for the winter.

The week was very interesting as Congressman McCarthy had added a 90 page California Water Bill addendum to the WRDA (Water Resources Development Act) prior to it going to the House for approval. There was a lot of tension and politicking as the House reviewed and finally approved the funding bill Wednesday evening, sending it to the Rules Committee on Thursday and to the Senate on Friday. The WRDA funding was approved by the Senate Saturday morning, sending it to the President's desk where it sits today.

A lot of news was generated as California's own Senator Boxer pulled what strings she had left to get it defeated. She and her environmental contingency of supports to defeat the legislation made quite a stir. Fortunate for California, Senator Feinstein, a principle author, mediator and endorser of the Water Bill held her ground and pushed through a very strongly supported bi-partisan piece of legislation (S. 612) to the benefit of the nation and, more importantly, to our own Stanislaus River.

Other notables in the California Central Valley delegation that had a hand or made significant contributions in getting this legislation through was Congressman Denham and his Chief of Staff, Jason Larrabee who managed to get the long time Save our Salmon Act incorporated in the bill. Many thanks to their great work.

Congressman Tom McClintock and his Legislative Director, Chris Tudor were instrumental in getting the mitigation hatchery language included as part of the bill as well.

Dear Mr. Knell:

I wish to thank you for hosting the above noted ACWA JPIA training classes on December 14, 2016. Keith Forbes, JPIA Senior Risk Management Advisor, and I extend our appreciation to Jason Jones, Support Services Manager, for his assistance in coordinating these sessions. Below are highlights of elements covered in each training class.

Field Ergonomics is a JPIA Commitment to Excellence "best practice," and we applaud Oakdale Irrigation District for providing this class to the Operations staff. In this class the following topics were covered:

- The economic and operations impact of musculoskeletal injuries
- Lifting and back safety techniques
- Factors contributing to field ergonomic injuries
- Field ergonomic problems and solutions
- Methods for identifying local ergonomic problems and solutions

In our Fall Protection class, staff were provided with methods of providing and employing fall protection. Participants discussed Cal/OSHA requirements, fall hazards, fall prevention, and protective systems.

In the Asbestos Cement (AC) Pipe class, we discussed the hazards of asbestos exposure, safe work (wet methods) practices allowed under Title 8, California Code of Regulations, Section 1529 standard, and proper donning/removing of personal protective equipment. Due to the purchase of a new snap cutter, staff had an extended "hands-on" demonstration of cutting of pipe and proper debris disposal methods.

On an item unrelated to the training classes, my last report indicated that I would have the JPIA's Cost Estimator, Chuck Wagenseller, conduct an updated property appraisal at the District. The appraisal was specifically requested for July/August 2016. Unfortunately, I learned from Jason that the property appraisal was not scheduled. On behalf of the JPIA, I apologize for not ensuring that a date was confirmed and the appraisal conducted as we indicated. Good Afternoon,

The final funding decision for the 2015 Proposition 1 Agricultural Water Use Efficiency Grants has been approved. The Final Award Announcement and tables are attached.

By the application deadline of March 30, 2016, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) received 50 proposals in response to the 2015 Proposition 1 Agricultural Water Use Efficiency Guidelines and Proposal Solicitation Package (PSP). Approximately \$37.2 million in grant funding was requested for proposed projects totaling over \$77.2 million. DWR has approximately \$30 million available for this solicitation. The 50 applications received included 23 proposals for implementation projects (Section A) and 27 proposals for non-implementation projects (Section B).

The grant proposals were subdivided into four sub-categories and reviewed by four technical review panels as follow:

- Section A: Agricultural Water Use Efficiency Implementation Projects (23 applications).
 - o A1 Implementation: Modernization/Automation/Other Projects (13 applications).
 - o A2 Implementation: Capital Outlay Projects (10 applications).
- Section B: Agricultural Water Use Efficiency Non-implementation Projects (27 applications).
 - B1 R&D/Feasibilities/Pilots/Demos (11 applications).
 - o B2 Technical Assistance/Training/Education/Outreach (16 applications).

Three applications were determined to be ineligible during the screening phase. All other eligible applications were scored and ranked in accordance to the scoring criteria published in the PSP. As stated in the PSP, only proposals with a passing score of 70 or more were considered for funding. Out of the 50 applications received, 38 were selected to receive funding.

