OAKDALE IRRIGATION DISTRICT RESOLUTION NO. 2017-71

RESOLUTION CONSOLIDATING THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS' ELECTIONS FROM ODD-NUMBERED YEARS TO EVEN-NUMBERED YEARS TO BE HELD WITH THE GENERAL ELECTIONS

WHEREAS, the Oakdale Irrigation District ("District") currently conducts Board elections on odd-numbered years pursuant to the Elections Code §10505(a); and

WHEREAS, statewide general elections are held in California only in June and November of even-number years (Elections Code §1001); and

WHEREAS, the District is located within Stanislaus and San Joaquin Counties; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code §10404(h), if a special district is located in more than one county, the special district may not consolidate an election if any county in which the special district is located denies the request for consolidation;

WHEREAS, generally voter turnout is greater for statewide general elections than for local elections, including special districts elections held in November of odd-numbered years; and

WHEREAS, California Senate Bill 415 an act (which may be cited to as the California Voter Participation Rights Act (herein "the Act")) to add Chapter 1.7 (commencing with Section 14050) to Division 14 of the Elections Code, was approved by the California Governor and filed with the Secretary of State on September 1, 2015; and

WHEREAS, commencing January 1, 2018, the Act prohibits a political subdivision from holding an election other than on a statewide election date (i.e. "off-cycle") if holding an election on a non-concurrent date has previously resulted in voter turnout for a regularly scheduled election in the political subdivision being at least 25% less than the average voter turnout within the political subdivision for the four previous statewide general elections; and

WHEREAS, a political subdivision, may however, hold an off-cycle election if, by January 1, 2018, the political subdivision has adopted a plan to consolidate future elections with the statewide elections no later than the November 8, 2022 statewide general election; and

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes attorneys' fees to a prevailing plaintiff who successfully files an action in Superior Court to enforce the Act's prohibition; and

WHEREAS, the District may achieve a savings in the cost of its elections, if the District's elections are consolidated with the statewide general elections; and

WHEREAS, as a result of these facts, the Board desires to change the date of future board member elections to be consolidated with the California statewide general election in order to avoid potential litigation, save public funds and provide greater voter input to special district elections.

WHEREAS, Elections Code §10404 establishes a procedure whereby the special district may change the election date for its board members by adopting a resolution seeking approval of the change by the Board of Supervisors in Stanislaus and San Joaquin Counties; and

WHEREAS, if this change in election date is approved, it is requested that the new election date for Divisions 1 and 4 be moved from the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2019 to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of 2020 and that the election date for Divisions 2, 3, and 5 be moved from the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of 2021 to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2022 (refer to Appendix A); and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oakdale Irrigation District Board of Directors hereby finds, determines and/or declares, as follows:

- 1. The Board of Directors declares its intent to adopt this resolution to consolidate the election date for the Directors of the Board with the date for the California general election in November in even-numbered years pursuant to Elections Code §10404.
- 2. The District will forward this resolution to the Stanislaus County and San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors explaining the rationale for the resolution and requesting formal approval of the change by the Board of Supervisors at a public meeting held within 60 days after submission and after the resolution has been posted in accordance with the law.
- 3. The District will notify the Stanislaus and the San Joaquin County Elections Office that the District is prepared to pay the expense of mailing notice of approval of the change in election by the Stanislaus County and San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors as required by Elections Code §10404(f).
- 4. If consolidation of election is approved by the Boards of Supervisors, the date of that election for Divisions 1 and 4 will be moved to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of 2020 and that the date of election for Divisions 2, 3, and 5 will be moved to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2022.

Upon Motion of Director Altieri, seconded by Director Santos, and duly submitted to the Board for its consideration, the above-titled Resolution was adopted this 19th day of September, 2017.



On October 4, 2016 the Board of Directors approved the award of bid that included two Kobelco SK210LC excavators to Tri-West Tractor, Inc.; one with a complete set of attachments and one without attachments. At that time it was intended to use the attachments from our existing SK210 excavator and surplus this machine. With the amount of construction that is projected for the upcoming construction/maintenance season there is a need for an additional excavator of the same size. Rental charges for a Kobelco SK210 excavator with attachments would cost approximately \$8,000 per month for a duration of four months.

BACKGROUND AND/OR HISTORY:


The Lane Pipeline beginning on the north side of Sierra Road, through the Sierra Railroad Right of Way (ROW), to the south side of Knox Road has been found to have a number of leaks that are beyond the point of repair and is in need of replacement. The proposed Lane Pipeline Railroad Crossing Replacement Project plans are attached for reference. In order to replace the pipeline within the Sierra Railroad ROW, Sierra Northern Railway (Railroad) requires the execution of a Right of Entry and Indemnity Agreement (Agreement) and the associated fees be collected prior to the start of construction. Staff has coordinated with the Railroad to complete the proposed project through the Railroad ROW within a three (3) day window immediately following the end of the irrigation season. Given the need to replace the existing pipeline within the Railroad ROW, authorization for the General Manager to execute this Agreement on OID's behalf is being requested.



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CONTRACTOR'S RIGHT OF ENTRY AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT
THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of the day of 2017, by and between the SIERRA NORTHERN RAILWAY, a California Corporation (hereinafter the "Railroad"), and OAKDALE IRRIGATION DISTRICT (hereinafter the "Contractor").
RECITALS:
The Contractor has requested the Railroad to permit Contractor to enter upon the property of the Railroad, and the Railroad is agreeable thereto, subject to the following terms and conditions:
AGREEMENT:
NOW, THEREFORE , it is mutually agreed by and between the Railroad and Contractor, as follows:
Article 1. <u>DEFINITION OF CONTRACTOR</u> .
For the purposes of this Agreement, all references in this Agreement to the Contractor shall include the Contractor's contractors, subcontractors, officers, agents, and employees, and all others acting under its or their authority.
Article 2. RIGHT GRANTED; PURPOSE.
(brief description of work and location thereof to be performed by Contractor, include map if possible)
Replace Oakdale Irrigation District's Lane Pipeline within the Sierra Northern Railway right-of-way with a 21" 100 PSI PIP PVC carrier pipeline and 30" steel casing as shown on the attached Lane Pipline Railroad Crossing Replacement Project plan.
The Contractor plans to have personnel and equipment on the Railroad's right-of-way in order to complete these activities and services. The Contractor's work and related activities shall be hereinafter defined to be the "Work". The Railroad hereby grants to the Contractor the right, during the term hereinafter stated and upon the subject to each and all of the terms, provisions and conditions herein contained, to enter upon and have ingress to and egress from the portion of the Railroad's property in County, CA, on the Railroad's rights-of-way for the purpose of performing the Work on those portions of the Railroad's property as described herein, or as otherwise designated by the Railroad representative named in Article 4.

Article 3. TERMS AND CONDITIONS CONTAINED IN EXHIBITS A AND A-1

The terms and conditions contained in Exhibits A and A-1, attached hereto, are hereby made a part of this Agreement. In accordance with Section 1 of Exhibit A, Railroad will be specifically notified whenever Contractor will have personnel or equipment on Railroad's Right-of-Way. Contractor understands and agrees that unless such notice is provided to Railroad (telephone notice will be adequate) that any such personnel will be subject to removal from Railroad's property until such notice is given. No equipment may be operated within 20 feet of Railroad's track without specific notice to Railroad and Railroad's agreement as to timing, flagman requirements, and other protection means that may be required.

Article 4. <u>ALL EXPENSES TO BE BORNE BY CONTRACTOR; RAILROAD REPRESENTATIVE.</u>

The Contractor shall bear any and all costs and expenses associated with any Work performed by the Contractor, or any costs or expenses incurred by the Railroad relating to damage caused by the Contractor. All Work performed by Contractor on Railroad's property shall be performed in a manner satisfactory to the General Manager or the Track and Maintenance Manager of the Railroad (hereinafter the "Railroad Representative").

Article 5. TERM, TERMINATION.

- A. The grant of right herein made to Contractor shall commence on date of execution hereof and continue until **November 2, 2017**, unless sooner terminated as herein provided, or at such time as Contractor has completed its Work on Railroad's property, whichever is earlier. Contractor agrees to notify the Railroad Representative in writing when it has completed its Work on Railroad property.
- B. This Agreement may be terminated by either Party on ten (10) days' written notice to the other Party.

Article 6. <u>LICENSE AND OTHER FEES</u>.

As compensation to the Railroad for the rights herein granted and for the Railroad's administrative and other costs, the Contractor shall pay to the Railroad in accordance with the following schedule as a license fee:

The license fee shall be payable upon execution of this Agreement and the effectiveness of this Agreement is contingent upon payment of the license fee. Said license fee shall be in addition to

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any flagging, switching or other costs of the Railroad which are payable under the terms of this Agreement.

Article 7. CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE.

