NOTICE OF EXEMPTION

Title:

North Main Canal Tunnels 3 and 4 Rehabilitation

Project Location:

The Oakdale Irrigation District North Main Canal, approximately 1.75 miles downstream (generally southwest) of Rodden Lake northeast of the

City of Oakdale, in eastern Stanislaus County

Project Description:

Tunnels 3 and 4 of the Oakdale Irrigation District (OID or District) North Main Canal downstream of Rodden Lake have surpassed 100 years in age and have developed extensive cracks in their unsupported crowns over time. In order to reduce the likelihood of collapse, rehabilitation of the Tunnels is needed to retain their integrity. Tunnel 3 is approximately 1,500 LF long and Tunnel 4 is approximately 400 LF. The project site commences approximately 1.75 miles downstream (southwest) of Rodden Lake in eastern Stanislaus County.

The proposed Project will consist of improvements to the District's existing North Main Canal Tunnels 3 and 4 including scaling loose rock and over-excavating existing tunnel sidewalls, crown and invert; installing new rock dowels at portals and, if needed, in tunnels; placing new shotcrete lining in tunnel and placing new concrete invert. The construction will take place between November 1, 2023 and March 1, 2024 when the canal is dewatered, and construction will occur within the existing OID 100-foot right-of-way for the facility. Neither the capacity nor service area of the North Main Canal will be increased as a result of the Project. A material

borrow site and a fill site have been identified on the Project property. Borrowed material would be used to construct temporary coffer dams and access ramps into the North Main Canal at the tunnel portals. The potential staging area, if needed by the contractor, is located on privately owned property adjacent to an existing gravel access road

Project Purpose:

The purpose of the Project is to restore this section of the North Main Canal to good condition for continued long term operations.


Exempt Status:

NOTICE

Each project applicant shall remit to the county clerk the environmental filing fee before or at the time of filing a Notice of Determination (Pub. Resources Code, § 21152; Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subdivision (d); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5). Without the appropriate fee, statutory or categorical exemption, or a valid No Effect Determination issued by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), the Notice of Determination is not operative, vested, or final, and shall not be accepted by the county clerk.

COUNTY DOCUMENTARY HANDLING FEE

The county clerk may charge a documentary handling fee of fifty dollars (\$50) per filing in addition to the environmental filing fee (Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subd. (e); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5, subd. (g)(1)). A county board of supervisors shall have the authority to increase or decrease the fee or charge, that is otherwise authorized to be levied by another provision of law, in the amount reasonably necessary to recover the cost of providing any product or service or the cost of enforcing any regulation for which the fee or charge is levied (Gov. Code, § 54985, subd. (a)).

Within 30 days after the end of each month in which the environmental filing fees are collected, each county shall summarize and record the amount collected on the monthly State of California Form No. CA25 (TC31) and remit the amount collected to the State Treasurer. Identify the remittance on Form No. CA25 as "Environmental Document Filing Fees" per Fish and Game Code section 711.4.

The county clerk shall mail the following documents to CDFW on a monthly basis:

- ✓ A photocopy of the monthly State of California Form No. CA25 (TC31)
- ✓ CDFW/ASB copies of all cash receipts (including all voided receipts)
- ✓ A copy of all CDFW No Effect Determinations filed in lieu of fee payment
- ✓ A copy of all NODs filed with the county during the preceding month
- ✓ A list of the name, address and telephone number of all project applicants for which an NOD has been filed. If this information is contained on the cash receipt filed with CDFW under California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 753.5, subdivision (e)(6), no additional information is required.

DOCUMENT RETENTION

The county shall retain two copies of the cash receipt (for lead agency and county clerk) and a copy of all documents described above for at least 12 months.

RECEIPT NUMBER

- # The first two digits automatically populate by making the appropriate selection in the County/State Agency of Filing drop down menu.
- # The next eight digits automatically populate when a date is entered.
- # The last three digits correspond with the sequential order of issuance for each calendar year. For example, the first receipt number issued on January 1 should end in 001. If a county issued 252 receipts for the year ending on December 31, the last receipt number should end in 252. CDFW recommends that counties and state agencies 1) save a local copy of this form, and 2) track receipt numbers on a spreadsheet tabbed by month to ensure accuracy.