This final funding decision allocates \$24.5 million for Section A (16 projects) and \$5.27 million for Section B (22 projects) with total awards of \$29.8 million. The proportion of grant funds expected to directly benefit Disadvantaged Communities (DACs) or Economically Distressed Areas (EDAs) is estimated to be at least 14.8% of the total awards.

Execution of a grant agreement and receipt of grant funds by the Grant Award Recipients will be contingent upon the Grant Award Recipients' compliance with applicable laws and regulations, as listed in Attachment 15 of the PSP.

Grant Award Recipients that are also agricultural water suppliers subject to the Agricultural Water Management Planning (AWMP) Act will need to comply with the AWMP requirements including submittal of an Agricultural Water Management Plan, implementation of all locally costeffective Efficient Water Management Practices (EWMPs), and implementation of the critical EWMPs consisting of measuring water deliveries to customers in accordance with the water measurement regulation and adopting a pricing structure for water customers based at least in part on quantity delivered. As provided in Water Code Section 10608.56(d), an agricultural water supplier that has not yet implemented all required EWMPs at the time of grant agreement execution may be eligible for funding if it submits a plan, for attaining implementation that includes a schedule, financing plan, and budget for implementation to be included in the grant agreement. If the implementation plan is acceptable to DWR, the plan will be incorporated into the grant agreement as a term of the grant agreement, and the applicant's failure to comply with provisions of the implementation plan could jeopardize funding under the agreement.

It is the responsibility of the Grant Award Recipient to maintain compliance with all applicable laws and regulations throughout the term of the grant agreement.

Grant agreement execution is contingent upon the Grant Award Recipient's compliance with all applicable legal requirements no later than a year from the date of DWR's announcement of the final grant awards. With respect to EWMPs, the Grant Award Recipient must demonstrate implementation of required EWMPs or submit an implementation plan acceptable to DWR, as described in Water Code section 10608.56(d), within one year from the date of DWR's final grant award. Failure to comply may result in the withdrawal of the grant award.

A DWR Grant Manager assigned to each grant will soon be contacting the contact person listed on awarded grant proposals to start the process of developing the grant agreement. Grant Award Recipients should be prepared to provide their DWR Grant Manager with the following documentation:

- Designated signatory and on-going contact information
- Signed Board Resolution (or similar) accepting the funds
- Signed Cost-Share Commitment Letter
- The latest three (3) years of audited financial statements
- Efficient Water Management Practices Implementation plan, schedule, budget, and finance plan (if applicable)

RE: Impact of Elections Code § 14050-14057 on UDEL / Odd Year Elections

Commencing Jan. 1, 2018 new Senate Bill 415 requires districts to meet a threshold of voter participation in order to continue holding odd year elections without penalty. Your district is regularly scheduled to hold your election during the Uniform District Election Law (UDEL) which is conducted in November of each odd year and could be impacted by this new legislation.

Throughout the month of January 2017 the Stanislaus County Registrar of Voters will review election history and voter participation then provide calculations which include voter turnout percentage for each odd year election district in the County, including yours. We plan to inform each district of the calculations in a letter by February 2017 that you can then review with your counsel.

Existing law generally requires all state, county, municipal, district and school district elections be held on an established election date. Existing law also establishes certain even year dates for statewide elections and requires any state, county, municipal, district and school district election held on a statewide election date to be consolidated with the statewide election.

Assembly Bill 415, commencing Jan. 1, 2018, would prohibit a political subdivision from holding an election other than on a statewide election date if holding an election on a non-statewide election date has *previously* resulted in a significant decrease in voter turnout. A "significant decrease in voter turnout" is defined as 25% less than the average voter turnout within that political subdivision for the previous four statewide general elections.

The new law does not affect your ability to schedule and hold a special election during any established election date pursuant to Elections Code (EC) § 1000 or § 1500.

If after receiving calculations from our office it is determined your district is included with those that must change to even year elections, EC § 14052 allows "political subdivisions" to continue to hold UDEL elections after 2018 if they have adopted a plan to consolidate with the statewide election schedule by 2022.

We will endeavor to continue to support your election needs.

- § 14052. (a) Except as provided in subdivision (b), a political subdivision shall not hold an election other than on a statewide election date if holding an election on a nonconcurrent date has previously resulted in a significant decrease in voter turnout.
- (b) A political subdivision may hold an election other than on a statewide election date if, by January 1, 2018, the political subdivision has adopted a plan to consolidate a future election with a statewide election not later than the November 8, 2022, statewide general election.