- A. Before commencing any Work, the Contractor will provide the Railroad with a certificate issued by its insurance carrier providing the insurance coverage required pursuant to Exhibit A-1 of this Agreement
- B. Contractor warrants that this Agreement has been thoroughly reviewed by its insurance agent(s)/broker(s) and the said agent(s)/broker(s) has been instructed to procure insurance coverage and an endorsement as required herein.
- C. All insurance correspondence shall be directed to: President, Sierra Northern Railway, 341 Industrial Way, Woodland, CA 95776, Telephone (530) 666-9646.

Article 8. ENFORCEABILITY; CHOICE OF LAW; CHOICE OF FORUM.

This Agreement shall be governed, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Litigation arising out of or connected with the Agreement shall be instituted and maintained only in the courts in Sacramento, California, and the parties consent to jurisdiction over their person and over the subject matter of any such litigation, in those courts, and consent to service of process issued by such courts.

Article 9. PAYMENT OF FEES, BILLS.

Contractor shall pay for all invoices rendered by Railroad in accordance with this Agreement within thirty (30) days of the date of the invoice (due date). In the event that an invoice has not been paid by the Contractor by the due date, a late payment charge of two percent (2%) of each unpaid payment shall be assessed immediately, and then a finance charge of two percent (2%) per month shall then be assessed on the outstanding balance (payments, late payment charges and interest) owed. Payments shall be applied first to interest, second to late payment charges, and then to the outstanding payments.

Article 10. NOTICES.

Each notice given pursuant to this agreement shall be effective when delivered by hand or upon mailing by certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, to the party for whom it is intended at the address set forth below or such other address as may be specified from time to time in writing by one party to the other.

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EXHIBIT A GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR CONTRACTOR'S RIGHT OF ENTRY AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

NOTICE OF COMMENCEMENT OF WORK - FLAGGING Section 1.

The Contractor agrees to notify the Railroad Representative at least 48 hours in advance of Contractor commencing its Work and at least 24 hours in advance of proposed performance of any Work by the Contractor in which any person or equipment will be within 20 feet of any track, or will be near enough to any track that any equipment extension (such as, but not limited to, a crane boom) will reach to with 20 feet of any track. Upon receipt of such notice, the Railroad Representative will determine and inform the Contractor whether a flagman need be present and whether the Contractor need implement any special protective or safety measures. If any flagmen or other special protective or safety measures are performed by the Railroad, such services will be provided at Contractor's expense with the understanding that if the Railroad provides any flagging or other services the Contractor shall not be relived of any of its responsibilities or liabilities set forth herein. If an emergency should arise requiring immediate attention, the Contractor shall provide as much notice as practicable to the Railroad before commencing any Work. Flagging or Railroad employee time to set and remove any necessary track worker protection is billed in hourly increments at \$75.00 per hour.

LIMITATION AND SUBORDINATION OF RIGHTS GRANTED. Section 2.

- The foregoing grant of right is subject and subordinate to the prior and continuing right and obligation of the Railroad to use and maintain its entire property, including the right and power of the Railroad to construct, maintain, repair, renew, use, operate, change, modify or relocate railroad tracks, signal, communication, fiber optics, or other wirelines, pipelines and other facilities upon, along or across any or all parts of its property, all or any of which may be freely done at any time or times by the Railroad without liability to the Contractor or to any other party for compensation or damages.
- The foregoing grant is also subject to all outstanding superior rights (including those in favor of licensees and lessees of the Railroad's property, and others) and the right of the Railroad to renew and extend the same, and is made without covenant of title or for quiet enjoyment.

NO INTERFERENCE WITH RAILROAD'S OPERATION. Section 3.

No Work performed by Contractor shall cause any interference whatsoever with the constant, continuous and uninterrupted use of the tracks, property and facilities of the Railroad, its lessees, licensees or others, unless specifically permitted under this Agreement, or specifically authorized in advance by the Railroad Representative. Nothing shall be done or suffered to be done by the Contractor at any time that would in any manner impair the safety thereof. When not in use, Contractor's machinery and materials shall be kept at least 50 feet from the centerline of Railroad's nearest track, and there shall be no crossings of Railroad's tracks except at existing open public crossings.

Section 4.

Prior to beginning any Work, the Contractor, at its sole expense, shall obtain all necessary permits to perform any Work contemplated by this Agreement.

MECHANIC'S LIENS.

Section 5. MECHANIC'S LIENS.

The Contractor shall pay in full all persons who perform labor or provide materials for the Work to be performed by Contractor.

The Contractor shall pay in full all persons who perform labor or provide materials for the Work to be performed by Contractor. The Contractor shall not permit or suffer any mechanic's or materialman's liens of any kind or nature to be enforced against any property of the Railroad for any such Work performed. The Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Railroad from and against any and all liens, claims, demands, costs or expenses of whatsoever nature in any way connected with or growing out of such Work done, labor performed, or materials furnished.

PROTECTION OF FIBER OPTIC CABLE SYSTEMS. Section 6.

- Fiber optic cable systems may be buried on the Railroad's property. Protection of the fiber optic cable systems is of extreme importance since any break could disrupt service to users resulting in business interruption and loss of revenue and profits. Contractor shall contact USA, and telephone the Union Pacific Railroad Company at 1-800-336-9193 (a 24-hour number) to determine if fiber optic cable is buried anywhere on the Railroad's Premises. If it is, Contractor or Union Pacific will telephone the telecommunications company(ies) involved, arrange for a cable locator, and make arrangements for relocation of other protection of the fiber optic cable prior to beginning any Work on Railroad's Premises.
- In addition to other indemnity provisions in this Agreement, the Contractor shall indemnify and hold the Railroad harmless against and from all cost, liability, and expense whatsoever (including, without limitation, attorney's fees and court costs and expenses) arising out of or in any way contributed to by any act or omission of the Contractor, its contractors, agents, and/or employees, that causes or in any way or degree contributes to (1) any damage to or destruction of any telecommunications system on Railroad's property, (2) any injury to or death of any person employed by or on behalf of any telecommunications company, and/or its contractors, agents, and/or employees, on Railroad's property, or (3) any claim or cause of action for alleged loss of profits or revenue by, or loss of service by a customer or user of, such telecommunication company(ies). Contractor shall not have or seek recourse against Railroad for any claim or cause of action for alleged loss of profits or revenue or loss of service or other consequential damage to a telecommunication company using Railroad's property or a customer or user of services of the fiber optic cable on Railroad' property.

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Section 7. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS.

In the prosecution of the Work covered by this Agreement, the Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations and enactments affecting the Work. The Contractor shall use only such methods as are consistent with safety, both as concerns the Contractor, the Contractor's agents and employees, the officers, agents, employees and property of the Railroad and the public in general. The Contractor (without limiting the generality of the foregoing) shall comply with all applicable state and federal occupation safety and health acts and regulations. All Federal Railroad Administration regulations shall be followed when Work is performed on the Railroad's property. If any failure by the Contractor to comply with any such laws, regulations, and enactments, shall result in any fine, penalty, cost or charge being assessed, imposed or charged against the Railroad, the Contractor shall reimburse and indemnify the Railroad for any such fine, penalty, cost, or charge, including without limitation attorney's fees, court costs and expenses. The Contractor further agrees, in the event of any such action and upon notice thereof being provided by the Railroad, to defend such action free of cost, charge, or expense to the Railroad.

Section 8. SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS.

Safety of personnel, property, rail operations and the public is of paramount importance in the prosecution of the Work pursuant to this Agreement. As reinforcement and in furtherance of overall safety measures to be observed by the Contractor (and not by way of limitation), the following special safety rules shall be followed:

- (a) The Contractor shall keep the job site free from safety and health hazards and ensure that its employees are competent and adequately trained in all safety and health aspects of the job. The Contractor shall have proper first aid supplies available on the job site so that prompt first aid services can be provided to any person that may be injured on the job site. The Contractor shall promptly notify the Railroad of any U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration reportable injuries occurring to any person that may arise during the Work performed on the job site. The Contractor shall have a non-delegable duty to control its employees, while they are on the job site or any other property of the Railroad to be certain they do not use, be under the influence of, or have in their possession, any alcoholic beverage or illegally obtained drug, narcotic or other substance.
- (b) The employees of the Contractor shall be suitably dressed to perform their duties safely and in a manner that will not interfere with their vision and hearing or free use of their hands or feet. Only waist length shirts with sleeves and trousers that cover the entire leg are to be worn. If flare-legged trouser are worn, the trouser bottoms must be tied to prevent catching. The employees should wear sturdy and protective footwear. Employees shall not wear boots (other than work boots), sandals, canvas-type shoes or other shoes that have thin soles or heels that are higher than normal. In addition, the Contractor shall require its employees to wear personal protective equipment as specified by Railroad rules, regulations or Railroad Officials overlooking the Work at the job site. In particular, the protective equipment to be worn shall be:
 - (1) Protective head gear that meets American National Standard Z89.1, latest revision. It is suggested that all hard-hats be affixed with Contractor's or subcontractor's company logo or name.
 - (2) Eye protection that meets American National Standard for occupational and educational eye and face protection, Z87.1, latest revision. Additional eye protection must be provided to meet specific job situations such as welding, grinding, burning, etc.; and
 - (3) Hearing protection which affords enough attenuation to give protection from noise levels that will be occurring on the job site.
- (c) All heavy equipment provided or leased by the Contractor shall be equipped with audible back-up warning devices. If in the opinion of the Railroad Representative any of Contractor's or any of its subcontractor's equipment is unsafe for use on the Railroad's right-of-way, the Contractor, at the request of the Railroad Representative, shall remove such equipment from the Railroad's right-of-way.
- (d) If the Contractor will have or does have men or equipment within 20 feet of the centerline of any track, then Contractor's employees who will be or are within such zone shall be trained in the Railroad's trackworker safety program prior to working within such limits, and shall follow all Railroad's trackworker safety rules and procedures. If Contractor's employees have been trained by another common carrier railroad within the last six months, only a refresher training will be required on the Railroad's trackworker safety program and rules. Contractor shall pay for the Railroad's trainer time at \$75.00 per hour. Strict compliance with the Railroad's trackworker safety program will be required at all times, and Contractor will indemnify and hold Railroad harmless from any fines or fees caused by Contractor's failure to comply at all times with Railroad's trackworker safety program.
- (e) The Contractor shall not cross and trackage of Railroad with any vehicles except at existing, open public crossings.
- (f) In live track operations, a distance of 20 feet from track must be maintained unless the contract necessitates working in close proximity to the track. When doing so, your employees and equipment must first have authorization of Railroad. When so authorized where work is in close proximity to tracks, a Railroad flagman must be present. Your employees must be familiar with procedures to clear men and equipment from track area for approaching trains. In addition, the following safety procedures shall be adhered to by all of your employees:

Always be on the alert for moving equipment while working near any railroad tracks or facilities.

Do not step or walk on the top of the rail, frog, switches, guard rails, or other track components.

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In passing around ends of standing cars, engines, railroad machinery, and other ontrack equipment, leave at least one rail car length (50 feet) between yourself and the end of the equipment.

Avoid walking or standing on track at any time.

When it is necessary to walk or work on track, always keep a sharp lookout in both directions for approaching trains.

Before stepping or crossing tracks, look in both directions first. The same is true when walking around machinery and equipment on and about the tracks.

Do not sit on, lie under, or cross between cars except as required in performance of your duty, and only when track and equipment are under proper protection.

In multiple track territory, do not stand on one track while a train is passing on another.

Section 9. INDEMNITY

- (a) As used in this Section, "Railroad" includes other railroad companies using the Railroad's property at or near the location of the Contractor's installation and their officers, agents and employees; "Loss" includes loss, damage, claims, demands, actions, causes of action, penalties, costs, and expenses of whatsoever nature, including court costs and attorneys' fees, which may result from: (1) injury to or death of persons whomsoever (including the Railroad's officers, agents and employees, the Contractor's officers, agents and employees, as well as any other person); and (2) damage to or loss or destruction of property whatsoever (including Contractor's property, adjacent property and crops, the roadbed, tracks, equipment or other property of the Railroad, or property in its care or custody).
- (b) As a major inducement and in consideration of the license and permission herein granted, the Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Railroad from any Loss which is due to or arises from any cause and is associated in whole or part with the Work performed under this Agreement, a breach of this Agreement, the failure to observe the health and safety provisions herein, or any activity or omission arising our of performance or nonperformance of this Agreement. However, the Contractor shall not indemnify the Railroad when the Loss is caused by the sole negligence of the Railroad.
- (c) The Contractor accepts the Railroad's property in its present condition and hereby assumes the risk of any injury to and death of persons and damage to or destruction of property resulting from the condition of or any defects anywhere in or upon the Railroad's, regardless of whether such condition or defects are known or unknown, apparent or latent, and regardless of whether such condition or defects exist at the commencement of this Lease or at some later time.

Section 10. RESTORATION OF RAILROAD'S PROPERTY.

In the event the Railroad authorizes the Contractor to take down any fence or structure of the Railroad or in any manner move or disturb any of the other property of the Railroad in connection with the Work to be performed by the Contractor, then in that event the Contractor shall, as soon as possible and at Contractor's sole expense, restore such fence or structure and other property to the same condition as the same were in before such fence was taken down or such other property was moved or disturbed, and the Contractor shall indemnify and hold hamless the Railroad, its officers, agents and employees, against and from any and all liability, loss, damages, claims, demands, costs and expenses of whatsoever nature, including court costs and attorneys' fees, which may result from injury to or death of persons whomsoever, or damage to or loss or destruction of property whatsoever, when such injury, death, damage, loss or destruction grows out of or arises from the taking down of any fence or the moving or disturbance of any other property of the Railroad. The Railroad will not pay Contractor for any betterments or improvements in such fence and other property that may be made by the Contractor.

Section 11. WAIVER OF BREACH.

The waiver by the Railroad of the breach of any condition, covenant, or agreement herein contained to be kept, observed and performed by the Contractor shall in no way impair the right of the Railroad to avail itself of any subsequent breach thereof.

Section 12. <u>ASSIGNMENT - SUBCONTRACTING</u>.

The Contractor shall not assign, sublet or subcontract this Agreement, or any interest therein, without the written consent of the Railroad, and any attempt to so assign, sublet or subcontract without the written consent of the Railroad shall be void. If the Railroad gives the Contractor permission to subcontract all or any portion of the Work herein described, the Contractor is and shall remain responsible for all Work of subcontractors and all Work of subcontractors shall be governed by the terms of this Agreement.

Section 13. PREPARATION OF AGREEMENT.

For purposes of construction, this Agreement shall be deemed to have been drafted by all Parties, and no ambiguity shall be resolved against any Party by virtue of his, her or its participation in the drafting of the Agreement.

Section 14. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>.

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If any provision, paragraph, section, clause, or sentence of this Agreement is illegal, void, invalid, or otherwise prohibited or unenforceable by a court or other authority with jurisdiction thereof, the remaining provisions, paragraphs, sections, clauses, and sentences shall be severable and shall remain in full force and effect. Any such prohibition or unenforceability in any jurisdiction shall not prohibit or render unenforceable any such provision in any other jurisdiction. To the extent permitted by applicable law, the Parties hereby waive any provision of law that renders any provision of this Agreement prohibited or unenforceable in any respect.

Section 15. COUNTERPARTS.

This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, may be executed via facsimile transmission or by scanning the document and making .pdf files allowing electronic transmission, and all signatures need not appear on the same signature page of the document. Each counterpart shall be deemed an original, but all such counterparts together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

Section 16. EXECUTION.

The Parties agree and represent that they have read this Agreement in its entirety, reviewed it with their respective counsel, and understand its contents. Each of the persons executing this Agreement warrants that he or she has the right and power to enter into this Agreement on behalf of the Party for whom he or she is representing that he or she is executing this Agreement.

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EXHIBIT A-1 Contractor's Right of Entry and Indemnity Agreement Insurance Requirements

The Contractor shall, at its own and/or its own sole cost and expense, procure the following kinds of insurance and promptly pay when due all premiums for that insurance. The following insurance shall be kept in force during the life of this Agreement:

General Public Liability insurance providing bodily injury, including death, personal injury and property damage coverage with a combined single limit of at least \$2,000,000 each occurrence or claim and at all times an unimpaired aggregate limit of at least \$2,000,000 and name the Railroad and any railroad operating over its tracks as an additional insured with respect to all liabilities arising out of Contractor's obligations to Railroad in the Agreement.

Automobile Public Liability insurance providing bodily injury and property damage coverage with a combined single limit of at least \$1,000,000 each occurrence or claim and at all times an unimpaired aggregate limit of at least \$1,000,000. This insurance shall provide contractual liability covering all motor vehicles including hired and non-owned and mobile equipment to the extent it may be excluded from the general liability insurance.

Workers' Compensation insurance covering the statutory liability as determined by the compensation laws of the state(s) affected by this Agreement and Employer's Liability. Also Contractor shall comply with all laws of states which require participation in their state workers' compensation fund.

Contractor's insurance shall be primary with respect to any insurance carried by the Railroad.

Contractor's insurance shall not contain any exclusions for work performed or Contractor's activities on or near a railroad or railroad track

The Contractor shall furnish to Railroad certificate(s) of insurance hereto evidencing the required coverage and endorsements and upon request a certified duplicate original of any of those policies. The insurance company(ies) issuing such policies shall notify the Railroad in writing of any material alteration including any change in the retroactive date in any "claims made" policies or reduction of aggregate limits below the required amounts set forth above, if such limits apply, or cancellation thereof at least thirty (30) days prior thereto.

The insurance policy(ies) shall be written by a reputable insurance company or companies acceptable to the Railroad or with a current Best's Insurance Guide Rating of B and Class VII or better. Such insurance company(ies) shall be authorized to transact business in the state of California.

ENCROACHMENT PERMIT ON THE SOUTH MAIN CANAL AND PAULSELL LATERAL

THIS ENCROACHMENT PERMIT executed this THIRD day of OCTOBER, 2017, by and between OAKDALE IRRIGATION DISTRICT, an irrigation district organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and SOUTH MAIN PUMP, LLC, hereinafter referred to as "OWNER" sets forth Permits as follows:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the DISTRICT adopted the request for an Encroachment Permit on October 3, 2017, as shown in the Resolution attached hereto as **Exhibit "A."**

WHEREAS, DISTRICT occupies easements and fee-owned lands for its irrigation and drainage facilities, and

WHEREAS, OWNER'S property described in the attached **Exhibit "B"** (the "Subject Property") is subject to all or a portion of said easements, and

WHEREAS, OWNER has title to the Subject Property and wishes to encroach upon the SOUTH MAIN CANAL and PAULSELL LATERAL right-of-ways with encroachments as follows:

- 1. One (1) existing 24" 0.25 wall steel private pipeline crossing over the South Main Canal.
- 2. One (1) existing 12" private agricultural filter station backflush discharge pipeline on the South Main Canal.
- 3. One (1) existing 8" private agricultural backflush discharge pipeline on the South Main Canal.
- 4. One (1) existing 12" CL 125 PVC private pipeline crossing the South Main Canal.
- 5. One (1) existing private agricultural bridge crossing the South Main Canal.
- 6. One (1) existing 8" CL 125 PVC private pipeline crossing over the South Main Tunnel.
- 7. One (1) existing 18" CL 125 PVC private pipeline crossing the South Main Canal.

- 8. One (1) existing private agricultural bridge crossing the South Main Canal.
- 9. One (1) existing 10" private agricultural backflush discharge pipeline on the South Main Canal.
- 10. One (1) existing 5" CL 125 PVC private pipeline crossing the Paulsell Lateral.
- 11. One (1) existing private agricultural bridge crossing the Paulsell Lateral.

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is willing to permit said encroachments provided the OWNER agrees to the following provisions:

- 1. <u>Nature of Right Conferred.</u> This Permit is valid only for the purposes specified herein, and neither the Permit, nor use there under shall create an easement, right-of-way, or other interest in real property owned by DISTRICT.
 - DISTRICT intends hereby to assent only to (a) an encroachment upon an easement or easements held by DISTRICT or (b) to confer a license to OWNER to encroach upon DISTRICT fee-owned lands, all subject to the terms hereof. Nothing in this Permit constitutes a grant or other disposition of any land or interest in land, which is owned or otherwise occupied by DISTRICT. OWNER acknowledges that the lands upon which the facilities of DISTRICT are located may not be owned by DISTRICT, and further acknowledges that the consent contained in this Permit relates only to the rights of DISTRICT by virtue of an easement or easements upon Subject Property or upon land owned in fee by DISTRICT. It is understood that nothing in this Permit shall be considered as a representation by DISTRICT of the authority to grant any interest in land over, across, or under any property owned or controlled by any person other than DISTRICT and OWNER shall obtain any further grants or consents from all others owning interests in the underlying easement land.
- 2. Assignments, Sublicenses and Termination. The right to use or maintain the encroachments listed above on the subject DISTRICT facility as authorized herein shall be transferrable to OWNER'S successors or assigns, however, OWNER may not, without the prior written consent of DISTRICT, authorize or permit others to utilize any facilities, structures, easements or right-of-way area which are in any way not expressly authorized by this Permit. Should OWNER wish to terminate this permit, written notice shall first be provided to DISTRICT. Upon approval, DISTRICT may request with 30 days written notice, the removal or relocation of all or portions of OWNER'S encroachments and OWNER shall perform the required work at no cost to DISTRICT. Should OWNER'S encroachments not be removed within the specified time, DISTRICT shall remove the encroachments and bill OWNER for all costs incurred.
- 3. Operational Access. DISTRICT shall have the right of necessary ingress to and egress from said strip of land at any and all times for people with tools and/or equipment required for the repair, replacement, maintenance and/or operation of that irrigation canal or pipeline system and appurtenant facilities located within DISTRICT right-of-way. OWNER's encroachment shall not interfere with DISTRICT's operational use of its irrigation and drainage facilities.

For emergency purposes OWNER will be required to remove encroachments immediately upon request by DISTRICT. If it should be necessary to repair or replace DISTRICT facilities, DISTRICT is not liable for damages or resultant damages to the permitted encroachments within the DISTRICT'S easement. Further, the repair and replacement of OWNER encroachments following DISTRICT maintenance and reconstruction efforts shall be performed by OWNER and at the expense of OWNER.

THIS PERMIT shall be a covenant binding upon both DISTRICT and OWNER.





ENCROACHMENT PERMIT ON THE CAPE HORN LATERAL, LESNINI LATERAL, AND TULLOCH PIPELINE

THIS ENCROACHMENT PERMIT executed this THIRD day of OCTOBER, 2017, by and between OAKDALE IRRIGATION DISTRICT, an irrigation district organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and HOLTHOUSE RANCH, LLC, hereinafter referred to as "OWNER" sets forth Permits as follows:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the DISTRICT adopted the request for an Encroachment Permit on October 3, 2017, as shown in the Resolution attached hereto as **Exhibit "A."**

WHEREAS, DISTRICT occupies easements and fee-owned lands for its irrigation and drainage facilities, and

WHEREAS, OWNER'S property described in the attached **Exhibit "B"** (the "Subject Property") is subject to all or a portion of said easements, and

WHEREAS, OWNER has title to the Subject Property and wishes to encroach upon the CAPE HORN LATERAL, LESNINI LATERAL, AND TULLOCH PIPELINE right-of-ways with encroachments as follows:

- Existing orchard trees and all associated private irrigation facilities and appurtenances for the maintenance and installation of the orchard, along with the right to prepare the land within the Cape Horn Lateral easement and fee-owned lands for said orchard, including the right to backfill and grade the open ditch portions of the lateral.
- 2. One (1) existing 12" sch. 40 steel private agricultural backflush discharge pipeline on the Cape Horn Tunnel Outlet.

- 3. One (1) existing 10" 100 PIP PVC private irrigation pipeline crossing the Lesnini Lateral
- 4. One (1) existing 24" private concrete culvert crossing the Tulloch Pipeline

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is willing to permit said encroachments provided the OWNER agrees to the following provisions:

- 1. <u>Nature of Right Conferred.</u> This Permit is valid only for the purposes specified herein, and neither the Permit, nor use there under shall create an easement, right-of-way, or other interest in real property owned by DISTRICT.
 - DISTRICT intends hereby to assent only to (a) an encroachment upon an easement or easements held by DISTRICT or (b) to confer a license to OWNER to encroach upon DISTRICT fee-owned lands, all subject to the terms hereof. Nothing in this Permit constitutes a grant or other disposition of any land or interest in land, which is owned or otherwise occupied by DISTRICT. OWNER acknowledges that the lands upon which the facilities of DISTRICT are located may not be owned by DISTRICT, and further acknowledges that the consent contained in this Permit relates only to the rights of DISTRICT by virtue of an easement or easements upon Subject Property or upon land owned in fee by DISTRICT. It is understood that nothing in this Permit shall be considered as a representation by DISTRICT of the authority to grant any interest in land over, across, or under any property owned or controlled by any person other than DISTRICT and OWNER shall obtain any further grants or consents from all others owning interests in the underlying easement land.
- 2. <u>Assignments, Sublicenses and Termination.</u> The right to use or maintain the encroachments listed above on the subject DISTRICT facility as authorized herein shall be transferrable to OWNER'S successors or assigns, however, OWNER may not, without the prior written consent of DISTRICT, authorize or permit others to utilize any facilities, structures, easements or right-of-way area which are in any way not expressly authorized by this Permit. Should OWNER wish to terminate this permit, written notice shall first be provided to DISTRICT. Upon approval, DISTRICT may request with 30 days written notice, the removal or relocation of all or portions of OWNER'S encroachments and OWNER shall perform the required work at no cost to DISTRICT. Should OWNER'S encroachments not be removed within the specified time, DISTRICT shall remove the encroachments and bill OWNER for all costs incurred.
- 3. Operational Access. DISTRICT shall have the right of necessary ingress to and egress from said strip of land at any and all times for people with tools and/or equipment required for the repair, replacement, maintenance and/or operation of that irrigation canal or pipeline system and appurtenant facilities located within DISTRICT right-of-way. OWNER's encroachment shall not interfere with DISTRICT's operational use of its irrigation and drainage facilities.

For emergency purposes OWNER will be required to remove encroachments immediately upon request by DISTRICT. If it should be necessary to repair or replace DISTRICT facilities, DISTRICT is not liable for damages or resultant damages to the permitted encroachments within the DISTRICT'S easement. Further, the repair and replacement of OWNER encroachments following DISTRICT maintenance and reconstruction efforts shall be performed by OWNER and at the expense of OWNER.

THIS PERMIT shall be a covenant binding upon both DISTRICT and OWNER.





PROJECT MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION AND ASSOCIATED CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) FINDINGS

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Approve

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION: A Draft Mitigated Negative Declaration (DMND) and Initial Study (IS) was prepared for the Phase I Total Channel Control System Modernization Project (Project) pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The Project will involve the removal and replacement of selected canal structures on existing water conveyance facilities, specifically OID's Burnett, Kearney, Hirschfeld, and Tulloch Laterals. The existing canal structures consist of centerline drop structures and landowner delivery structures, or turnouts. Automated canal gates, flow control, and measurement devices will be installed to replace existing center gates and some landowner turnouts as part of the Project. Total Channel Control (TCC) refers to an operational mode in which the gates along a given canal communicate to each other, so that fluctuations in flow can be compensated by the neighboring gates automatically. There will be no new water conveyance facilities constructed as part of the Project, and all work will take place within OID's existing canal footprint and rights of way.

In 2007, OID completed a Water Resources Plan Programmatic Environmental Impact Report (WRP PEIR) to analyze impacts of the implementation of the proposed Water Resources Plan. The WRP PEIR addressed specific capital improvement projects, as well as on-going OID projects such as the turnout replacement program and flow control and measurement projects. The proposed Project is within the scope of the WRP PEIR. The Project consists of construction activities that are consistent with those capital improvements reviewed in the WRP PEIR as part of the OID turnout replacement and flow control and measurement programs. The potential impacts described in the WRP PEIR were identified as (and remain) applicable to the entire District, and appropriate avoidance/mitigation measures identified in the WRP PEIR will be incorporated into the Project with a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP). An updated list of State and Federally threatened or endangered species that have the potential to occur within the OID boundary has been developed along with associated habitat and avoidance measures in part taken from the WRP PEIR and revised as necessary for the Project.

Based on the information evaluated in the IS, staff prepared a DMND. The documents were posted on OID's website, at the County Clerk-Recorder offices in Stanislaus and San Joaquin Counties, and circulated to trustee, responsible and other agencies for CEQA review via the State Clearinghouse and direct mailing for 32 days. A Public Hearing was noticed in the Manteca Bulletin, Escalon Times, and Oakdale Leader and held on Tuesday, September 5, 2017. The comment period began on August 11, 2017 and ended on September 11, 2017.

Comments made at the public hearing and the written comments received along with OID responses to those comments are attached as Exhibits A and B. The comment letters and DMND/IS Referral Distribution List are attached as Exhibit C. After consideration of all the comments and information provided, OID has prepared an MMRP and a Statement of Findings. The Statement of Findings, MMRP, Exhibits A, B, C, and the DMND/IS, incorporated by reference, are included as part of the Final NOD. The Final NOD will be made available at the OID office to all interested parties for review.

In light of the fact that there will not be significant or adverse impacts to the environment as a result of the Project because OID has agreed to and will incorporate certain mitigation measures, Staff recommends approval of the Resolution adopting the MND and associated CEQA findings for the Project.

FISCAL IMPACT: A total of \$2323.25; inclusive of the \$2,216.25 Department of Fish and Wildlife environmental filing fee per Fish and Game Code Section 711.4 and applicable County Clerk-Recorder offices filing fees.

Comment: Robert Frobose asked if the District was using Rubicon on this project and if the District was looking into any other devices except Rubicon.

Response: Eric Thorburn, OID Water Operations Manager, responded to Mr. Frobose's comment at the public hearing. He stated that the District is using Rubicon gates on this project, and that Rubicon is the only company that offers the Total Channel Control system.

There being no further public comment; public comment closed at 9:16 a.m.

RESPONSES TO WRITTEN COMMENTS RECEIVED ON THE PHASE I TOTAL CHANNEL CONTROL SYSTEM MODERNIZATION PROJECT

Please note that many of the comments herein are paraphrased; see Exhibit C for the complete written comments.

Comments from the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) Received 9/5/2017 :

Comment #1: The Central Valley Water Board is required to formulate and adopt Basin Plans for all areas within the Central Valley region under Section 13240 of the Porter Cologne Water Quality Control Act. Each Basin Plan must contain water quality objectives to ensure the reasonable protection of beneficial uses, as well as a program of implementation for achieving water quality objectives with the Basin Plans.

Response: The proposed Phase I Total Channel Control System Modernization Project (Project) will be consistent with existing Basin Plans. The Project is not anticipated to have any impact on water quality objectives of the Basin Plans.

Comment #2: All wastewater dischargers must comply with the Antidegradation Policy (State Water Board Resolution 68-16) and the Antidegradation Implementation Policy contained in the Basin Plan. The environmental review document should evaluate potential impacts to both surface and groundwater quality.

Response: The Project will not involve the discharge of wastewater. The mitigation measures that are proposed to be incorporated into the Project are anticipated to minimize any impact to surface or groundwater quality altogether.

Comment #3: Construction General Permit for Storm Water Discharges associated with Construction Activities (Construction General Permit) and a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) may be required.

Response: A SWPPP is not required for the Project given that each construction site is anticipated to be considerably less than one aces in size, and while several construction sites may be located on the same OID canal, they are not contiguous. OID has however, voluntarily elected to prepare and implement a SWPPP for the Project to prevent stormwater pollution as a result of Project activities.

Comment #4: Phase I and II Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permits may be required.

Response: There is no development or redevelopment included in the Project, therefore, this permit will not be required.

Comment #5: Storm water dischargers associated with industrial sites must comply with the regulations contained in the Industrial Storm Water General Permit Order No. 2014-0057-DWQ.

Response: No industrial site development is included in the Project; therefore, this permit will not be required.

Comment #6: Clean Water Act Section 404 Permit (404 Permit) may be required. If the project requires surface water drainage realignment, the applicant is advised to contact the Department of Fish and Game for information on Streambed Alteration Permit requirements.

Response: There is no discharge of dredged or fill material into navigable waters or wetlands included in the Project; therefore, a 404 Permit will not be required. No surface water drains will be realigned as part of the Project.

Comment #7: A Clean Water Act Section 401 Permit (401 Permit) – Water Quality Certification may be required.

Response: A 404 Permit or other federal permit is not required; therefore, a 401 Water Quality Certification is not required.

Comment #8a: A Waste Discharge Requirement (WDR) permit may be required if there are discharges into waters of the State, including wetlands and isolated wetlands.

Response: Construction will not take place within waters of the State. OID will incorporate the mitigation measures identified in the IS/MND, and also BMPs specified in the SWPPP to prevent discharge to any waterway.

Comment #8b: If the project will involve dredging, Water Quality Certification for the dredging activity and Waste Discharge Requirements for the land disposal may be needed.

Response: The Project will not involve any dredging; therefore, a Water Quality Certification is not required.

Comment #8c: Pursuant to the State's OWTS Policy, regulation of septic tank and leach field systems may be regulated under the local agency's management program in lieu of WDRs.

Response: The Project does not include the installation of any septic tank and leach field systems.

Comment #9: If the proposed project includes construction or groundwater dewatering to be discharged to land, the proponent may apply for coverage under the State Water Board General Water Quality Order, or the Central Valley Water Board's Waiver of Report of Water Discharge and Waste Discharge Requirements may be required.

Response: The Project does not include construction or groundwater dewatering to be discharged to the land; therefore, coverage under these permits will not be required.

Comment #10: If the property will be used for commercially irrigated agriculture, the discharger will be required to obtain regulatory coverage under the Irrigated Lands Regulatory Program.

Response: The landuse of the surrounding private property is agricultural; however, all work will take place within OID's existing canal right-of-way and therefore this coverage is not required for the Project.

Comment #11: A Low or Limited Threat General NPDES Permit may be required if the proposed project, includes construction dewatering and it is necessary to discharge the groundwater to waters of the United States.

Response: There will be no discharge of groundwater to waters of the United States.

Comment #12: If the proposed project discharges waste that could affect the quality of the waters of the State, other than into a community sewer system, the proposed project will require coverage under an NPDES permit.

Response: The Project will not involve the discharge of waste water into waters of the State.

Comments from the Stanislaus County Environmental Review Committee Received 9/8/2017:

Comment #1: The Stanislaus County Environmental Review Committee (ERC) has reviewed the subject project and has no comments at this time.

Response: Comment noted.

Response to comments from the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District (SJVAPCD) Received 9/14/2017:

Comment #1: The IS/MND submitted to the District does not provide sufficient information to allow the District to assess the Project's potential impact on air quality. Therefore, the District recommends that a more detailed preliminary review be provided. Preliminary review documents should include, at a minimum, the Project size, estimates of potential construction and operational emissions (for example, mobile and stationary emission sources), and proximity to sensitive receptors and existing emission sources.

Response: A more detailed project description has been provided to the SJVAPCD, including a defined project site and estimated construction timeline. The Project will not cause an increase in operational emissions and is not in proximity to sensitive receptors

Comment #2: It is uncertain if the mitigation measures identified in the WRP PEIR would be implemented if found significant.

Response: The mitigation measures identified for implementation have been included in a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP), which will be included for approval as part of the the final NOD.

Comment #3: It should be noted that although compliance with District Regulation VIII reduces Project specific fugitive dust emissions, it may not be sufficient to reduce Project specific fugitive dust emissions to a less than significant level.

Response: Comment noted.

Comment #4: The District recommends incorporating, as a condition of Project approval, a requirement that off-road construction equipment used on site achieve fleet average emissions equal to or less than Tier III emissions standard of 4.8 NOx g/hp-hr. This can be achieved through any combination of uncontrolled engines and engines complying with Tier III and above engine standards.

Response: Approximately 80% of OID's equipment fleet complies with Tier III and above engine standards. A requirement that only Tier III and above equipment be used on the Project has been incorporated into the MMRP.

Comment #5: The District's GAMAQI is available and should be used as guidance for the review of proposed projects under CEQA within the boundaries of the District.

Response: Comment noted. The QAMAQI was used as guidance to identify mitigation measures that were presented in the WRP PEIR and will be incorporated into the Project.

Comment #6: If the preliminary review concludes that emissions resulting from construction and/or operation of the Project would exceed the following thresholds of significance: 10 tons per year of NOx, 10 tons per year of ROG, or 15 tons per year of PM10, the District recommends that additional environmental review of the Project's potential impact on air quality be conducted.

Response: Operation of the completed Project will not cause an increase in emissions, as the automated canal gates are solar powered and do not produce any emissions.

Comment #7a: Nuisance Odors should be discussed as to whether the Project would create objectionable odors affecting a substantial number of people.

Response: Construction of the Project will not generate a significant odor, and since the construction sites are located in rural agricultural areas there is not anticipated to be any effect on a substantial number of people.

Comment #7b: If the Project is located near residential/sensitive receptors, the Project should be evaluated to determine the health impact of TACs to the near-by receptors.

Response: The Project is not located near residential/sensitive receptors. The construction sites are located on OID canals in rural agricultural areas.

Comment #8: If preliminary review indicates that a Mitigated Negative Declaration should be prepared, in addition to the effects identified above, the document should include mitigation measures and effects on the District's attainment status.

Response: A Mitigated Negative Declaration has been prepared which specifies mitigation measures to reduce the impact of PM10 and exhaust emissions.

Comment #9: If preliminary review indicates that an EIR should be prepared, the document should also include a discussion of the methodology and model parameters used, and a discussion of the components and phases of the Project and associated emission projections.

Response: Upon completion of the Initial Study, OID has determined there are no potentially significant impacts associated with the project, and therefore an EIR is not required.

Comment #10: If the proposed project equals or exceeds 9,000 square feet of development space, the Project may be subject to District Rule 9510 (Indirect Source Review).

Response: The SJVAPCD adopted Rule 9510 to reduce the impacts of grown in emissions from all new land development in the San Joaquin Valley. There is no new land development included as part of the proposed Project. Upon further conversation, OID has received concurrence from the SJVAPCD that the Project does not meet the definition of a "development project", and therefore Rule 9510 does not apply to the Project. Please refer to the SJVAPCD follow up letter included in Exhibit C.

Comment #11: Prior to the start of construction the Project proponent should contact the District's Small Business Assistance Office to determine if an Authority to Construct (ATC) is required.

Response: OID will not be building, altering, or replacing any operations or equipment which may emit air contaminants as part of the Project, and therefore and ATC is not required for the Project.

Comment #12: The Project may be subject to the following District rules: Regulation VIII, Rule 4102, Rule 4601, Rule 4641, and Rule 4002.

Response: The Project is subject to and OID will adhere to the measures specified in Regulation VIII. In accordance with Rule 4102, air contaminants will not be discharged in quantities which cause injury, detriment, nuisance or annoyance to any considerable number of persons or endanger the health and safety of the public as a result of the Project. Since however, the Project does not involve architectural coatings or the use of asphalt, Rules 4641 and 4002 do not apply to the Project.

COMMENTS TO REQUEST FOR REVIEW FOR THE MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION, PHASE I TOTAL CHANNEL CONTROL SYSTEM MODERNIZATION PROJECT, SCH# 2017082028, STANISLAUS AND SAN JOAQUIN COUNTIES

Pursuant to the State Clearinghouse's 10 August 2017 request, the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) has reviewed the *Request for Review for the Mitigated Negative Declaration* for the Phase I Total Channel Control System Modernization Project, located in Stanislaus and San Joaquin Counties.

Our agency is delegated with the responsibility of protecting the quality of surface and groundwaters of the state; therefore our comments will address concerns surrounding those issues.

I. Regulatory Setting

Basin Plan

The Central Valley Water Board is required to formulate and adopt Basin Plans for all areas within the Central Valley region under Section 13240 of the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act. Each Basin Plan must contain water quality objectives to ensure the reasonable protection of beneficial uses, as well as a program of implementation for achieving water quality objectives with the Basin Plans. Federal regulations require each state to adopt water quality standards to protect the public health or welfare, enhance the quality of water and serve the purposes of the Clean Water Act. In California, the beneficial uses, water quality objectives, and the Antidegradation Policy are the State's water quality standards. Water quality standards are also contained in the National Toxics Rule, 40 CFR Section 131.36, and the California Toxics Rule, 40 CFR Section 131.38.

The Basin Plan is subject to modification as necessary, considering applicable laws, policies, technologies, water quality conditions and priorities. The original Basin Plans were adopted in 1975, and have been updated and revised periodically as required, using Basin Plan amendments. Once the Central Valley Water Board has adopted a Basin Plan amendment in noticed public hearings, it must be approved by the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board), Office of Administrative Law (OAL) and in some cases,

the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA). Basin Plan amendments only become effective after they have been approved by the OAL and in some cases, the USEPA. Every three (3) years, a review of the Basin Plan is completed that assesses the appropriateness of existing standards and evaluates and prioritizes Basin Planning issues.

In part it states:

Any discharge of waste to high quality waters must apply best practicable treatment or control not only to prevent a condition of pollution or nuisance from occurring, but also to maintain the highest water quality possible consistent with the maximum benefit to the people of the State.

This information must be presented as an analysis of the impacts and potential impacts of the discharge on water quality, as measured by background concentrations and applicable water quality objectives.

The antidegradation analysis is a mandatory element in the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System and land discharge Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) permitting processes. The environmental review document should evaluate potential impacts to both surface and groundwater quality.

II. Permitting Requirements

Construction Storm Water General Permit

Dischargers whose project disturb one or more acres of soil or where projects disturb less than one acre but are part of a larger common plan of development that in total disturbs one or more acres, are required to obtain coverage under the General Permit for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Construction Activities (Construction General Permit), Construction General Permit Order No. 2009-009-DWQ. Construction activity subject to this permit includes clearing, grading, grubbing, disturbances to the ground, such as stockpiling, or excavation, but does not include regular maintenance activities performed to restore the original line, grade, or capacity of the facility. The Construction General Permit requires the development and implementation of a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan

(SWPPP).

Phase I and II Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permits¹

The Phase I and II MS4 permits require the Permittees reduce pollutants and runoff flows from new development and redevelopment using Best Management Practices (BMPs) to the maximum extent practicable (MEP). MS4 Permittees have their own development standards, also known as Low Impact Development (LID)/post-construction standards that include a hydromodification component. The MS4 permits also require specific design concepts for LID/post-construction BMPs in the early stages of a project during the entitlement and CEQA process and the development plan review process.

If an USACOE permit (e.g., Non-Reporting Nationwide Permit, Nationwide Permit, Letter of Permission, Individual Permit, Regional General Permit, Programmatic General Permit), or any other federal permit (e.g., Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act or Section 9 from the United States Coast Guard), is required for this project due to the disturbance (i.e., discharge of dredge or fill material) of waters of the United States (such as streams and wetlands), then a Water Quality Certification must be obtained from the Central Valley Water Board prior to initiation of project activities. There are no waivers for 401 Water Quality Certifications.

Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs)

Discharges to Waters of the State

If USACOE determines that only non-jurisdictional waters of the State (i.e., "non-federal" waters of the State) are present in the proposed project area, the proposed project may require a Waste Discharge Requirement (WDR) permit to be issued by Central Valley Water Board. Under the California Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act, discharges to all waters of the State, including all wetlands and other waters of the State including, but not limited to, isolated wetlands, are subject to State regulation.

Land Disposal of Dredge Material

If the project will involve dredging, Water Quality Certification for the dredging activity and Waste Discharge Requirements for the land disposal may be needed.

Local Agency Oversite

Pursuant to the State Water Board's Onsite Wastewater Treatment Systems Policy (OWTS Policy), the regulation of septic tank and leach field systems may be regulated under the local agency's management program in lieu of WDRs. A county environmental health department may permit septic tank and leach field systems designed for less than 10,000 gpd. Dewatering Permit

If the proposed project includes construction or groundwater dewatering to be discharged to land, the proponent may apply for coverage under State Water Board General Water Quality Order (Low Risk General Order) 2003-0003 or the Central Valley Water Board's Waiver of Report of Waste Discharge and Waste Discharge Requirements (Low Risk Waiver) R5-2013-0145. Small temporary construction dewatering projects are projects that discharge groundwater to land from excavation activities or dewatering of underground utility vaults. Dischargers seeking coverage under the General Order or Waiver must file a Notice of Intent with the Central Valley Water Board prior to beginning discharge.

Regulatory Compliance for Commercially Irrigated Agriculture

If the property will be used for commercial irrigated agricultural, the discharger will be required to obtain regulatory coverage under the Irrigated Lands Regulatory Program. There are two options to comply:

- 1. Obtain Coverage Under a Coalition Group. Join the local Coalition Group that supports land owners with the implementation of the Irrigated Lands Regulatory Program. The Coalition Group conducts water quality monitoring and reporting to the Central Valley Water Board on behalf of its growers. The Coalition Groups charge an annual membership fee, which varies by Coalition Group. Dischargers not participating in a third-party group (Coalition) are regulated individually. Depending on the specific site conditions, growers may be required to monitor runoff from their property, install monitoring wells, and submit a notice of intent, farm plan, and other

action plans regarding their actions to comply with their General Order. Yearly costs would include State administrative fees (for example, annual fees for farm sizes from 10-100 acres are currently \$1,084 + \$6.70/Acre); the cost to prepare annual monitoring reports; and water quality monitoring costs. Low or Limited Threat General NPDES Permit

If the proposed project includes construction dewatering and it is necessary to discharge the groundwater to waters of the United States, the proposed project will require coverage under a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit. Dewatering discharges are typically considered a low or limited threat to water quality and may be covered under the General Order for *Dewatering and Other Low Threat Discharges to Surface Waters* (Low Threat General Order) or the General Order for *Limited Threat Discharges of Treated/Untreated Groundwater from Cleanup Sites, Wastewater from Superchlorination Projects, and Other Limited Threat Wastewaters to Surface Water* (Limited Threat General Order). A complete application must be submitted to the Central Valley Water Board to obtain coverage under these General NPDES permits.

The San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District (District) has reviewed the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) referenced above consisting of the removal and replacement of selected canal structures on existing water conveyance facilities, located on the Oakdale Irrigation District (OID) Burnett, Kearny, Hirschfeld, and Tulloch Laterals, in northeastern Stanislaus County and eastern San Joaquin County, CA (Project). The District offers the following comments:

General Comments

- The IS/MND submitted to the District does not provide sufficient information to 1) allow the District to assess the Project's potential impact on air quality. Therefore, the District recommends that a more detailed preliminary review of the Project be Preliminary review documents should include a Project summary detailing, at a minimum, the Project size, estimates of potential construction and operational emissions (for example, mobile and stationary emission sources), and proximity to sensitive receptors and existing emission sources.
 - 2007, OID completed a Water Resources Plan Programmatic Environmental Impact Report (WRP PEIR) to analyze impacts of the implementation of the proposed Water Resources Plan. The WRP PEIR's air quality assessment relies upon future environmental assessments of subsequent projects within the WRP to assess and address air quality impacts and implement applicable mitigation measures. The 2007 WRP PEIR makes reference to potential mitigation measure implementation in the event that subsequent environmental documentation identifies an impact resulting in the significant emission of NOx and CO above the established thresholds.

However, the IS/MND does not adequately determine what the Project's potential impacts are. Therefore, it is uncertain if the mitigation measures identified in the WRP PEIR would be implemented if found significant.

1b) Additionally, the District's Regulation VIII is referenced as a mitigation It should be noted that although #2 measure for construction emissions. compliance with District Regulation VIII reduces Project specific fugitive dust emissions, it may not be sufficient to reduce Project specific fugitive emissions to a less than significant level.

Furthermore, District Regulation VIII does not reduce construction exhaust emissions. As such if construction exhaust emissions are found to have a significant impact, the District recommends implementation of mitigation measures. Feasible mitigation of construction exhaust emission includes use of construction equipment powered by engines meeting, at a minimum, Tier III emission standards, as set forth in §2423 of Title 13 of the California Code of Regulations, and Part 89 of Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations. District recommends incorporating, as a condition of Project approval, a requirement that off-road construction equipment used on site achieve fleet average emissions equal to or less than the Tier III emissions standard of 4.8 NOx g/hp-hr. This can be achieved through any combination of uncontrolled engines and engines complying with Tier III and above engine standards.

Mitigation measures reducing construction exhaust emissions must be fully enforceable through permit conditions, agreements, or other legally binding instruments (CEQA Guidelines §15126.4, subd.(a)(2)).

1c) As a reference, the District's Guidance for Assessing and Mitigating Air Quality Impacts (GAMAQI) provides uniform procedures for assessing potential air quality impacts of proposed projects and for preparing the air quality section of environmental documents. The District's GAMAQI is available and should be used as guidance for the review of proposed projects under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) within the boundaries of the District. It is website the District's at available on http://www.valleyair.org/transportation/GAMAQI 3-19-15.pdf.

Emissions Analysis

If the preliminary review concludes that emissions resulting from construction and/or operation of the Project would exceed the following thresholds of significance: 10 tons per year of oxides of nitrogen (NOx), 10 tons per year of reactive organic gases (ROG), or 15 tons per year particulate matter of 10 microns or less in size (PM10), the District recommends that additional environmental review of the Project's potential impact on air quality be conducted. This environmental review should consider the following:

1a) Project Emissions should be identified and quantified.

- i) Permitted (stationary sources) and non-permitted (mobile sources) sources should be analyzed separately. Preparation of an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) is recommended should emissions from either source exceed the following amounts: 10 tons per year of oxides of nitrogen (NOx), 10 tons per year of reactive organic gases (ROG), or 15 tons per year particulate matter of 10 microns or less in size (PM10).
- ii) Pre- and post-Project emissions should be identified.
- 1b) Nuisance Odors should be discussed as to whether the Project would create objectionable odors affecting a substantial number of people.



Toxic Air Contaminants (TACs) –are defined as air pollutants that which may cause or contribute to an increase in mortality or serious illness, or which may pose a hazard to human health. The most common source of TACs can be attributed to diesel exhaust fumes that are emitted from both stationary and mobile sources.

If the Project is located near residential/ sensitive receptors, the Project should be evaluated to determine the health impact of TACs to the near-by receptors. If the analysis indicates that TACs are a concern, the District recommends that a Health Risk Assessment (HRA) be performed. If an HRA is to be performed, it is recommended that the Project proponent contact the District to review the proposed modeling approach. - 2) If preliminary review indicates that a Mitigated Negative Declaration should be prepared, in addition to the effects identified above, the document should include:
 - 2a) Mitigation Measures If preliminary review indicates that with mitigation, the Project would have a less than significant adverse impact on air quality, the effectiveness of each mitigation measure incorporated into the Project should be discussed.

- 2b) District's attainment status The document should include a discussion of whether the Project would result in a cumulatively considerable net increase of any criteria pollutant or precursor for which the San Joaquin Valley Air Basin is in non-attainment. - 3) If preliminary review indicates that an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) should be prepared, in addition to the effects identified above, the document should also include the following:

3a) A discussion of the methodology, model assumptions, inputs and results used in characterizing the Project's impact on air quality.

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3b) A discussion of the components and phases of the Project and the associated emission projections, (including ongoing emissions from each previous phase).

District Rules and Regulations

1) Based on information provided to the District, the Project may equal or exceed 9,000 square feet of development space. Therefore, the District concludes that the Project may be subject to District Rule 9510 (Indirect Source Review).

District Rule 9510 is intended to mitigate a project's impact on air quality through project design elements or by payment of applicable off-site mitigation fees. Any applicant subject to District Rule 9510 is required to submit an Air Impact Assessment (AIA) application to the District no later than applying for final discretionary approval, and to pay any applicable off-site mitigation fees before issuance of the first building permit.

If approval of the Project constitutes the last discretionary approval by your agency, the District recommends that demonstration of compliance with District Rule 9510, including payment of all applicable fees before issuance of the first building permit, be made a condition of Project approval. - 2) The Project may require District permits. Prior to the start of construction the Project proponent should contact the District's Small Business Assistance Office at (559) 230-5888 to determine if an Authority to Construct (ATC) is required.

In the event an existing building will be renovated, partially demolished or removed, the Project may be subject to District Rule 4002 (National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants).

The San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District (District) is in receipt of your correspondence dated September 26, 2017, requesting determination of the applicability of District Rule 9510 to the above referenced project. The project consists of the removal of approximately 12 concrete wall structures on three OID canals, to be replaced with similar concrete wall structures which will include automated, solar-powered canal gates to replace old manual gates, located northwest and southeast of the City of Oakdale in northeastern Stanislaus County and eastern San Joaquin County, CA.

The District has reviewed the information provided and determined that there is no construction of a new building, facility, or structure, or reconstruction of a building, facility, or structure for the purpose of increasing capacity or activity. Therefore, the project does not meet the definition of a "Development Project", as defined in District Rule 9510 (Indirect Source Review), section 3.13.

Follow-up to Commont

Therefore, District Rule 9510 requirements and related fees do not apply to the project referenced above. Please be aware that changes to the project, i.e., change in land use type or increase in use intensity may exceed an applicability threshold, resulting in the project being subject to District Rule 9510.

Also, enclosed is a document with answers to frequently asked questions regarding Indirect Source Review (ISR). This may be used as a reference to better understand ISR and how the District processes applications. Should the project become subject to Rule 9510, an Air Impact Assessment (AIA) application must be submitted to the District, consistent with Section 5.0 of District Rule 9510. Frequently Asked Questions Regarding Indirect Source Review

What is the purpose of Indirect Source Review (ISR)? Q:

As land development and population in the San Joaquin Valley continues to increase, so will indirect air emissions that A: negatively effect air quality. The emissions are called indirect because they don't come directly from a smokestack, like traditional industry emissions, but rather the emissions are indirectly caused by this growth in population. As a consequence, the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District (District) adopted Indirect Source Review (Rule 9510) to reduce the impacts of growth in emissions from all new land development in the San Joaquin Valley.

When is a project subject to ISR? Q:

- A project is subject to ISR if all of the following are applicable: A:
 - The project received its final discretionary approval from the land use agency on or after March 1, 2006.
 - The project meets or exceeds the following District applicability thresholds:

2,000 square feet commercial 20,000 square feet medical office 10,000 square feet governmental

25,000 square feet light industrial 39,000 square feet general office 20,000 square feet recreation space 9,000 square feet of space not included in the list

100,000 square feet heavy industrial 9,000 square feet educational 50 residential units

- The project's primary functions are not subject to District Rule 2201 (New and Modified Stationary Source Review Rule), or District Rule 2010 (Permits Required). For more information on the applicability of ISR regarding a specific project, please contact the District at (559) 230-6000 or visit the District's website at http://www.valleyair.org/ISR/ISRHome.htm.
- For the purposes of Rule 9510, what is final discretionary approval? Q:
- A decision by a public agency that requires the exercise of judgment or deliberation when the public agency or body A: decides to approve or disapprove a particular development project, as distinguished from situations where the public agency merely has to determine whether there has been conformity with applicable statutes, ordinances, or regulations. For example, a building permit would be an example of a ministerial approval.
- What pollutants does ISR target? Q:
- The ISR rule looks to reduce the growth in NO_x and PM₁₀ emissions associated with the construction and operation of new A: development projects in the San Joaquin Valley. The rule requirement is to reduce construction NO_x and PM₁₀ emissions by 20% and 45%, respectively, as well as reducing operational NO_x and PM₁₀ emissions by 33.3% and 50%, respectively, when compared to unmitigated projects.
- Q: What are NO_x and PM₁₀?
- Nitrogen oxide (NO_x) is an ozone precursor, or principal component of ozone. Ozone is a colorless, odorless reactive gas A: comprised of three oxygen atoms. It is found naturally in the earth's stratosphere, where it absorbs the ultraviolet component of incoming solar radiation that can be harmful to life. Ozone is also found near the earth's surface, where pollutants emitted from society's activities react in the presence of sunlight to form ozone. Hot sunny weather with stagnant wind conditions favors ozone formation, so the period from May through September is when high ozone levels tend to occur in the San Joaquin Valley Air Basin.

Particulate matter (PM) is a generic term used to describe a complex group of air pollutants that vary in composition. PM₁₀ particles have a diameter of 10 microns (micrometers) or less. The sources of PM can vary from wind blown dust particles to fine particles directly emitted from combustion processes, or may be formed from chemical reactions occurring in the atmosphere.

What is CalEEMod? Q:

CalEEMod (California Emission Estimator Model) is a computer modeling program that estimates construction, area A: source and operational emissions of NO_x and PM₁₀ from potential land uses. This program uses the most recent approved version of relevant Air Resources Board (ARB) emissions models and emission factors.

Q: How can a project's emissions be reduced to lessen the impact on air quality (On-site emissions reductions)?

- A: A project's emissions can be reduced by incorporating District approved mitigation measures. These include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - Bicycle lanes throughout the project
 - Proximity to existing or planned local retail
 - Cleaner fleet construction vehicles
- Proximity to existing or planned bus stops
- Eliminate woodstoves and fireplaces from the project
- Energy efficiency beyond Title 24 requirements

Q: What will I receive from the District once the Air Impact Assessment (AIA) has been approved?

- A: When the AIA is approved the applicant will receive an approval letter, along with the following:
 - Off-site emissions estimator worksheet (see below)
 - Fee estimator worksheet (see below)
 - Monitoring and Reporting Schedule (MRS), if applicable
 - Project invoice, if applicable

Q: What is the Off-site Emissions Estimator Worksheet?

A: This Excel worksheet uses the project's total tons of NO_x and PM₁₀ as calculated using CalEEMod and compares the unmittigated emissions against the mitigated emissions, determining whether the reduction in emissions is sufficient to satisfy the rule. If the reduction is not sufficient, the required off-site emission reductions are calculated using the District's off-site emission reduction equations, which can be found on the District's website at http://www.valleyair.org/rules/currntrules/r9510.pdf (Sections 7.0 through 7.1.2.2)

O: What is the Fee Estimator Worksheet?

A: The Fee Estimator is an Excel worksheet used to calculate the total dollar amount of off-site fees that must be paid to the District in order to cover the District's cost of obtaining the required off-site emission reductions, and therefore fulfill the rule requirement. This fee amount is derived by multiplying the total tons of off-site reductions by the applicable rate.

Q: Why are mitigation fees collected, and how are they used by the District?

A: When a development project cannot reduce its NO_x and PM₁₀ emissions to the level required by the rule, then the difference must be mitigated through the payment of a fee. The monies collected from this fee will be used by the District to reduce emissions in the San Joaquin Valley on behalf of the project, with the goal of offsetting the emissions increase from the project by decreasing emissions elsewhere. More specifically, the fees received by the District are used in the District's existing Emission Reduction Incentive Program (ERIP) to fund emission reduction projects.

DISCUSSION

- 1. No injuries, accidents, or near misses to report.
- 2. Tunnel excavation began on Wednesday, September 20. DTDS advanced an initial ~7 feet of tunnel with an excavator from the upstream portal to primarily facilitate ventilation equipment installation; full-production tunneling operations with roadheader anticipated to begin October 2. DTDS also continued installing facilities at the site in preparation for tunneling operations.
- 3. Schedule Update:
 - DTDS presented a revised baseline schedule that shows items leading up to tunneling operations 5 to 6 weeks behind original schedule. However, the revised schedule indicates that DTDS plans to add a second tunneling crew and will be performing excavation from upstream and downstream concurrently. DTDS shows they will gain approximately 4 months from concurrent excavation, therefore overall scheduling indicates they are 3 months (float) ahead of schedule; project completion date remains January 2019 to accommodate wintertime canal tie-in.

4. Submittals and RFI's:

- There are currently no outstanding submittals.
 - Submittal 24, related to downstream site layout and portal excavation, was approved on September 22, 2017 with the condition that a revised SWPPP plan be submitted for approval.
- There is currently one outstanding RFI:
 - RFI 11, related to a modification to the tunnel shape (section), is currently under review.

5. Contract Updates:

- DTDS submitted a revised draft of Invoice No. 5 (August) on September 6 to Condor for review. Pending final review of submitted supplier's prevailing wage certified payroll.
- DTDS will submit a quote for a Change Order for destruction of the C-1 (downstream) monitoring well. Condor has submitted a permit application for well destruction to Stanislaus County. DTDS will schedule destruction of the well prior to downstream tunneling activities.
